New Beginnings - again.

A couple of days ago, I was looking through a pile of old newspapers that someone had given me. It didn't take me long to notice something as I looked at all the headlines – the papers were dated from the start of lockdown to a month or so ago, and the headlines gave an almost perfect summary of the past few months.

A year ago, I wrote my first letter for this magazine. The theme was 'New Beginnings' and I reflected on how, in order to start something new, we have to lay down the old. Letting go of what has been familiar can be scary but it is exciting to embrace the new.

A year ago, I had no idea just how 'new' my experiences over the coming months would be and what unusual times we would all soon be living through.....

The 'newness' of the pandemic situation across the world has caused many to have to adjust their lives beyond anything we could have imagined a year ago. James Holman Mason



James was born in Okehampton on 5th January 1780 to Naval Officer Holman Mason and his wife Catherine, James lived in Okehampton with his mother. His father was killed in Naval Action in 1798 when James was 18 years of age.

It is not known when or where James attended theological college. What is known is that he was Vicar of Treneglos and Warstow in Cornwall, and Chaplain to the Prince Regent when he was presented by the Bishop of Exeter as Vicar of

Widecombe on 3rd July 1815.

In 1816 James Holman Mason was appointed Chaplain to the Lord Warden of the Stannaries' and Master Forester of Dartmoor

Census data indicates the Reverend Mason never married but lived at the Vicarage with his niece Catherine Broderick

Robert Dymond claims in a book printed in 1876 that "a granite cross which once stood on Dunstone Green had been conveyed to the Vicarage garden by the Reverend James Mason". This cross was returned to its original position in Dunstone in the 1980's in a project organised by Widecombe History Group and funded by Miss Mary Hamlyn.

In his book "Ashburton and its Neighbourhood" published in 1875 Charles Worthy states, in 1850 Mrs Drake, niece of the Rev J.H. Mason purchased the Manor of Widecombe.

James Holman Mason died in 1861 aged 81 years and is buried in his hometown of Okehampton.

Currently, Reverend Mason is Widecombe's longest serving vicar.

Robert Dymond

Researching the history of 19th Century Widecombe is always greatly assisted by reference to "Things New and Old Concerning the Parish of Widecombe-in-the-Moor and the Neighbourhood" written by Robert Dymond. The book was written with the object of raising funds to finance much needed repairs to St Pancras Church.

Robert was born on 8th September 1824 to father Robert Dymond and mother Anne Priscilla Williams in the parish of St Edmond, Exeter. Robert (Jnr) was educated in Falmouth.

In 1851 Robert married Josephine Hingston in Kingsbridge and they had a family of one son and two daughters.

Robert practised in Exeter as a land surveyor and estate agent in partnership with his father and younger brother.

Robert bought Dunstone and Blackslade Manor in Widecombe in 1869 and lived at Blackslade Manor House until his death in 1888. During that period he published hundreds of articles and pamphlets on aspects of the history of Exeter Cathedral, The Old Inns and Taverns of Exeter, Historic Kingsbridge & Dodbrooke, Historic documents of Dartmouth, Civil History of Totnes and many more articles in local newspapers and magazines.

In 1876 he edited and contributed largely to "Things New and Old Concerning the Parish of Widecombe-in-the-Moor and the Neighbourhood". The proceeds from the sale of the book were devoted to restoration of St Pancras Church.

On August 25th 1888 Robert Dymond collapsed with a serious heart "mischief" whilst out walking with his wife near his home, and passed away peacefully six days later.



I am allergic to it!'.......... but she did diligently muck out the pigs and walked up and over a gate on a dark star lit night, wiggling through the gorse to reach Rowden Rocks to gaze admiringly towards Teignmouth, as we pointed out the Big Dipper and tried to find the various

astrological settings via some very useful google app.

Of course, summer nights are designed for barbecues, with lashings of ketchup

and Serena's sumptuous coleslaw. The good news is that many of the teenage girls refrain from salad – meaning I enjoy large dollops of it for lunch for days afterwards! This particular trip was to 'breath again', not the originally planned 'healthy eating trip' that we devised in September last year. We can't tell you the tales of angst and



pain that many have been enduring. Lock-down for all was no joke. Not merely a 'time indoors' sneaking joyfully of school. One has been repeatedly threatened by her close family members, another taken into foster care. Learning to breath again means life. These girls are not 'pushing boundaries' but trying merely to stay alive. We need to show them an alternative life, so they can believe in themselves and find a way through much of the turmoil they have been subjected to. They need to know there is hope and that they have choices.

Some of this happens simply through 'being there'. Offering a space, time to listen, time to smile, time for play when 'the other world' they come from is simply full of arguments and pain. As one girl said when I put my hand out for the phone, 'You have no idea how many arguments I am having right now!'

But she gave me the phone, and by



the end of the evening she was laughing.



Some of the time is for planning. Thinking of the future and trying to see what options there might be. We cannot always provide answers, but we can nudge, support, listen, discuss and pray.

After the girls had gone, the young boys arrived. Truly they burst out of the vehicle as coiled up springs of energy, yelling, bouncing, jumping...... it took several

very long walks to wear them out. Four days later, following another beach trip, long tramps over the moors, night walks through bracken, leaping into gorse, a tramp along the granite railway, a serious lesson from Albert in Yarna Woods and the boys were seeing the reality. Being 'part of a system. An Ecosystem!' 'What are we?' 'Boys in an ecosystem with RESPONSIBILITY!!'

We can make it through the wet on a good Dartmoor day!
And onwards to Yarner Woods
— where the wonder of the trees and the complexity of the interwoven life cycles is amazing!

We always finish our visits with 'What did you enjoy the most?' It's so interesting, some enjoy

the challenge of being prickled by a plant they have never seen before. Serena's

cooking usually scores very highly, even though 'mean Julia' tests them all with the, 'no wastage' competition, teasing all to try some nasty green vegetable that would normally be refused, then weighing all scraps for our annual competition and making them add up all the totals. These boys only wasted 180gms....... A few eyes bigger than their tummies! So



they learn to add up as well as life lessons on where and how food is grown and



how we all have a responsibility not to waste the resources we share.

But the tasks are often not merely 'created'. We do genuinely have to move the pregnant sows from their sundrenched field into the barn through a field of sheep and a newly delivered calf.
