The Parish Letter

It occurred to me that January can feel like Monday on a bigger scale! I don't find it all easy to get back in the routine after Christmas – I love holidays and relaxation and having a break from normal – and Christmas should be just that – a Festival; though of course Christmas can be a hard time for many suffering with loss, or lack of money, or relationship issues....

But what about Mondays? That Monday morning feeling I guess starts in our schooldays – weekends mean no lessons, Monday comes and it's back to lessons. I'm talking about my experience here, and I didn't enjoy school. Those that do enjoy school presumably look forward to Monday mornings – and maybe that was you? We're all different! Leaving school doesn't help though, as Monday mornings then become work mornings – struggling into the office or workplace, tackling the mountain of work that somehow didn't get done on Friday, and has grown with a whole burst of emails or messages from those other people who are trying to clear their desks and want to dump it on you.

And it's not just those going out to work that find Monday mornings tough. Mums with young children can also be back to earth with a bump – on your own with another week ahead of dealing with fractious children in the day and a fractious partner in the evening who may be too stressed to help with bedtime. And for single retired people, maybe the much-enjoyed Sunday lunch with a family member is over, and it's a whole week before the next one.

And so the Monday morning effect becomes part of most people's lives. It's pretty much the same on the first day back from holiday (or maybe the second day back is tougher, after you've told all the stories), like the first day of a new term. It is a bit similar to when one is made redundant, or one loses a partner, or one faces an illness. It's hard. We perhaps expect to enjoy life all the time, and so the hard times seem somehow unfair! And during January the Christmas and New Year holiday effect can soon wear off. But...

Of course we all develop our own strategies – for me, looking forward to the next weekend, the next holiday, the next family visit, helps me through the Monday mood and "back-to-work" moods. And routine kicks-in. For those going back to work – arriving, saying hello, getting a cup of coffee, having a brief chat, checking emails or work schedules, planning priorities, facing the reality, and the day seems more manageable. And in that list, it's the saying hello and having a brief chat that are perhaps most important – relating to those around me, knowing others feel a bit like I feel, finding support. For those at home, Monday may be a routine of changing the sheets, putting the washing in, doing a bit of cleaning, going out to the shops and chatting to people we meet. Again, it's the chatting that probably makes the most difference. And which can be the hardest bit – being withdrawn into a state where it's really difficult to face anyone can be very hard to break out of.





As police officers, we often heard complaints about police stations closing and fewer 'bobbies on the beat' because of tight budgets. There is a parallel with the church – people want the church to be there for weddings, baptisms and funerals but without money for the upkeep and volunteers willing to give time to keep church buildings open and running, then they will gradually disappear.

Perhaps that is not such a bad thing. 'The church' is not really about buildings, it is about people talking about and practising the Christian message of God's love to us regardless of who or what we are. Perhaps we are on the cusp of going back to the beginning of the Christian church where the message was more important than the fabric of a building. Would that be so bad?

One thing that we can guarantee will be the same this year, is the display of snowdrops in the grounds of the Chapel. From mid-February there will be snowdrops in pots available to take away for a donation in the Chapel.







November merged into December without us really noticing. Long dark nights. We are always surprised to have any visitors at this time of year as we hunker down to protect ourselves, feeling more like large lumbering badgers, wanting to hide in our burrows except on the few rare days the sun manages to force its way through the clouds, reminding us that brightness will eventually return.

The group pulled fodder beat in mud which sucked their boots into the earth. They lifted few beats, but for the first time as teenagers, pulling something alive from the soil which served a purpose in the long cycle of food to relinquish their hunger – a task with reason. 'No – I want to talk to my Mum.' 'You can talk to her at the top. Phone please.' Reluctantly it was handed over and off he shot. At the top, the others were daring each other to jump off the rocks. 'Would you like your phone back now? I can take a picture for your Mum.' 'No!' he sulked. 'Here it is.' I offered. 'No.' he replied and turned his back as I jumped up towards him to ask them all to guess where Shallowford was, where the road, the sea and Broadaford Farm. He refused to look, to engage. What was going on in his head? He ran; we all ran down the hill.

On returning to the farm, the tantalising smells of home grown roast chicken hit our senses flooding us with pangs of delicious hunger. The boys stripped their beds and carried their bags down stairs. But the one boy sat himself on the sofa and refused to join us in the dining room.

The leader spoke with him. I went to sit next to him, took his hand and said, 'None of us like to see you so quiet. You know you are loved, grumpy or smiling. I'll leave the door open and you can come for lunch if you change your mind.' He sat staring resolutely in front of him, saying nothing. We finished eating and still he sat staring ahead of him, watching the fire vacantly. I was concerned as the group was leaving and we had not managed to get a word out of him for about an hour. He'd been the bubbling noisy one on arrival – now sullen, shrunken in on himself and unmoving. What could we do as their leader called them to get into the car?

Everyone lined up to say goodbye, handshakes initially and then huge hugs from the leader and the others. He walked away with nothing, then turned sharply on one leg, came hurtling back, flung his arms around me and squeezed hard. I whispered in his ear, 'You'll come back please?' 'Yes', he whispered as the tears welled up.

We know nothing about these young people's lives. They come for such a fleeting visit. If they are lucky, they come again and again. Shallowford becomes their home. Challenging; a paradox of emotions, but somewhere safe they can return to throughout their lives Somewhere they are unreservedly loved.
