

The Parish Letter

Banishing Fear and Living in Hope

As I write, the news is full of talk about the rising number of cases of Coronavirus, fear of a 'second wave' and of further lockdowns across the country to try to prevent its spread.

The bible says hope is not just wishful thinking about the future but a confident expectation about things that are unclear and unknown.

The Coronavirus pandemic has affected all of us these past nine months. Some have died, many others have lost their job or livelihood; each one of us knows elderly and vulnerable neighbours who have been isolated and unable to see family and friends. And now there is the gloomy prospect that, with reports of rising infections, restrictions will be set until long after Christmas.

It is easy to let anxious questions overwhelm us: they can range from the personal: 'How will I cope if I catch the virus?' 'Might I infect someone else who gets seriously ill?' 'Will I lose my job?' 'How can I pay my bills?' 'When will my cancelled operation be rescheduled?' – through to worry about the country, our society and the future: 'How many businesses will go bankrupt?' 'How many people will become unemployed?' 'How will we fund the welfare state in the future?' 'How will this national debt be paid off?'

How do we live in hope and not fear? One of the ways Jesus said we would save our lives is to give it away: 'those who lose their life for my sake will save it'. He's not saying that this world does not matter. It does. But Jesus is saying: 'Don't lose the big picture!' There is more to come. And if you have a grasp of the next life then you can live more fully in the present during this life.

In this difficult time, it has been heartening to see the way communities have pulled together; locally, we have seen generous giving to the community Lockdown Larder, people offering lifts and 'Ashleigh' the Corona Cab serving folk across this part of Dartmoor. Losing yourself in God's priorities – loving your neighbour as you love yourself - is a path to life in all its fulness. How wonderful to see Eve Nutley and Jill Distin doing just that. Coping with being made redundant and with time on their hands, they turned their thoughts to those who might be struggling in the winter; then



Responsibilities for Watercourses - Polite Reminder

Holne Parish Council would like to politely remind landowners of their responsibilities to keep their watercourses clear. If you live or own a property that is next to any watercourse, including streams, culverts, leats & drains (other than a highway drain), or you have a watercourse that flows through your property, you are a 'riparian landowner' and you have 'riparian' rights and responsibilities which have been established in common law for many years. A riparian owner is responsible for accepting water from their upstream neighbour and transferring this, along with any existing drainage from their own property, freely, to their neighbour downstream. Responsibilities also include maintenance of the bed and banks of the watercourse and for clearing debris even if it did not originate from their land and removing obstructions.

ALLAN HARPER 1933 – 1960

For those of you in the parish who may remember Allan, it is 60 years ago this month that he was tragically killed in a farming accident.

He was taken in from an orphanage by Mrs Caunter at Sweaton Farm Ponsworthy and worked in and around the village until his death so had no known family.



His grave was never marked in the Churchyard but this has now been rectified and a stone marks the place where he rests along side the path leading to the West Door

REST IN PEACE ALLAN

Philip Carlyon

Philip Carlyon was vicar of Widecombe in the 1860s'. He was born in St Mawgan in Pyder, Cornwall in December 1811 his father Philip being vicar of the parish of St Mawgan in Pyder. Little is known of Philip's early life except that the family remained in Cornwall for at least 16 years after Philip's birth.

In 1846 Philip married Grace Young in Kincardine in Scotland. They moved back to Exeter where Philip was appointed vicar of St Johns Church. After 8 years in Exeter Philip moved to the South coast of Devon and became vicar of Revelstone. Philip then moved to Widecombe to become vicar of the parish.



"The living is a vicarage, tithe rent-charge £280 yearly with residence and about 80 acres of land, in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Exeter and held by the Rev Philip Carlyon M.A. of Emmanuel College Cambridge." Whites Devonshire Directory 1865.

Philip and Grace remained at Widecombe for approximately eight years before moving on to Wisbech in Cambridgeshire, and when in his eighties to Midlothian in Scotland. However, by the age of 90 the Carlyons had returned to Philip's native Cornwall. They remained in Falmouth until Philip died in 1913 at the age of 101.

The picture above, taken from the local Falmouth newspaper, shows Philip reading the telegram of congratulation on his 100th birthday received from Queen Alexandra.



