The Parish Letter

Emmanuel, You're one of us...

At the time of writing this, we have little idea what our Christmas celebrations will look like this year. Here in England, we are in the middle of a second COVID-19 lockdown and the Government has yet to release guidelines that cover the festive period. However, we can be fairly sure that we won't be able to travel as freely, or 'party as large' as we usually would.

For those with family living away, it is currently almost impossible to make plans to be together. For many families, even in the best of times, Christmas is a time of hugely complex, logistical plans of how to get Great-Granny A to Uncle B's while also fitting in a visit to Great Aunt C and not missing out The Cousins. This year, with the COVID situation, that planning could well be become insurmountably difficult and some visits may be missed.

For some, it may come as a relief to have a simpler time over the Christmas period. For others, it will be heart-breaking.

Throughout the whole of the COVID crisis our community has proved itself capable of pulling together and supporting each other. I'm absolutely sure that the Christmas season will be no different and that everyone will be especially mindful of those who may be struggling with loneliness and separation at this time.

If you find yourself having a pared down Christmas, why not reach out to others by extending what you would usually do for your family by blessing your neighbours instead? If you enjoy baking but have few visitors to bake for this year, why not gift homemade gingerbread biscuits or mini-Christmas cakes to others instead? Or organise a virtual Christmas Carol sing-a-long or perhaps go all out on decorating the front facing windows of your home to spread a little seasonal cheer to passersby? There are so many ways we can still reach out and bless each other this year.

Rend Collective have got a new Christmas album out – full of folky, festive tunes. One particularly poignant song is called "Emmanuel, You're one of us". The word 'Emmanuel' literally means 'God with us' and refers to the Messiah being born on earth. The words of this song are a reflection on what 'Emmanuel' means in the context of all that has happened this year.

Messy Church in a Bag Ashburton December 2020

This month we sent out "Messy Church Bags" again. This time the title was "Hide and Seek Jesus" We told two of Jesus' stories. "The Road to Emmaus" Luke 24 verses 13-35 when his friends did

not recognise him and the "lady who touched his garment" *Luke 8 verses* 43-48. The lady recognised Jesus while his



friends did not see him until he broke bread with them in the evening. Do we recognise Jesus when he is working among us?

After the families had read the stories, they were asked to look for Jesus in the scenes from a



book called "Find Wally". (I did buy several of the books then cut them up!!). They needed to find people doing kind things for each other in the pictures and circle them. As we go about our lives, do we notice when people do kind things for each other? I believe we need to concentrate and be observant, just like Lawrence, who is concentrating as he turns the craft Kaleidoscope that he has made. When we concentrate, and we will see Jesus working among us all the time.

Next month in December we will be making more Bags, but the idea is that some families will book in and collect their bags from the church on December 17th. We hope that we will be allowed to provide some food for them to enjoy and have a



little Service. We are not sure that any of this will be allowed, but we will be making some more Messy Church Bags for Christmas. Our journey out of lockdown is just like the game we sent out in the November bags: when you follow the path you sometimes go forward and sometimes backwards. Let us pray that we will move forward smoothly out of lockdown, all God's blessings for this Christmas. Jane

John Thomas Pickering

The latest in this series of articles features Reverend John Thomas Pickering.

He was born in Leicester in about 1841. It has not been possible to find the date of John's ordination into the priesthood, but it is known he was the curate at St James Church in Exeter in 1881. He was at that time a single man living in the city with his widowed mother and elder sister.

In 1888 John (at the age of 46) married Ellen Jane Ellis in Ladbroke Grove in London. Two years later daughter Dorothy was born at Culmstock in Devon.

In 1891 the Pickering family are listed in the census as living in Moretonhampstead where J.T. Pickering is noted as the vicar.

Church records indicate the Pickering's moved to Widecombe in 1894 when John Thomas succeeded The Reverend John Williams. At the time of taking up residence in Widecombe he was aged 52.

John Thomas Pickering and family lived in Widecombe until 1914 (20years) when he retired, he was succeeded by Reverend Eliot Colpoys Wood.

In his retirement Reverend Pickering and his wife Ellen moved to Taunton and lived with their daughter Dorothy. Ellen died in 1929 and John Thomas in 1933 (Aged 92)

After his retirement from Widecombe Reverend Pickering wrote a booklet entitled "An account of St Pancras Church at Widecombe in the Moor". (A copy of this booklet was recently offered for sale "on line" priced at £80.

Interesting aside:

Of the 53 "Vicars of Widecombe" listed by name in the records by far the most popular Christian name is; John 17,followed by William 6, Richard 5, Thomas 4, Philip 3,Walter2, Peter 2, Robert 2, Hugh 2, Clement, George, James, Jeremy, Eliot, Eric, Merrick Henry, Roger & Edward.

John Webb 1877 - 1916

Whilst researching the list of those men from Postbridge who fell in the 1st World War I came across the name of John Webb. Previously I had noted a Leslie Webb who fell in the 2nd World War and wondered if there was a connection. Although unable to establish a connection between John and Leslie I did further research and was able to pinpoint exactly how John Webb met his end.

He worked as a tin miner in the various tin mines in the area. In around 1900 John married Elizabeth Jane Westaway and they had 5 children, 3 of whom were born in Bristol in the first few years of the 20th Century.

By 1911 John and family had returned to Postbridge and in the census of that year John is recorded as a "Tin Miner (underground)".

He enlisted for service with 2nd Battalion Devonshire Regiment in 1914 (Private. 19236). In 1916 as part of the infamous 'Battle of the Somme' the 2nd Devon's were fighting at Hulluch, Unknown to them the Germans had planted mines underneath the trenches in which the "Devonshires" were fighting and the Regimental records show that a mine was exploded under John Webb's trench on the 21st August 1916.

It is probable John Webb was one the men killed at this time. The irony of manner of his death must have added extra grief to his family.

This much-loved carol comes from Austria, where it was first sung as Stille Nacht, heilige Nacht on Christmas Eve, 1818. It was written by Father Joseph Mohr, a young priest at St Nicholas parish church, in the village of Oberndorf bei Salzburg. As Christmas 1818 approached, he asked the local schoolmaster, Franz Xaver Gruber, to compose a melody for his carol. Gruber was organist in the nearby village of Arnsdorf, and so was happy to oblige. On Christmas Eve they presented the carol to the church during the midnight mass. The carol went on to become loved world-wide; and the version sung by Bing Crosby is the third best-selling single of all time.
