Christian Super-Heroes – who's your inspiration?

Historically, so much happens in March. We've come through the bleak winter months of January and February, and then we reach March with the promise of new life and spring time. In the Christian calendar, we've entered the season of Lent and are preparing the way for the excitement of Easter.

But March begins with St David's Day – the patron saint of Wales. Dewi Sant (to give him his proper Welsh name) was a nobleman, born in Wales c500 AD. He lived a long and holy life, founding monasteries across Wales, England and parts of Europe. The Welsh are justifiably proud of their homebred patron saint and the whole nation celebrates all things Welsh on March 1st (held to be his birth date). Schools take part in music competitions, children dress in traditional Welsh costume and the culture of Wales is celebrated nationally and internationally.

Saints are people, ordinary people, who did extraordinary things. They are people who the church recognizes as having led holy lives that reflected biblical teaching. In Saint David's case, he was an amazing preacher and founder of religious communities. He inspired people to get closer to God and seek a holy lifestyle themselves. Some people believe that ALL people of faith who live to serve God God is a saint, others believe that sainthood applies to only the chosen few.

Whatever your personal understanding of sainthood is, this got me thinking about who do we look to as Christians for inspiration? Who is your faith hero? Do you have a biblical character who's story you find especially inspiring? Is there a more recent 'hero of the faith' whose biography motivates you into action? Is there someone who you know personally who inspires you?

Danielle Strickland is not someone who I know personally but I do find her work very inspiring. Danielle is a Canadian evangelist, a Salvation Army Captain, mum of 3 boys, and someone who 'trains, advocates and inspires people to live differently'. She's written several books. Her style is light-hearted, humorous and relevant to contemporary life but absolutely rooted in biblical truth. She's an excellent public speaker with many talks available as podcasts. If you've never read any of her work, or heard her speak, I'd urge you to check her out.

And of course, I have plenty of musical heroes but these change almost daily depending on my mood! If you're interested, please ask!

But, the key thing about our heroes is the impact we allow them to have on our lives. As children we may have had a friend that our parents considered a 'bad influence' and of course, it's possible even as adults to have friends who's effect on us is not entirely positive. As Christians we need to reflect on this in a faith context. Do you find yourself becoming more brash, or ill-tempered when you spend time with certain people because that's how they are? Do you start swearing or using inappropriate language simply because they do and the habit rubs off? Does being with them cause you to show less of the light of Jesus and reflect less of the fruits of the Spirit? If your relationships with certain people cause



St Raphael's - a sanctuary?

The original meaning of sanctuary was a sacred place or shrine; a place of haven and a place of safety. We, of course, also know that those accused of crime were protected from legal action by using a 'sanctuary'! Recently, the opportunity arose for the Chapel to be used as another type of sanctuary.

To be accepted for the Ten Tors Challenge held in May every year, teams of six teenagers are required to declare that they can achieve the Challenge of hiking, unaided over 55 miles of Dartmoor terrain.

During February, three or four teams of young people from the South-west arrived at Dave Mudge's field opposite St Raphael's to camp for the weekend as part of their preparation. Two teams broke tent poles attempting to erect their shelters and the tents collapsed! Teachers came to the rescue giving up their own tents to provide some refuge and spent an uncomfortable night in the school minibus.

As the school minibuses were unable to access the muddy field, they had decided to park on St Raphael's car park. Enter a passing Churchwarden who politely suggested a donation to the Chapel might be appropriate recompense for this facility.

During the discussion one of the teachers pleadingly asked, (he actually said, 'cheekily'), if there was any possibility of sleeping inside St. Raphael's in their sleeping bags – otherwise they were to have to 'sit' in their school minibus to sleep overnight again.

The wood burning stove was lit, the toilet left unlocked for use and two very grateful teachers left a generous donation. We are not quite ready to introduce 'champing' (camping in churches) at St. Raphael's on a regular basis, but we were happy to help and hopefully they left with a positive impression.

From Visitors to Pilgrims.

Most in the Moorland Team will know something of this initiative – part of our Benefice Vision and Growing Rural Churches strategy.

In summary, the project is about bringing our parishes more closely together through developing a good practice 'Welcome Pack' for the churches and creating a 'Heritage/Church Trail' around the Benefice.





News from the East Shallowford Trust

Pigs!

Funny creatures to say the least. We are all told that their internal organs are similar to ours, they suffer similar diseases as humans (which a good Muslim once told me was why Mohamed tried to ban his community from eating pork) and of course, they are, very intelligent. However, we don't breed for intelligence, but delicious steaming sausages, wonderful crispy pork joints and succulent, tender burgers, that at East Shallowford, we definitely prefer to beef burgers!

Do we deprive our wonderful pigs by not breeding for their problem solving skills? Alethe to the rescue! She hums and sings to them. They come when called, by name. She scratches their backs, rubs their noses, lets them out of their pens every day for a wonder, little chat and sniff around the barn. At this time of year their delight for rootling destroys the top layer of soil sending it cheerfully sliding down the hill in the heavy, persistent moorland drizzle. So they have all been brought in to keep the soil on the hill and them toasty warm. They cheerfully chat to each other (well, grunt and squeak) and snore gently the rest of the time. Rootling is limited to straw which they toss and chomp to make deeper beds, with fodder beat to munch slowly after ravaging their scoop of nuts, delivered 3 tonnes at a time by dextrous drivers who are adept at negotiating the lanes.

However, in the last few months we have had a problem. Percy, our six foot six Welsh White, who tilts his head so he can peer at you from under his large pendulous ears, has not been performing!

How much would you like to know about pigs? Sows come on heat once every 18 – 21 days, and when they do, they stand, stock still, are really difficult to move as they prepare every muscle in anticipation of the boar's weight on their back. I once worked on a massive commercial farm in East Anglia with cement slatted pens, a taught tether around their chest, clipped to the ground and bars that limited the sows to a, 'stand up and sit down' action only. Thank goodness the intensive systems have been banned. I walked onto the farm blissfully ignorant and remained working in the weaner and growing pens. Although in the farrowing sheds we would sometimes ride the huge pink sows around to the boar..... Be assured we would never do that at Shallowford!!

However, we do let Percy out every day to sniff and snortle at his nine ladies! He rubs deftly on particular gates, sniffs and grunts, has a little chat, leaves wonderful slobber as the mark of his appreciation and wanders off to the next lady. Just once, he decided to roll in muck that was piled in the middle of the floor – just like a dog when it finds fox poo! However, Percy is nearly 300kilos! Could not get the camera out fast enough – legs in the air, neck and shoulders bathed in the joyful, delicious smell!

This last month, we had a lovely service with Heidi Lewis at Poundsgate, learning more about her work in the Benefice after her first 7 months or so in post and about her training with the Church Army.