News from the East Shallowford Trust

For once, I don't have an amazing story to tell! Hmmm........ it rained? The grass has grown, we seem to have been extremely busy....... but no visitors! Well, apart from our trustees who came to view the work to date, take a perambulation around the farm and discuss various options as we move forward.

Much of the 'being busy' was trying to madly write and coordinate funding proposals. This is not only for the construction, but for programme work. How can East Shallowford be truly useful for a Brexit based, Corona recovery, climate change, increasingly screen based generation?

The week before the six sturdy philanthropists arrived for their perambulation, I had to madly prepare notes for our 'Strategic Presentation' which aims to address the questions above! It was basically trying to make a comprehensive plan out of all the ideas and suggestions we have gleaned from talking with people over the last eighteen months. It's been interesting to hone down to 'how has Shallowford made the greatest 'positive' impact on people's lives?' Where can we make a difference? Where are we most valuable? It's very clear that the essential elements of what Miss Braund and Rosemary captured and undertook for over forty years has not changed.

People need to grow up with animals – without it they lose a whole sense of responsibility, a sense of being and perspective within the world is essential. People need to simply be outdoors, to get wet, to play in puddles and mud, and this is not restricted to children – it's very healthy for adults as well. Lock-down has clearly proven this. Humans need to know where their food comes from, to

learn respect for nature, for each other...... I am probably waffling to the converted. If you are reading this, you know everything I am writing about already.

So – what needs to change from the old days? Not a lot! Small groups are good – so we can actually have a conversation with people. The value of conservation and the relationship between humans and the natural world probably can be more directly discussed. Our responsibility to the planet on which we intrinsically depend and yet treat like rubbish. I use the pigs as the example. A pig does not poo and pee where it sleeps...... yet humans are doing so. What is wrong

We have in our plans a series of debates for the youth on population growth. I say this as some visitors with five children have arrived 'Gulp' – says I, thinking I must not be rude. 'Errrr – more people on our little planet? Climate change? Population growth?' but few people see the direct link and dare anyone challenge the 'right to have as many children as I want', even if it means yet more fields being hacked into concrete jungles. more forests scrubbed out of existence for food for the animals that humans demand to eat. More

gouges slit into the core of the earth to mine the minerals that our incessant capitalist system demands as we pander to the greatest human need of 'wanting things'.

The so called 'success' of the human race must be based on intrinsic animal drivers; water, food, shelter, companionship. Yet, we consider ourselves a little higher and superior to our animal cousins with a need to understand, to create art, to desire objects, to procreate, to find purpose, to love and of course, to rest Continued on page 44

in comfort. Capitalism seems to have warped Maslow's theory of hierarchical needs.

Yet something has changed in the last forty years. Something very fundamental – at least in our wonderful western world. As Pierre in War and Peace noted – he had forgotten that 'a superfluity of the comforts of life destroys all joy in satisfying one's needs.' Are we so satiated? So gorged with superfluity that we have major mental health issues? Well, it seems a 'yes and no' answer. The readers of the news tell us that many families in the UK cannot meet their basic needs – can't pay bills (shelter), don't have three meals a day (go hungry) and due to Corona Virus have lost jobs (sense of value) and cannot meet people (love and belonging).



Eden visits us every week to help with the animals and is a very particular friend of Mr Polish!

So we twist a basic human instinct of searching for food, nest or home building which is needed to protect family and find food into Adam Smith's concept of the perfect capitalist system..... Based on no more than the human drive to feed and protect. But it's all gone slightly wrong. People don't analyse their basic instincts. We are warped by the family in which we grow up (our first culture) and then the second culture of school, television, radio – the society in which we grow up (our second culture). How many of us even realise that there are other values or norms? We know they exist - vaguely in some dim and distant other place. But, are they better..... Naaa – they cannot be, 'My world is perfect! My values are right!'..... so what can we do? Just nudge a few people? You have options, you have choices – there are other worlds out there. They may be different, they

may be scary, but they may be exciting, interesting and also............ Maybe more positive, productive and enjoyable than the one you have come from! We need to be the catalyst that dares people to reflect. Dares people to question and maybe, even change?


