

The Parish Letter

I guess we all thought it would be over by now. But it's not. And we're sort if getting used to it, with some more than others fretting at the restrictions and wondering why they have to be applied so rigorously when we know that in our community of X, Y or Z there aren't any cases and there is no obvious risk. So, inevitably, the rules have to be made tight and clear so that everyone knows what they can and can't do, with the threat of enforcement in the background. But given the nasty nature of Covid-19, hopefully everyone can see that personal freedoms have to be set aside for the greater good? In particular for the good of the vulnerable in our communities.

I don't know about you, but I've found the wearing of face-masks symbolic of the more general feelings. Initially, back in February, I was puzzled and intrigued by those pictures coming from China of all the citizens of Wohan wearing masks in the streets and in the shops. It felt alien and remote. That won't happen here, was perhaps the general thought. But as the virus crept and leapt across the world, we started taking it more seriously, learning to wash hands more frequently and be a bit careful how close we got when having conversations. But masks? No way. And then the advice started coming out – by the end of May it was "you are recommended to wear masks in shops". And while waiting for my Click and Collect in a supermarket carpark I counted the number of people wearing masks – perhaps one in twenty?

Wearing a mask was something that highwaymen did, or something I should do in a dusty workshop, but I never do! Or it was the stuff of romantic ballroom dances where a mask was supposed to disguise you completely, allowing slightly illicit romance to flourish. But shopping in a mask? Very hard to do if you're the only one. People look at you as if you were a bit odd. And talking from inside a mask feels very odd, and glasses steam up and it's hot and makes one breathless. I guess you felt odd and uncomfortable putting one on in public for the first time? Self-conscious? But eventually everyone had to do it, and all was well, as it was required rather than voluntary. Phew! But still our political leaders try to avoid wearing masks if at all possible when they are on camera – somehow they can't bring themselves to set the example that would make wearing a mask feel totally normal.

Thinking about this, I realised that there is a long tradition of publicly humiliating and jeering at people by making them wear something distinctive as a punishment. Like putting a Dunce's Cap on a child who keeps making mistakes, or tarring and feathering a political opponent. Or making Jesus wear a crown of

thorns and a purple robe at his trial. Jeering and humiliation are a common enough, but a nasty side of human behaviour, when someone is picked on for being different or for doing something different. It's safer being one of a crowd, not standing out. Which makes it very hard to stand up for injustice, or speak out against abuse, or be the first to wear a mask.

The prophets in the bible who spoke out for better behaviour knew this very well, and tried to build confidence in their followers. After Moses' death, God encouraged a reluctant Joshua to take over as leader "Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

In September we distributed 35 Messy Church Bags This was one of the photos sent to me with a wonderful message saying how much the bags were enjoyed.


> Other photos came from another family, then other lovely thank you's arrived.







Future plans

This month we have been making plans - hoping to meet the needs and growth of our community, congregation, and visitors.

Communication

For several years, we have worried about the safety of our congregations in the case of an emergency. There is no mobile telephone signal or telephony/ broadband to St. Raphaels. We believe this is essential for contacting emergency services and are therefore exploring the possibility of installation of telephony/ broadband to the Chapel.

We must meet certain planning restrictions due to the Grade 2 listing of the Chapel - which may take a few weeks! Other benefits - if we do install the system, include the opportunity of using 'contactless' payments for collections and donations/collections; the ability to download or livestream virtual Church services and presentations; and for visitors to have access to telephony.

Car Parking

We are also submitting a planning application to the Dartmoor National Park Authority for an extended car park immediately adjacent to our small existing one. (With special thanks to Mike Gilbert for drawing up the plan.)



It has become increasingly obvious with the growth in our regular congregation and visitors, that the current car park is inadequate especially in road safety terms. On many occasions, whether on a Sunday morning or for special services such as weddings, (and of course snowdrop time!), the parking of vehicles on the narrow road outside the Chapel is literally an accident waiting to happen.

Parish Giving Scheme

The principle of "tithing" has biblical origins, donating a tenth of your salary or other income to the Church. But donating regularly of whatever sum, especially during these difficult times, can be problematic. (Can you remember when we used to have cash in our pockets and purses?)

Why are regular donations so important for St .Raphael's?

For St Raphael's to survive as a building and grow as a place of worship, we rely on donations. Approximately 78% of our costs are met by donations. We want to plan confidently for the future, including the projects outlined above – as we believe the Chapel makes a valuable contribution to our community life.

A Parish Giving Scheme has many benefits, including:

- Being able to donate monthly, quarterly, or annually by Direct Debit
- Enhancing your gift to St Raphael's by having Gift Aid at 25% added
- Giving anonymously if you prefer
- Donating securely and regularly.

During October we will be writing personal letters to all in our community and to our networks inviting you to set up a direct debit to St Raphael's. This will be administered free of charge by the national Parish Giving Scheme. We hope many will read the letter and accompanying brochure which explains more about the Scheme.

Eric Archibald Newbery



The fifth vicar of Widecombe to feature in this series of articles, served the parish between 1948 and 1958.

Eric was born in Krishnagar, Bengal, India where his father was a clergyman. Records indicate Eric served as an officer in the British Indian Army in 1920 before returning to the United Kingdom to marry Maud Ellen Longstaff in Greenwich London.

Reverend Newbery was ordained in 1923 and ministered at St Mark's Church in Southampton. He also served as Chaplain to the Mission to Seamen in the City. In 1928 he moved to Avonmouth, Bristol, but continued his chaplaincy to the Mission. In 1930 he became vicar of St Matthews Church in Bristol. By 1939 at the outbreak of war Eric and his wife Maud were living in Calne in Wiltshire.

