

The Parish Letter

From Geoffrey:

Sitting up here in Widecombe, it's clear that thousands of visitors are still coming to Dartmoor – not so much these days by the busload, more by the car-full and the bicycle group (or Electric Bike for the less fit!), or just walking in. Thousands of people are coming here for something special, and they probably don't even think through what it is they are looking for.

Young families are coming to spend a day sitting by the Dart – enjoying the beauty and the water splashing over the rocks. Older people perhaps come out to sit in a café garden and have a cream tea in relaxing surroundings. Some visitors are following an interest in history or archaeology. But what they all have in common is that they are, in a real sense, making a Pilgrimage.

Pilgrimages became extremely popular in the Middle Ages, where walking for days or weeks to a special (holy) site was seen as a way of making penance and absolution for sins committed, and as a way of re-connecting with God in a holy place. Famously these days thousands of people are continuing in that tradition by walking to one of the great pilgrimage destinations, St James' Church at Santiago de Compostella in North-Eastern Spain – it's so popular that this Pilgrimage has it's own name – "The Camino" – and tour companies will help you walk the distance by handling your luggage and meals – you'll need at least 35 days.

What are these pilgrims seeking? Some sort of personal experience that enables them to re-engage with their spiritual side, helping them become more rounded people. And I believe that this is a big part of what is bringing people to the peace and quiet of our Moor – what may look like just a holiday is also a spiritual experience that is so refreshing that people come back year after year for more of it.

It was this aspect of Dartmoor that seemed to me to predominate in the Dartmoor Day Conference I attended last month, led by our Bishop, Bishop Nick of Plymouth. He quoted this phrase from someone who couldn't be with us "Dartmoor is a huge spiritual place – a place of pilgrimage and renewal." And this was echoed by Mrs Sam Hill, the Head of Communications, Economy and Fundraising for the DNP, that their new Visitor Code "Love Moor Life" was aimed at making visitors happy. Not just giving them a good experience, but changing their mood for the better. Which is really connecting with the pilgrimage imperative – about getting more out of life, and becoming a happier person.

For one thing is certain, Dartmoor will always be a place of Pilgrimage – and a key role for our churches is to connect with that. I look forward to getting stuck into this agenda as our new Team settles into place.

Communities Together Fund

For 2018/19, the previous Town and Parish (TAP) Fund, has been relaunched across the County as the Communities Together Fund.

The aim of the Communities Together Fund is to encourage communities to work together; identifying new ideas for their mutual benefit. Applications are welcome from community projects benefiting, enhancing and making a difference to communities.

There are some minor changes between the TAP and Communities Together Fund, including the purpose of the fund, those that are eligible to apply and also the projects that can be supported.

The most notable changes are:


The fund is now open to applications from voluntary and community organisations (as well as Parish and Town Councils)

The fund will no longer support grass cutting/ditching and drainage/lengthsman project Match funding will increase the likelihood of an application being supported

You will need to demonstrate that you have explored opportunities to work with other voluntary and community groups to either identify and/or carry out the proposed project. The project should benefit more than one Town or Parish.

The deadline for applications is noon on Friday 14th December 2018. Decisions on grants will be made at a meeting of local SHDC and DCC Members held in January 2019 (the date and details of the meeting will be posted on the website and circulated to Parish/Town Clerks closer to the date – it should be noted that all applicant groups will be eligible to attend the meeting).



Meeting with DCC Highways, Devon & Cornwall Police & Office of Police Commissioner - Anti-social driving.

A meeting was held on 6th June with representatives from the above organisations to try and identify potential solutions to the continued issue of anti-social driving in the parish, especially during icy and snowy conditions. In particular, the villages of Princetown and Postbridge are visited at night, by car drivers who use the conditions to race their cars, perform stunts and drive significantly in excess of safe, legal speeds. This anti-social behaviour endangers the people, property and peaceful existence of the parish.

The Police advised that they will aim to attend, however they need to balance deploying resources on the most urgent cases and calls. However, a number of other solutions are being investigated, including:

- Consider how a 'one-off' hit of a large police presence, fining and potentially arresting offenders, could be organised (similar in concept to Operation Granite), to demonstrate that the parish is not available for this anti-social behaviour.
- Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) investigate the effectiveness of a PSPO (a PSPO can prohibit certain things or require specific things to be done in a particular area that is having a detrimental effect on the quality of life for those in the local community).
- Reporting encourage local community to report incidents. Clerk to organise a communications plan, nearer winter, to remind residents of the importance of reporting and how they can report incidents.
- CCTV requires further evaluation of its effectiveness and costs.
- Exmoor & other National Parks Clerk to contact DNPA to see if any learnings can be made from the experience of other National Parks.

Parish Defibrillators – free training for local residents Wednesday 4th September. The council own and administer two defibrillators in the parish; one outside the Visitor's Centre in Postbridge and the other in the old phone box by the Forest inn, Hexworthy. The council have organised a short training session for local residents to be trained in how to use the defibrillators. It is estimated that there are around 60,000 out of hospital cardiac arrests each year in the UK and of these around 30,000 are discovered in time for someone to help save the victim's life. If a defibrillator is used within 3-5 minutes of cardiac arrest, survival rates jump from 6% to 74%. The devices are easy to use and no medical training is required. Please contact the Clerk for more details.




