

The Parish Letter

Be mine, Valentine!

This is the time of year when the days start to get longer, when birds start to pair off and when we remember how Valentine was faithful in his love and witness for Jesus Christ, even to death. 14th February has become a date for romance rather than martyrdom (the birds win here!) and the seven days leading up to Valentine's Day are marked as National Marriage Week when couples are encouraged to renew their marriage vows and give thanks for the love they share.

On Valentine's Day, a few years ago, Mandy and I enjoyed an evening by candlelight, toasting crumpets in front of a log fire with a bottle of claret. This, however, was chiefly because there was a power cut and we couldn't watch TV. OK, so I'm no romantic. I proposed to Mandy at Strensham Service Station on the M5 (southbound, if you're interested) in the car park on the cold, wet, grey morning of 5th January 1986. Then we went inside to have a cup of coffee to celebrate. Well, it's true that Strensham may not be the most romantic place or name; but as we have travelled up and down the M5 in the last 34 years, that motorway service station has been a reminder to me of how lucky I was to find Mandy and how fortunate I have been to receive her love and company in marriage.

When we come to renew marriage vows, we do it in the presence of God because we are only too aware of how we mess up or have fallen short and need forgiveness. Marriage is like discipleship. I may not be the brightest disciple but one of the things I have learnt in my 45 years as a follower of Jesus is that Jesus forgives sinners and he loves us. As he said repeatedly from the cross, 'Father, forgive them. They know not what they do.'

Marriages and all relationships, at their best, have the potential to be a reflection of God's response to us and his creation. Through them we can learn about unconditional love and forgiveness. Certainly, being married gives us plenty of opportunity to say, 'Sorry!' and 'I love you.' It's just a pity if it is always said in that order!





News from the East Shallowford Trust

Someone asked, 'What do you do when you don't have groups visiting?' I have to confess, I tried hard not to roll my eyes! We had what seemed like hundreds of visitors over the Christmas holidays – we didn't, but as Alethe loaded up the washing machine yet again, we were sincerely grateful for our solar power, which works well, even on cloudy days to keep our bills down and our ecological footprint limited!

So – what do we do when a group is not visiting? Well, as chief fundraiser, cleaner, bottle washer and general dog's body........... I, like everyone else, generally, cleans, scrubs, paints and in my case, looks for funding to keep us going and not just maintain, but hone our farm activities to ensure the greatest positive impacts on anyone who visits.

Last Thursday I went to a meeting in Exeter on PCNs! As I peered around corners in this modern purpose built centre with everyone dressed immaculately in suits, ties, skirts and neat shoes without a third or even fourth layer of clothing (necessary to all of us on the moors), I wondered what I would learn. I had been invited to a meeting on rolling out the Govts new initiative on 'Primary Care Networks'. Why should we be involved? Because we have something unique and wonderful to offer that can really change a human's outlook on life! I learned two major points. In trying to find a way forward (the aim of the creating Primary Care Networks is to improve ownership and delivery of healthcare – and reduce the haemorrhaging and stress of NHS staff) few practices are actually talking with all their staff – it tends to be GPs huddled together making consultative decisions for their practices..... and Positions related to Social Prescribing will be 100% funded by govt. Meaning, social prescribing will happen and it's something we should all know about. What is it? As far as I understand, if your GP feels your depression is due to isolation or your obesity is due to lack of exercise, instead of providing drugs, you will be offered an opportunity to join a 'group', doing something non drug related. In other words - there are alternatives to drugs and we should use them whenever possible!

So...... can East Shallowford Farm be useful in this way as well as being a Lung for the City?

My aim as Trust Manager over the next few months is to find people who knew Miss Braund and Rosemary, or have some experience with East Shallowford and the work that has been undertaken since 1975. What can we do? What should we be doing? Things have changed in the last forty years and we can no longer rely on Miss Braund's Legacy. Building work has begun, but it's all internal work! Apologies for those passing down the lane – for a year the view over the wall will not be pleasant. We promise that eventually there will be a beautiful Devon bank, new trees, the field will be wonderful again and come into regular grazing






