

Final Exam is

From Geoffrey:

As our young students sit back and relax after their exams, it occurs to me that the school year has always been structured into three phases: lessons and work, revision and exams, and then that blissful period when the exams are over, before the work starts again. (We did have termly exams, but they never had the dread of the summer ones.) And the post-exam state was magic – relaxing, relishing the freedom from intense revision and really enjoying doing some of the things that couldn't be fitted into the previous couple of months without feeling a bit guilty!

The three phases were, I remember, associated with three emotional states which I will never forget. Normal. Panic. Joy. Panic levels at exam time were always high for me, because I was never keen on work. I would always find something more interesting to do, and put work off until some deadline came along.

So, while others were calmly going through their revision notes for the third time, I was frantically flipping through the pages of the exercise books and making random notes on scraps of paper.

And then the evening before an exam was like a deep-sea dive – everything had to be gone through in lots of detail and retained for twelve hours, before making room for the next lot of information. It was in vain that teachers talked about pacing yourself and taking breaks and having a quiet evening off before taking an exam.

Some of you will be saying "I was like that." But probably most will be thinking "I was far more organised". Well, we're all different! But what we were all developing was our approach to the normal ups and downs of all the things that come along in life. Do we put off doing something, or do we just get on with it? How do we behave when life gets tricky, when the pressure is on?

Well, when I was at school, I discovered a new source of joy – not unlike the end of exam feeling, but one that I might experience at any time. I became a Christian, bought a bible and underlined my favourite bits. The two verses I underlined most heavily were from Chapter 4 of Philippians.

"Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

I found that Christian friends, times of prayer and singing songs from "Youth Praise" gave me a new dimension in life. Instead of having to handle everything myself, I could ask for God's help. And when things went well, I could thank him. And when I felt I had really messed up I could share it with him and receive forgiveness and, best of all, a fresh start.

God didn't change my way of often leaving things until a deadline comes along – at least he hasn't yet – but I cannot now imagine life without a sense of being cared for and loved by our Saviour, who accompanies me through all downs and ups.

Thanks be to God!



A new vision for Dartmoor's woodlands Dartmoor, beautiful as it is, would naturally be much more wooded. Only fragments



of the forest that once covered the moor still remain. Moor Trees' vision is to restore some of the lost forests of Dartmoor by creating new woodlands and supporting their creation by individuals and communities: woodlands that coexist with farming, archaeology and recreation, that connect people to their woodland heritage, offer environmental benefits and new livelihood opportunities.

Moor Trees has been planting native trees in and around Dartmoor since 2001. In 2015, we celebrated the creation of 66 hectares (nearly 40 football pitches) of native woodland using over 60,000 trees, mostly nurtured and grown in our own nurseries from locally collected seed. All this has been achieved by a dedicated team of volunteers, supported by students from Plymouth University, local conservation groups, company team building days and many local families – a true community-led venture.

We have planted on the fringe of the open moor at Scorriton and have increased the woodland cover of the Avon valley. We have supported over 40 landowners who have made the lifelong commitment to create a native forest that will only mature beyond their lifetime, a truly visionary choice.

We understand the long history of Dartmoor and the part it has played in human endeavour. We understand that residents and visitors alike cherish the open landscapes with far reaching views but there is also growing enthusiasm for more native woodland on Dartmoor among both urban and rural communities. We believe that there is plenty of space for both.

Dartmoor has lost most of its original woodland cover. Yet woodlands are our heritage.

To restore woodlands to Dartmoor is to restore ourselves. More natural landscapes offer a way of understanding and reinterpreting our relationship with the natural world. The restoration and regeneration of just some of the Dartmoor woodlands would help the return of natural environments to one of the few remaining areas in southern England where this could be possible, restoring forest in a way that takes account of the needs and aspirations of local and regional communities.

Our vision is that in 250 years' time, there will be a Wild Heart of Dartmoor: a core zone of native woodland of approximately 10,000 hectares, maintained through low density grazing by cattle and ponies. Full public access would allow people to enjoy this Wild Heart.

We want to start by helping to establish a network of community woodlands and nurturing the native woodland regeneration that is taking place in some areas on Dartmoor.

New funding available for Dartmoor Communities

Dartmoor National Park Authority has opened its Communities Fund 2016/17 for applications and is calling for community organisations on Dartmoor to come forward if they have a project that needs funding. The Dartmoor Communities Fund offers up to 50% grant funding for capital projects that support existing valued community facilities and services, or create new community infrastructure to meet identified community needs.