It was during his time at Calne that Eric experienced the loss of his younger brother Douglas, a Surgeon Commander in the Royal Navy, who was lost along with 512 other crew men when HMS Repulse was sunk in the Far East on 10th December 1941.

Reverend and Mrs Newbery moved to the vicarage in Widecombe-in-the-Moor in 1948 and he remained for 11 years as vicar of the parish. Upon his retirement Eric went to live in Taunton in Somerset where he died in June 1960

He is deep, measured and highly inconspicuous. However, he tells a yarn better than most and has details that those in their graves would struggle to remember. Peter Dracup, walks purposefully up and down the lanes around Cator, to Shallowford, Broadaford and beyond. As those of us charging around in vehicles, chasing sheep, cows or in my case, vouth, we could learn a skill or two from Peter. He talks and teaches those

who are wise enough to stop long enough to listen. We need time, which of course

is lost on the youth who believe it will last forever. Peter, gathers his information and will tell something you need to know. And so he told the tale of East Shallowford's shenanigans and Dartmoor's magic with the youth, to a producer who clearly listened! The episode was of course filmed before 'The Rule of Six', which by the time the episode hits the TV, will have



changed yet again. We didn't follow Julia down to the Rugglestone for the evening shift – although it was tempting after a long and tiring day of filming (I joke – they were in and out at speed) to enjoy a glass of cold draught beer.

Will took them all down to see the cows and calves who munched quietly and peacefully on bright fresh clover as the sun slowly set on the horizon. The camera

crew quietly watched, the sun dutifully disappeared behind the hill and calves snuggled up to suckle on their Mother's udders whilst the group of children who were watching, simply watched! Quiet, alive, peaceful and calm. The simple of joy of gangly newly born animals on a warm evening in the gentle embrace of Dartmoor's soft breeze. Perfection can happen, if only momentarily.

Perfection in nature is perhaps the variables that are thrown up to combat the ever changing world in which we live. But change comes in many forms.

Our next group was small. Much smaller than it should have been. The reason was not an uncommon one for us to hear about, but the details were fairly harrowing. The group originated in London at a residential premises, designed to support young people to grow and become semi-independent as they work through their trauma and related issues. Most are housed under Section 20 of the 1989 Children's Act where a parent gives permission for a child to be taken into care or more commonly Section 31 where a child is placed in the care of a designated local authority, with parental responsibility being shared between the parents and the local authority. Others are accommodated under Section 46 where the police think a child may come under significant harm and is forcibly removed. Can you imagine having your child taken away by a police officer? I might want to crown mine occasionally when he is cheeky and rude....... but to have him removed? Does not bear thinking about.

The group leader had to talk, and keep talking. 'How to break the cycle of trauma? If you only know one bad route then that's your culture. It's all you know so, you automatically just repeat it. Again and again and again. Young girls have children because they have no vision. No path, no direction for themselves. And boys just join a gang and take drugs because that is all they know.' He spoke about one lad who 'would have loved the sheep. He was a shepherd in Eritrea. But he's gone into a shell. He wouldn't come out of his room. He's been like it for days and we can't get him out. He got to the UK on the underside of a truck. His arms hooked under one axle and his feet under another. Couldn't move for five hours or he would have dropped to his death. Both of his parents were killed by militia in Eritrea and now he is in a room. He can't cope. It's like PTSD. But he would have loved this.' He said, throwing his arms out wide, explaining the space and green around us.

None of us can imagine what it must be like. This lad grasped onto a dream. To run away and go somewhere safe, somewhere he could get his head together and not be Continued on page 47

scared of being killed every day. Now he is here, the fear is still crawling through his body and he can't leave his room. It seems life is punishing him for living. What can be done? What can we do?

Well, the two girls that did come were quiet. Very quiet! They were hard to engage in a conversation, but we tried as we passed around another plate of vegetables and to the delight of the skinniest wee girl,

a large dollop of lasagne, for which seconds and thirds were asked. Normally she would not eat. Still in Care at the age of 20, she had a job working in a nursery and was studying at university. But she barely spoke and kept sleeping. She missed the chance to move the cattle out of the ball. She missed a walk over to the calves and all her friend's questions about how 'Little money you make on selling a cow! You get a higher percentage selling coffee? Why do you do it?' she asked Will. 'Because I love it!" he replied. She asked me how many hours I worked, having seen me from 8.00 in the morning to 12.00 at night. 'Oh, seven days a week for all the time I'm not asleep.' 'Why do you do it? Do you get paid for all those hours' she asked, 'No, but my payment is when you smile.' 'Really?' she said with a great big grin from ear to ear. 'Yes', I replied, deadly serious!

And so we won the day by taking them over to see Charlotte's ponies. The girls were sat in the car ready to go, until I pointed out that it was walking distance. 'Really?' the skinny one said, peering over my shoulder to see the next house – which she could not see. 'Is it far? Do I have to go uphill? Is it cardio? I have only just begun put on weight.' She was a thin, waif of a thing. So damaged and traumatised that



But...... Charlotte and her team made both girls smile; in fact they giggled and laughed so much they nearly fell off! Thank you and everyone at the farm for your help – the girls were absolutely delighted!

These are the moments when we know we have won. We have made a memory. Something special, that can be dug up and visualised as a place of beauty when all else in the world seems to be cramming in and holding you down. We have to be the dream makers.
