The Parish Letter

Making room for the next new thing

It's September: a time for new beginnings. A new academic year for many marks the start of a new season for many people - new teachers, new schools, new friends, new subjects, new interests, hobbies and clubs. For some, it will mean the first steps into university level study, starting into adulthood and independence. For others, it will mean beginning a new job with new colleagues and responsibilities. For still others, this may even be their first year of retirement.

Nervous, hopeful, excited, apprehensive and expectant - the range of emotions experienced at times like these are wide and complex.

But for every new beginning in our lives there has to have been an ending. To start a new school, a new job, or move house we have to be prepared to leave the old versions behind. And frequently it can be challenging to leave the familiarity of friends and colleagues, the comfortable knowledge of knowing where things are and how 'it' all works. Often our own idea of who we are as a person is wrapped up with our identity within a social group, or in our profession, or in what 'we do'. To leave established things behind can be daunting and scary. But frequently, the old has has to be set aside to make room for the new.

As Christians we can have confidence in the belief that God is with us on this walk through life and that when we have decisions to be made His spirit is there, guiding us. That doesn't mean we shouldn't feel nervous or be careful, but it does mean we can feel confident that He's got our back and will show us in which direction our next steps should take. The bible is full of examples of new beginnings and stories of how God moved in those moments when people were willing to set aside their old attitudes and ways of doing things.

Let's pray that this September our own lives can be added to the endless examples of God-led new beginnings!







The Secret Life of Dartmoor Birds: Science for Survival?

Ashburton Arts Centre on Saturday 12th October.

What birds are found on Dartmoor and what measures are being taken to protect them? Come along to this event, hosted by the Dartmoor Society where scientists and enthusiasts will present their current research and ideas.

The Dartmoor Society is a charity whose aim is to safeguard the essential qualities of Dartmoor. Each year we hold a debate to look closely as some aspect of Dartmoor life or in this case its wildlife. *The Secret Life of Dartmoor Birds* will be held in Ashburton, in the marvellous former Methodist church, now the Arts Centre; a listed building with a grand entrance and a curved balcony and a perfect place to hold such an important day in the Dartmoor Society calendar.

Shallowford Farm News

July proved to be delightful...... early August seemed to disappear into scary, wintry thunderstorms and torrents of rain that should only appear in the winter. We dare not mention Climate Change, but the term is often discussed with our groups. Could we grow more vegetables on our farm at this altitude? Could we feed all our visitors with the meat we produce and at least grow enough fruit to freeze and store in great chests powered with our solar electricity supply. What choices do we have, what impacts are possible as we dare to balance the emissions of fuel, needed to bring groups to the farm with the social needs created by our ever insular, screenbased society?

The very basics often start with a simple walk though through the fields. With the grazing rotations, the fields are either arm high with beautiful soft grass, just pushing out seeds to blow in the gentle breeze or they are short tussocks and full of cow or sheep poo, usually resulting in screwed up faces and squeals of 'Ewww'. By the time we get to the gate, we can ask the question. 'What have we just walked through?' Despite being a field of grass, inevitably the focus is on the poo! No one yet has been able to accurately describe hay, no one has heard of silage and most certainly no one has been able to say which animals can safely be fed which type of grass-based feed. So far is the average person from farming and the source of their food. There is no point in blaming the young. It must be around at least 150 years or six generations since every person worked the land to produce the food they need to survive or tt least, had a productive garden!

Of course most children are not interested in vegetables or fields of wheat, barley, oats or maize. Fields of cows and sheep however – they are fascinating! Pigs are just wonderful, especially when they have snortling little piglets, belting in circles around their pen or snuggling into their mother to fervently suck. Some of the young people who visit us have quite complicated histories. One young lad, who was guiet, said very little, but heard every word. When guestioned he answered more accurately than most. We treated him like every other child, but at the very end his teacher confessed 'He is normally very violent and guite a handful. I have never seen him this calm. I saw him even talking with a piglet.' The animals work a type of magic that humans, with their complicated expectations and rules for behaviour make life far too demanding for young challenged lives. I quietly watch the children sometimes. They smile, they can be so still as a little chick hops, trustingly onto an open hand. Perhaps life can be perfect after-all. Even if just for a few moments!



Uncle Tom Cobley and All A new book by Todd Gray MBE

Tom Pearce and his old grey mare have long been an iconic part of Devon's cultural heritage and Uncle Tom Cobley one of the county's most well-known characters along with Bill Brewer, Jan Stewer, Peter Gurney, Peter Davey, Daniel Whiddon and Harry Hawk.

In the late 1800s 'Widdicombe Fair' became Devon's anthem but the long history of this

much-loved ballad has never been fully told. Nor has it been suspected that it has so many surprises.

Its publication in 1889 obscured the local variations which had been sung across Devon and which changed from one village to another. 'Widdicombe Fair' was once sung as 'Tavistock Fair' and 'Barnstaple Fair' and the lyrics were different across England. Cobley became Uncle Tom Cockerel and even Uncle Joe Maybe.

The ballad was adapted by Scott as a sledging song across the Antarctic, to enlist men to fight in the Great War, to ridicule the Communists in 1921, and used as a vehicle for innuendo by Kenneth Williams in *Round the Horne*.

It has also generated a phrase – 'Uncle Tom Cobley and All' – which has had a life of its own. It has been sung, spoken and written more widely than any other Devon expression.

Readers will find fifty-seven full variants of the song in this volume. These show how 'Widdicombe Fair' has been one of Devon's great cultural contributions but also how little appreciated the song has been. Until now.