The Fund is supported by the New Homes Bonus from West Devon Borough, Teignbridge and South Hams District Councils and this year there is just over £90,000 in the pot. So if you have plans for your village hall, are thinking of setting up a new community shop or want to make the most of a valued local heritage asset the Dartmoor Communities Fund may be able to help!

Last year successful projects included the renovation of a stunning medieval rood screen in St Peters Church, Buckland in the Moor, new hot water showers for Chagford's idyllic outdoor swimming pool and the development of the new community bike initiative at South Brent.

The Fund is open to applications during June and July, but you are encouraged to submit your project ideas early. Successful projects will be announced in September 2016.

New for this year and sitting alongside the main grants scheme, is the 'Just Do It' community action small grants pot, where applications for less than £500 will be determined within a month. This 'quick win' grant scheme is aimed at environmental works and is ideal for when communities just need a small amount of cash to do works themselves to maintain or enhance their community.

The New Homes Bonus is a Government scheme encouraging local authorities to grant planning permission for the building of new houses in return for additional revenue. The support for Dartmoor Communities Fund is in recognition of Dartmoor National Park's role as a planning authority.

stopping at Tamar View Nursery for shopping and lunch, then on to Marsh Villa Gardens, Par. This magical 3-acre water and woodland garden lies in a former tidal creek. Herbaceous borders are packed with colour and there is an extensive collection of shrubs and mature trees.

The 14-acre marsh itself is largely impassable except for a path through a small section to enjoy a walk where once the tide brought Daphne du Maurier's characters up the creek to the House on the Strand.

Important: note the change of date to 27 July.

Dartmoor is a beautiful place and we are very fortunate to live here.

At St Raphael's, nature had taken advantage of our absence and despite Mike Mudge having cut the grass, the hedges, weeds and nettles had grown like Topsy. As we were looking forward to the visit from the Archdeacon, Tony was duly despatched with strimmer, shears and pruners to restore order. I followed up with a broom and wheelbarrow which if nothing else, is good exercise.

Sustaining Rural Churches

The use of our churches and declining attendance continues to occupy the thoughts and prayers of those closely involved with the Church of England.

Many organisations, like the Church of England, such as Rotary and Lions Clubs who contribute so much to the community, are also in decline as far as active membership is concerned. But in the Church's case it is not just a lack of interest in attending services, it is a lack of interest or knowledge about the Christian message and what God can bring to our lives. That is a real challenge for the Church to take on.

On the use of buildings, The Dartmoor Forest Parish Council held their meeting at St Raphael's last month. Once again their support is much appreciated, especially given the uncomfortable seating for such meetings!

Planning permission has been granted for the installation of the compost toilet and a grant of £1,000 has been received from the All Churches Trust. This Trust is part of our insurers, Ecclesiastical, who also provide useful advice on maintaining church buildings.

Perrett builders will be doing the work and we are grateful to them for some flexible thinking in terms of getting some of the equipment needed into the church grounds. We still have about £6,000 to raise but there are two outstanding grant applications which if successful, will bring us very close to the target. Hopefully next month I will be able to report more good news on this subject.







New Parish Clerk.

Steve Cox has taken over as Parish Clerk from the beginning of June following Nigel Tigwell's retirement on health grounds. The Parish Council thank Mr. Tigwell for his service and hope that the Council would be able to continue to draw on his knowledge in the future.

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting held on the 12th May again testified to the active and vibrant community life of the Parish. Reports were received from many of the voluntary groups including the very popular Pavilion Youth Club, the thriving High Moorland Women's Institute and on the invaluable work of the Dartmoor Hill Farm Project. The Duchy of Cornwall reported that the majority of units have been re-let in the Duchy Square unit and an official relaunch is planned for June. They are also progressing re-letting and redeveloping the former Moor Beads and Lords Restaurant units which will also accommodate the Princetown Charity Shop.

Moorland Speedwatch

The Parish Council is continuing to progress a number of initiatives to ensure that drivers adhere to the 40mph limit and that people and livestock are not endangered by careless driving. This is especially important considering the increases in large animal deaths caused by drivers. From 2013 to 2015 over 230 animals were sadly killed on moorland roads. Training of volunteers for Community Speedwatch was held on the 4th June and the Council is working with a number other parishes and the Dartmoor Livestock Protection Society to try and get Vehicle Activated Signs installed across the moor. **Remember – Kill Your Speed: Not a Lamb, Calf or Foal.**

<u>Volunteers Sought</u>. There are opportunities to help your local community by volunteering with Dartmoor Forest Parish Council. 




