

The Parish Letter

Of course by now you will have finished your "Spring Cleaning", with every cupboard emptied, cleaned and refilled, all the carpets beaten and all books and ornaments meticulously dusted, and the copper and silver polished? No? Maybe I'm a bit out of touch, but the idea of brushing everything down and removing every last cobweb is an old tradition that might still hang in somewhere? Spring Cleaning a house or a flat is not unlike the season of Lent where we were invited to have, as it were, a spiritual Spring Clean before arriving at a glorious celebration of Easter.

So here we are in May – with the summer beckoning us on with life outdoors and BBQ's, and the lighter summer clothes that have already been in the shops for a while – I went to buy a new warm dressing gown last week, and was told I'd have to wait until the autumn – lightweight summer dressing-gowns were what they now had in stock, so I'll have to shiver for a bit longer!

And with the warmer weather we are looking forward to the wedding season – couples coming to our beautiful churches to celebrate their love and commit to their lifelong vows. And very often choosing the wonderful reading in St Paul's letter to the Corinthians:

"Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." (1 Cor 13:4-7)

This passage sets out standards of behaviour which have stood the test of two thousand years, and found to be just as relevant today as ever. And of course Paul is not really writing about weddings, rather the whole of life with its ups and downs. And he is writing with three themes in mind, faith, hope and love. The greatest of these is love, and we know about faith, but hope is perhaps the one that gets overlooked?

Looking forward to something good coming is all about hope. But sometimes hope seems absent. When I meet someone who is feeling low, I often find myself asking them "What have you got to look forward to?" And we have a discussion about the near future – maybe a friend coming over, or a trip away, or a phone call with a friend, or going out to a film, or an invitation to a party. Something coming up soon that they can look forward to. This is hope – a sense of keeping going and then a good time will come. This is very much part of our culture – say, working from Monday to Friday and looking forward to the weekend is about hope. Something to lift our spirits.

Borough & Parish Council Elections will be held on 2nd May. There are two candidates standing for Borough Council for Dartmoor Ward; Mark Renders (Independent) and Stephen Earp (Conservative Party).

For the parish council elections for Dartmoor Forest, Julian Greatrex and Wendy Watson were returned unopposed for Postbridge ward whilst Alison Geen was returned unopposed for Huccaby ward (this includes Hexworthy).

For Princetown ward there will be an election. There are 8 candidates for the 7 available seats.

Spooner's & West Dartmoor Hunt in Princetown on 16th March 2019 Issues had been raised by some members of the public about the hunt going through Princetown. The council also received a report from the Master of the Hunt providing the viewpoint of the Hunt. It was resolved that there were no grounds for concern and no further action was required.

Anti-social driving initiative CCTV quotation has been received for approximately £7,500, and annual maintenance cost of £400, to gain an understanding of cost and whether it would act as a suitable deterrent to anti-social behaviour. John Ward, anti-social behaviour officer at WDBC, believes it would act as a strong deterrent. The council resolved to investigate what permissions would be required and sources of potential funding.

Princetown public toilets the following was noted by the council from WDBC: The lease for the Princetown facility, which ends on 23 March 2026, states that WDBC must use the premises as public convenience sonly and that it must be kept open at all reasonable times. Subject to DNPA's and the Duchy's (the Superior Landlord) agreement, it is, therefore, recommended that the provision be reduced to possibly one unisex and disabled facility, open seasonally (March to October) in order to reduce cleaning and other costs, whilst officers work together with DNPA and the Duchy with a view to finding potential alternative uses for the building, which would look to include an ongoing provision of a public toilet facility. Report to Full Council on 26th March 2019. Council also received a report from Cllr. Annabel Roberts (WDBC). The council agreed no action was required at this stage.
