The Parish Letter

Something happened on that first Easter Day two thousand years ago. Something that has inspired and motivated millions of people ever since; motivated them to try and behave differently, to make the world a happier, safer and more loving place. These people found a release from their misery and oppression, became determined to make amends for mistakes they had made, and having started to lead a different kind of life, found joy and fulfilment and peace, which spread to those around them. They became Christians, followers of Jesus Christ who was killed on the cross for nothing he did wrong.

What happened? Well, all we really know is that dozens of people encountered Jesus after his death in a mysterious way – they saw him, met him, and then he "vanished from their sight". They had an incredibly personal experience of encounter that transformed them from depressed mourners to joyful followers. Writing as a scientist (which I am), I know that the experiences that people had were unrepeatable and very personal. They had a spiritual experience that somehow inspired them to continue Jesus' work of challenging injustice and improving their own behaviour, trying to live up to Jesus' example. They felt they had been given another chance, something so personal that it couldn't be bottled, any more than you can bottle the feeling of falling in love!

Today I come across many people who say "I can't believe any of that stuff" They try and disprove the event by saying "that can't have happened", but then ignore the result – the result being a whole lot of people living a new life, and that did happen! The disciples were transformed, were empowered, were changed almost beyond recognition, and they couldn't stop telling other people about it. Even when threatened with prosecution and death, they couldn't stop enthusing about what Jesus had done!

In recent years, some of the most powerful and dramatic stories of people coming to a Christian faith are stories of prisoners who are serving long sentences for terrible acts of violence or assault. Some such people find a release and a fresh beginning by acknowledging the hurt they caused their victims, and discovering that they are hurting too, with guilt and shame unable to be hidden any longer. Perhaps a Chaplain lays hands on them and they find an enormous relief and peace in becoming a Christian, becoming determined to make amends and apologise, and often setting out to try and dissuade others from being drawn into the same criminal life.

Baby Group Two has started.


Are you having a baby in the summer? We want to hear from you.






Messy Church April 2021 What is happening this month?



Here are some further stories from people who ordered snowdrops. The first is from Father Jeremy Hellier, who some may remember:


Great to see the article about St Raphael's in the Church Times. I was the Team Rector of the Moorland Team Ministry from 1989-1994. During my time it was well used. Regular worship, a healing group meeting monthly and used for soup lunches during Lent. I also recall taking a wedding there and often playing the harmonium. We left it open 24/7 and travellers occasionally slept there which we considered was all part of its ministry.

A Chaplain from Torbay Hospital rang and described how she was putting together videos, articles, and other resources to use when she visited patients and the house-bound who were unable to enjoy walking or visiting the Devon countryside. She had seen the video on the Diocesan website about St. Raphael's Chapel and the snowdrops and wanted to use it.

We were able to supply other videos and photographs to help her put a package together. It was also a wonderful opportunity to talk about the work that all the staff were doing at the hospital and the tremendous pressures they were under. Even though things are improving at the time of writing – they still need our prayers.







20th Anniversary of another "infection"

The 20th February 2021 marks the 20th anniversary of the national outbreak of Foot & Mouth Disease. The disease which lasted until 30th September 2001 caused havoc throughout the country although ¾ of the cases were confined to just seven counties, including Devon. (Cumbria 893, Devon 173, Dumfries & Galloway 176, North Yorkshire 133, Co Durham 85, Powys Wales 70, and Northumberland 88).

The virus is believed to have originated on a pig farm in Heddon on the Wall in Northumberland. It subsequently spread over two days by the movement of pigs to an abattoir in Essex and by other means to various other parts of the country. The spread to Dartmoor was caused when a sheep dealer bought sheep from an infected area in northern England and sold them to Dunnabridge Farm near Princetown. As part of the regulations to prevent the further spread of the disease, two farms adjacent to the infected premises had stock culled as being "contiguous".

All stock movement was forbidden for the whole of the period of the outbreak, and this caused enormous animal welfare problems, especially when coupled with the *Continued on page 36*

coldest and wettest spring for many years. Disinfection of people and vehicles was ensured by the use of baths of disinfectant at the entry to farms, and this, together with the closure of markets and other livestock venues contributed toward the eventual ending of the outbreak.

During the period of the infection, all access to the Moor was discouraged although cars were permitted to traverse the moor, car parks were blocked off and visitors on foot physically discouraged from entering Dartmoor.

Unlike in our present "lockdown" shops, pubs and hotels were permitted to remain

open, but the lack of visitors had devastating effects on those businesses.

I am proposing to create an archive relating to the foot & mouth outbreak so that future generations can understand the problems experienced within our rural community, and possibly compare them to the disruption caused by COVID 19.

As we all know, spring comes a little later to Dartmoor's singing streams and laughing trees as they warm and bask in the sun for seconds before a dangerous deluge of hail stones pounds the unsuspecting buds. Months ago at the farm, some extremely dedicated volunteers braved battering winds and miserable mizzle to bury over a

thousand bulbs along the banks and drive. The effort was most definitely worth it!



The snow drops are now subsiding, curling back into the earth where their clever little magic continues to ensure life will burst forth again next year.

It has taken a while, but daffodils, with powerful determination follow the snow drops poking out their

leaves, summoning the energy and strength to suddenly burst forth as trumpets of joy, defying the gusts of wind, the pelting of rain, they will stand forth and shout that spring is here......... It is here and they will proclaim it!



As nature wakes up to shake off it's protective slumbers, so the tenacious farmers plan their spring, timing and scheduling dependent on the dancing clouds which race playfully across the sky.

Stripes have appeared in many fields as harrowing breaks up the old knotted grass, encouraging new shoots to break forth. Dung

and manure is being spread as the soil temperature warms, encouraging the microbes to gobble up the fresh nutrients, multiply and turn them into rich feed for the grass.

Dartmoor's high rainfall, leaches chemicals from the soil leaving it highly acidic and difficult for the microbes to thrive. With the application of limestone from the

quarry in Ashburton at a rate of approx. 1-2 metric tonnes per acre, the alkalinity increases, the microbes are encouraged to multiply enhancing their activity and thus the availability of nutrients to the plants which in turn increases the plants productive capacity.

Interestingly the more productive grassland areas consume more carbon from the atmosphere and therefore are significantly better for our current



environment. With modern advanced computerised tractors, loaded with a lime spreader, through a series of electronics, calibration and distribution of lime is very accurate. Compaction on the soil is limited by huge tyres and

within minutes a once highly strenuous and inaccurate task is now completed with minimal input, no damage to the wildlife and in fact an encouragement to carbon capture and biodiversity on the moors.

We have had a massive increase in moles....... in fact one of our fields looks like a "Mole Farm'. No harm – the mounds will be harrowed and this year we will wait to see if there is a natural decline. The moles have to be careful as the whacker plate of the Dracup's very smart fencing machine is due in their field. Chestnut posts harvested from Dorset ensures quality management of woodlands continues, maintaining skills and employment in British rural life....... the alternative would be poles from Scandinavia or China....... we think Dorset is a tad closer!

It's good to know that not all of modernity is bad. So much negativity in our poor little world at the moment. Yet nature will have her way. We just need to listen and respect her. Perhaps a few Easter Egg hunts combined with litter picking will

help. I do hope Parke puts up some signs this year. The BBC noted that there had been no new TV litter campaigns for 17 years – that is at least one generation who have not had 'responsible Countryside behaviour' rammed into them..... time to start again!


