The Parish Letter

Easter is the most joyful day of the year for Christians. Christ has died for our sins. We are forgiven. Christ has risen! We are redeemed! We can look forward to an eternity in His joy! Hallelujah!

The Good News of Jesus Christ is a message so simple that you can explain it to someone in a few minutes. It is so profound that for the rest of their lives they will still be 'growing' in their Christian walk with God.



But what difference can the resurrection make to my life?

My past is forgiven:

Have you ever been half-way through a project and wanted to start again? In life we all have regrets about things we have done, said or thought. The good news is that Jesus died to forgive these things: 'All sins forgiven, the slate wiped clean, that old arrest warrant cancelled and nailed to Christ's cross.' (Colossians 2:14, The Message). The resurrection is the guarantee that we can know Jesus' pardon and forgiveness. Do we need to let go a load of guilt and unforgiveness that we are carrying?

My present is under control:

How often do we say 'My life is out of control.' We can't control life, but God can! The 'incomparably great power at work for those who believe' is the same power that raised Christ from the dead (Ephesians 1:20). God promises us the power that we need to face any situation, as we trust Him: 'I can do all this through Him who gives me strength.' (Philippians 4:13).

My future is secure:

Death is the great certainty, 'one out of one dies!'. Yet Jesus overcame death by the resurrection, that we might experience the life of heaven, both now and for eternity. 'I am

the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die'. (John 11:25,26). We don't need to fear death; but

if we are to really live, we have to be ready to die! How does the resurrection affect our view of death?







19th April - Good Friday


Good Friday is the day on which Jesus died on the cross. He was crucified at 9am in the morning, and died six hours later, at 3pm.

It is the most solemn day in the Christian year, and is widely marked by the removal of all decorations from churches. In Lutheran churches, the day was marked by the reading of the passion narrative in a gospel, a practice which lies behind the 'passions' composed by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685 – 1750). Both the St Matthew Passion and the St John Passion have their origins in this observance of Good Friday.

The custom of observing a period of three hours' devotion from 12 midday to 3 pm on Good Friday goes back to the 18th century. The 'Three Hours of the Cross' often take the form of an extended meditation on the 'Seven Last Words from the Cross', with periods of silence, prayer, or hymn-singing.







Illegal Rave on Bellever 26/27 December Ally Kohler and Simon Lee from DNPA, Sergeant Dave Clarke & PCSO Kevin Williams from Devon & Cornwall Police and Tim Powles from the Forestry Commission were present to discuss this incident. Simon Lee reported that there were 200-300 people present at the race. The DNPA Rangers were present to support the Police. However, there were not enough resources to close down the event and therefore the Police could only contain the event and advise drivers that if they were not safe to drive, they should remain on the site. The Police have no powers to stop people parking and then walking to the site. Ally Kohler of DNPA reported that there was an initial meeting of the Dartmoor Rural Crime initiative to look into preventative measures to deter such activity. This could include recording vehicle registration numbers and issue follow up letters. In addition, impact statements would be completed to demonstrate impact on community. Tim Powles of Forestry Commission reported that new gates and barriers would be installed at Bellever. A number of comments were raised from members of the public on how this activity impacted the community. In addition, the parish council requested that they be invited to the next meeting of the Dartmoor Rural Crime initiative. Ally Kohler of DNPA confirmed that the parish council would be invited.

Princetown Skate Park the council agreed a provisional fundraising target and budget of £60,000 to £70,000. It was agreed that the Clerk and Cllr. Stones would meet with young people at the Youth Club to discuss plans and get their involvement. Tom Stratton, Duchy of Cornwall, had also written to the council to request further details of the project when it became available.

<u>Local Elections 2019</u> Please note both West Devon Borough Council and Parish Council elections are being held on May 2nd 2019. There are expected to be vacancies on the parish council, therefore if you would like to know more about the role of the parish councillor and the work of the parish council please contact the Clerk.

<u>Wall opposite HMP Dartmoor</u> the council have been advised that the prison authorities have applied for funding for the long-term repairs of the wall. They expect to be notified of the decision in April.

Dartmoor Conservation Garden the council supported the Moor than Meets the Eye project to improve the garden, behind the Visitor's Centre in Princetown. This uses the remaining Parishscapes funds of £1,781.
