The Parish Letter

Oh My Goodness! I don't believe it! It's gone so quickly!

Yup – it certainly has. It's 'that' time of year. A full twelve months has passed since last year's Advent season, and here we are again, about to do it all one more time.

Personally, I love this season. In our family, it starts with my daughter's birthday at the start of December and just keeps going relentlessly until a few days into January, when I return to work for a rest. And I love (almost) every minute of it.

As a musician, it's always been a busy season with extra concerts and events to prepare for. As a Christian, there is a wide variety of services to attend and organise. As a teacher, there are Christmas displays, parties and many, many carol singing events to attend and organise. As a parent, there are presents to find, meals to prepare and share, and a house to decorate – oh, and an increasingly over-excited child to entertain and 'contain'.

In amongst all of this, 'someone' usually cautions us not to lose sight of what it's really all about. They're right of course, and most of us do know that we need to make time to take time to sit and reflect on the message of the season. In the midst of our preparations for Christmas Day, we already know the Good News of what comes next, the Good News that this season prepares us for.

There is nothing wrong with being busy; there is nothing wrong with buying gifts for our loved ones; there is nothing wrong with preparing a feast for friends and family; there is nothing wrong with celebrating and decorating our homes to share joy and laughter. Jesus celebrated and feasted with friends – there is no reason why we shouldn't take delight in these things too.

My personal mantra at the moment seems to be 'it starts with worship' – 'it' being pretty much everything. Throughout December we are surrounded by Christmas songs and carols – in the shops, on the radio, on TV - so many songs we have known since childhood. We are surrounded by worship music perhaps more now than at any other time of year.

How often do we really reflect on the worship that is contained within those Christmas songs? Setting aside the likes of 'Rudolph the Red Nose Reindeer' and 'Jingle Bells', when was the last time you actually worshiped God with a Christmas carol? Some Christmas Carols were written to tell the story of that first Christmas and some are outright hymns of praise – but there is so much truth to be found in their lyrics.

So while you are being busy this season, put on a CD of Christmas carols or find a Spotify / YouTube / iTunes playlist and really listen to and reflect on the words as you wrap, stir and stick.

News from the East Shallowford Trust

October was a month that flipped from fantastic open skies luring us all into a sense of warm bliss, as we wandered gently through the deep darkening bracken, to biting mizzle that made us all want to scuttle in doors and hunker down around a warm fire, shrouded in a thick, heavily woven blanket.

One group of London Mothers arrived with their children in a cheerful bright red bus. One Mother had visited the farm as a child and recanted tale after tale, stating categorically, that her BEST childhood memories were at the farm, moving sheep, trying to catch piglets and playing in dung heaps. Each to their own! Now a vegan to try and detox her daughter who had recurrent skin problems, Serena's innovative cooking skills were fully tested. Delicious soups, fresh vegetables and delightful deserts abounded as healthy, fast moving children darted around the farm, puddle splodging, peering at different plants, poking the trees and trying to understand dripping lichen and spongy moss.

We truly did test a youth group from London. On arrival at the farm, they all clambered into the sitting room, snuggling down into the well worn armchairs around the crackling fire. First question! 'What is different about this room?'..... 'There is no TV!'....... 'there is a fire'........... 'It's old'....... and so the history comes tumbling out. A house built without bricks. A house that is possibly 600 years old (well – 'ish'), originally heated by cows, pigs and sheep....... are we lucky to be alive now? It's a good argument. A good return to reality when frustration at having the wrong coloured plate, or not sitting in a favourite place at the table leads to spitting, stamping, yelling and slamming shut the ancient door. Who are you in a house so old to be so demanding? 'Sorry. I will be more respectful.' Is the meek reply, once the heaving chest of anger and frustration has finally calmed.

Three sisters had never visited before. Never been to the moors and rarely out of London. It was howling. The sky opened with relentless, sheets of persistent cold rain for two days. So we took the group to Hembury woods! Leaping and bouncing through the trees we peered at the differences branch formations, collected colourful leaves, carefully negotiated ridges where one slip would have tumbled everyone into the speeding Dart. So we laughed, sang and walked...... and walked...... and then more rain and yet more. By the time we reached the fort, Serena and I had one girl each by the hand and had to sing, clamber distract and virtually haul them up the hill amid snuffles of, 'I'm coldI want to go home!'

Slipping, scampering, we finally made it to the road and spoddle ploshed, running to the van. With the pigs to feed, muck out and bedding to be laid, warmth was soon pumped back into everyone's arms and legs..... and exhausted but grinning children devoured every morsel of food. Funny how children arrive being very particular and picky about their food.
