

The Parish Letter

Everybody Welcome

Well, we've moved. We are here, in the Rectory, if not quite straight. The removal firm has collected the empty and flattened boxes; we still need to put up some blinds and curtains; the garden needs my attention but the shed is on order from Tuckers. It has been hard to leave Shropshire but good to arrive in Devon. Thank you for your very warm and kind welcome of us.

In recent years, I have met a few Christians who, having moved home, stop going to church. Busy getting the new house in order and keeping up with the friends and family they have left behind, the new residents simply drop out of the habit. They don't ever make it to their new local church. One of them I discovered had served as the church Treasurer for over 15 years in the last parish. He and his wife had decided to have a rest in the new; they enjoyed it so much that they kept their heads down hoping no one would notice. No one did for several years. Then, one autumn the new Vicar encouraged the church family to greet neighbours they hadn't met properly. The former Treasurer and his wife were invited to the Harvest Supper which was preceded by Harvest Evensong. They went, were made to feel very welcome and became part of the Christian community again. They were glad to have been asked. They had realised something was missing from their lives but had felt awkward about making the step back into active worship and service. So they didn't, until they were invited.

Equally, I have come across others who, though not practising Christians, move house and want to start afresh. They think this might be just the right time to visit the local church, get to know people in the community and 'give God a go'. But its hard to cross the church threshold when you haven't done it for ages (or never at all), when you are worried about local customs and feeling like an alien. We often need encouragement to try something newand to know we will be welcome.

The start of the new academic year and Harvest-tide gives the local church family the perfect opportunity to welcome back and welcome afresh those new to our communities. Of course, some are natural at welcoming, others are challenged in this area. When Rector in Somerset, I'll not forget the time I had invited a local parish councillor, together with his young family to church. In the past he had been an active participant but, following an argument and rift, had left. On this occasion, his first Sunday back for several years, he was greeted by the Sidesperson at the door with the words: 'Hello stranger!' I could have chinned him (the sidesperson, that is). A church's welcome can be let down by one remark.

Anti-social driving Initiative

Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) – Clerk & Cllr Annabel Roberts met with John Ward, anti-social behaviour officer, at WDBC on 10th July 2018. Mr Ward has experience of setting up a PSPO at Kingsbridge and of using Community Protection Notices (CPN) to combat anti-social driving. Key findings:

- 1. Mr Ward is available to support council and community to try and tackle this activity. He recommends that this winter that CPN notices are issued to drivers reported of driving anti-socially. He is authorised to issue these notices and we would need to provide details of the incident. In addition, reporting to Police 101 service will build data that may strengthen case for a PSPO. This requires community to safely capture number plates and details of incident. The council resolved to proceed with working with Mr Ward on this.
- 2. PSPO can be managed by both Police and accredited Street Warden/Security Staff. No technical or legal reason that parish council could not employ accredited volunteer street wardens. They could potentially be available to safely capture number plates/evidence and as they are accredited this has more power under the law. This would require involvement of WDBC. Council resolved to see whether CPNs were effective before proceeding further.

<u>Local Affordable Housing</u> Clerk had discussed with Alex Rehaag, West Devon Borough Council, the potential of small, local housing developments in the parish, as have recently been built in Horrabridge, Yelverton and Christow. Ms Rehaag has offered to attend a future parish council meeting to discuss the potential of this on land at the end of Moorland View, Princetown. Council resolved to invite Ms Rehaag to attend a parish council meeting.

Parish Defibrillators – free training for local residents 7pm Wednesday 5th September at Postbridge Village Hall. The council own and administer two defibrillators in the parish; one outside the Visitor's Centre in Postbridge and the other in the old phone box by the Forest inn, Hexworthy. The council have organised a short training session for local residents to be trained in how to use the defibrillators. It is estimated that there are around 60,000 out of hospital cardiac arrests each year in the UK and of these around 30,000 are discovered in time for someone to help save the victim's life. If a defibrillator is used within 3-5 minutes of cardiac arrest, survival rates jump from 6% to 74%. The devices are easy to use and no medical training is required. Please email the Clerk clerk@dartmoorforestpc.net to confirm attendance.



A statement from the Widecombe History Group Committee

This statement has been prepared to clarify the position taken by the Widecombe History Group Committee, in respect of the proposal to build a new village hall.

The committee welcome the proposal to investigate the possibility of constructing a new facility for the village, and will support efforts to achieve the aims of those involved where the plans do not conflict with the aims and well being of the History Group.

Currently the committee do not see where or how material support can be offered, especially having in mind the age profile of the History Group members.

The History Group has a number of options it will investigate with regard to future functioning of the group, and these will include, where future meetings of the group will take place, where current and future activities will be undertaken, how artefacts and other important donations to the group will be accessed and stored.

The committee is aware of the timescale of any proposed new building and is unwilling to commit the History Groups existing or new members to financial undertakings which it may not be able to meet in the future.

It is our intention to continue to liaise with the Village Hall steering Group, the Church House committee, Dunstone Chapel, and other interested parties to try to achieve the best possible outcome for the village without irreparably harming the group we currently enjoy.



Widecombe Village Hall Steering Group (WVHSG) has now held its AGM, at which a vote was taken to determine support for the Feasibility Study recommendations in moving ahead with a new hall. We are delighted to announce that over 25% of the Parish cast a vote and over 90% of these were in favour, so our work continues!

Our first major fundraiser will be taking place on **Sunday 16**th **September in the Widecombe Fair Field** with a sponsored walk and horse-ride organised by LOVE

Devon and a free-entry family friendly afternoon of music, entertainment and village fete activities along with local food and bar on the field from **12noon – 5pm.** A Family Dog show, sponsored by Tuckers Country Store, will take place at 2pm. In order to clarify one particular point, as recommended in our Report, we will be asking the Parish Council to consider taking out a Public Works Board loan to support a proportion of the costs of the project and as such local precepts may be increased to cover this.
