

CROSSING THE CENTURIES: Dartmoor's crosses from an archaeologist's perspective - Fri.





Princetown Distillery Rowan Maule, Director of Princetown Distillers provided an overview of plans to establish a distillery in the village which have been 2 ½ years in development. The motivation behind the plans is to tap into the interest in whisky production in the UK, including English whisky. Several locations have been researched and Princetown has many advantages including climate which is similar to the Scottish Highlands. The distillery is expected to provide employment and tourism opportunities. Whisky distilling is not regarded as a noisy or intrusive operation. Whisky will be branded Dartmoor – High Moorland Single Malt Whisky.

<u>Devon & Somerset Fire & Rescue Service.</u> The Parish Council agreed to support the trial one of the service's Rapid Intervention Units. The trail is for 6 months with the intention, if successful, to replace the main fire appliance.

<u>Dartmoor Classic Sportive Cycling Event</u> The event held on 22 June 2016 has generated considerable feedback which has been sent to DNPA to share at the next meeting of the safety advisory group that are holding with the organisers. The Parish Council agreed to complete a parish wide consultation on the impact of this event to help determine what, if any, changes they should request of the organisers and wider authorities.

Moorland Community Speedwatch. Five sessions were held, successfully identifying a number of car drivers exceeding the speed limit. The top speed recorded was 65mph which was close to a speed that the courts would have banned the driver in question. The scheme would welcome extra volunteers to support the scheme and help increase the number of sessions and locations covered. This is especially important due to the increasing number of animal deaths and visitors to the Moor. This is not an onerous commitment and is a great contribution to protecting the communities we live in. Please contact the Clerk for more details.

Princetown Pavilion Youth Club and Play Area. The Parish Council agreed to make a grant of £1,000 to support the youth club as it was recognised that their work with young people is vital in providing a facility which offers genuine stimulation and interest and helps prevent boredom and socially unacceptable behaviour. In addition, the Parish Council is progressing Phase 3 of the play area redevelopment to install equipment that especially appeals to the older children in the village. A funding application has been submitted to the Dartmoor Communities Fund with more to follow.
