



The Parish Letter

Here's a story I heard many years ago.....

A man moved into a village and asked the person sitting on the Green, "Is this a friendly village? What are the people like here?"

"What were they like in the village you've come from?" was the question asked in reply. "They were miserable and unfriendly, I couldn't get on with them."

"You'll find them the same here."

Another man moved into the same village and asked the person sitting on the Green, "Is this a friendly village? What are the people like here?"

"What were they like in the village you've come from?" was the question asked in reply. "They were friendly and happy, a great bunch. We got on really well"

"You'll find them the same here."

I love the symmetry and the unexpectedness of this story. And here's another similar story from Matthew's gospel, with Jesus dramatically describing two extremes to help us decide which direction we should take.....

When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" And the king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

Then he will say to those at his left hand, "You that are accursed, depart from

me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me." Then they also will answer, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?" Then he will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me." And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.

Both stories make their point by exaggeration, helping us reflect on how we relate to the people around us, and the sort of community we build around us. For each of us contribute more than we think to the character of the communities we live in. I am very much looking forward later this month to a "Dartmoor Day Conference" organised by the Bishop of Plymouth where we will be reflecting on what makes Dartmoor communities tick, and how the church can best contribute to community life. Personally I believe the church is at its best when it gets alongside organisations and people and asks "What can we do to help?" What do you think?

Life is Precious

Christians believe that there is something special about human beings. Being human is not the same as being anything else in the cosmos - different in nature from being a rock, a tree, a spider or a chimpanzee. Humans are 'in the image of God'. That means we share something of the nature of God - we know the difference between good and evil, we have the ability to be creative, we have a capacity to love and seek justice, and we have a nature which is in some way eternal (some people call this a soul).

Everything Christians believe about the sanctity of life follows on from this. And the most wonderful of those facts is a belief that God knows every human individually - from the baby that lives only a few tragic minutes to the great-grandfather who celebrates his hundredth birthday. Christians also believe that God has a total and unconditional love for every human. (This is exhilarating but also challenging, because it means he must have loved Hitler as much as he loved Saint Francis of Assisi). It means that God loves you, wherever in the world you are reading this right now.

Several things follow logically from this:

Human life is very precious. In Christian ethics all humans should treat all humans with total respect. Admittedly we are not very good at this, but that is what God has asked of us.

Humans need to respect themselves. That means Christians try to do something worthwhile with their lives. For almost all Christians it means they try not to throw their one beautiful life away by viciously abusing drugs, alcohol, tobacco and so on.

Humans need to respect others. Out of this has come the laws that have made the UK civilised - about murder, the death penalty, abortion, euthanasia, contraception, embryo experimentation and so on. All these are controversial and Christians don't agree. However, they try to have their debates about it in the context of seeking God's best for humankind.

Human life has absolute dignity. Perhaps the most important belief of all is that God himself has inhabited a human body and so he has conferred utter dignity on human flesh. Christians believe that in Jesus God himself was walking and talking on this planet.






Thank you!







No need to cut the grass weekly

How often should you cut your grass? That depends on how much you want to help the bees. It seems that the ideal 'gap' is two weeks. This helps improve the habitat for the pollinating plants that need bees to survive. Cutting the grass more often than every 14 days destroys dandelions and clover and other plants which the insects need for pollen.

Two weeks is ideal – it gives time for the grass to attract a greater diversity of insects. The number of bee species and the abundance of lawn flowers were up to 2.5 times higher when home owners mowed lawns every two weeks compared to once a week.

Don't be a martyr, though – as three-weekly

cuts are also not recommended. The high grass then makes it more difficult for bees and other insects to access flowers.

Annual Parish Meeting a successful meeting was held on 10th May when Jim McNeil, polar explorer and founder of Princetown's newest business, Ice Warrior gave an update on his project. Jim's experience includes working on BBC's acclaimed Blue Planet as safety advisor and has led and supplied many polar expeditions. He is currently organising his next major expedition; the Last Pole Expedition – The Last World First & "Crucial" Science to the Inaccessible North Pole. This will investigate the affects of global warming on the Artic ice caps. In addition, the Council received written reports from the many civic and community organisations active in the parish. The Parish Council would like to thank all contributors and organisations who so enrich our community.

<u>Public Payphone – Woodville Avenue, Princetown</u> Council agreed to adopt the soon to be redundant phone box and investigate the use of it as some form of micro exhibition centre, potentially telling something of the men remembered on Princetown War memorial. This has been discussed with Parishscapes, part of the Moor than Meets the Eye project, which is focused on the heritage and history of the moorland communities, who have offered support to the project.

<u>Princetown Play Park – Phase 4</u> early, exploratory discussions have started on the largest and most ambitious part of the parish council's plans for the play area in Princetown, the proposal for a skate park. Although it should be stressed this is at a very early stage and funding and permissions will need to be sought. The council and the Duchy of Cornwall have identified a potential site and discussions started with contractors to understand how much money is required.

<u>Planning</u> – the council is <u>consulted</u> by the planning authority DNPA on all applications. 16 have been reviewed by the council since January. The process almost always includes a site visit by at least two councillors, who then report back to the full council, who also listen to any representations by members of the public, before making a decision to Support, Object or Make No Objection to an application. The council have also commented on the Dartmoor Local Plan being developed by DNPA.



North Hall Manor Archaeological Excavations. July 2018.

Having secured additional funding from Dartmoor National Park's "Moor than Meets the Eye" HLF project, archaeologists will again be continuing the excavation of the "lost" medieval manor of North Hall in Widecombe.





Angie pointed to the back of the church and said, 'See those two men standing by the door? They're hushers.'




