Fast Forward to Easter!

As I write this, I can't believe it is still January! It seems to have been going on for months.

My confession to you is that, in the depths of winter, I want to fast forward to springtime – and the time when all the vulnerable and elderly will be vaccinated; when we can come out of this Lockdown; when children and young people can be in schools and colleges receiving in-person learning; businesses up and running fully, when there will be better weather...and there might even be the prospect of playing some cricket. Let's cut out 'fill-dyke' February altogether! Cancel Lent and go straight on to Easter, resurrection and brighter prospects.

Slightly childish, I know. But that is how I sometimes feel and I suspect I am not alone in these thoughts. But there is another voice telling me not to rush ahead. If I only have my mind full of the future, I will miss out on what is happening now and what God is trying to show me in the present.

I am reminded of those first disciples who recognise the risen Jesus as they share a meal in Emmaus at the end of the day of resurrection. Earlier in the day they are walking on the road away from Jerusalem (Luke 24). After the crucifixion, it is a bewildering time for the disciples as Jesus, the supposed Messiah, has been killed and the Roman soldiers are arresting his followers. They are frightened, confused, hopes crushed but have just heard strange news that Jesus has been seen again. Unsure what to do, they are walking to the village of Emmaus. They are joined on the road by a stranger (It is Jesus but they do not recognise him) who, after listening to them and hearing their bewilderment at recent events and news, unfolds in scripture all that is said about the Messiah – and that there will be suffering prior to his resurrection and Kingdom being established.

Without the journey to Emmaus, the disciples would not have heard Jesus' teaching and understood God's plan for his creation. Without experiencing this period of deep winter, maybe I will not fully appreciate the spring. Without this Lockdown, maybe I will not have understood more fully the joy and value of simple acts of kindness and notes of encouragement sent to one another (something I will hopefully remember after Easter) and the deep joy that friendship, community and family relationships can *Continued on page 5*

We also had a Zoom on Thursday 21st at 5pm when we shared stories, sang along to some songs, and laughed as we tried the "The How Easy Test" which involved blindfolds gloves and sweets. Confusion and muddle!!

The story in January was Samson our very own Messy Hero who made loads of mistakes, but God still used him to free his people from a bullying and oppressive government that was ruling over his tribe.

Samson a Messy Hero.

He was a miracle child and much loved by his parents. He was sent by God and his parents promised his life would be dedicated to God and he became a Nazarite (in our language a Monk who lives out in the world). He was to follow a special diet, not touch dead flesh and never cut his hair. His story is full of mistakes... breaking his promises, not doing what his parents told him to do, choosing bad friends, acting on impulse, revenge, and being proud of his God-given talent of being strong. All these actions led to him being in prison, blind and alone. He then called on God and said he was sorry. That was when God used him.

Snowdrops of hope

Many know of the reputation of St. Raphael's for snowdrops. Snowdrops have long been the messengers of hope and the seasons; the darkest moments of winter passing and with life in the roots beneath the earth signalling that spring is imminent.

One of the most popularly documented stories surrounding the origins of snowdrops is a Christian creation tale. It tells of the moments following Adam and Eves exile from the Garden of Eden where, hopeless and dejected, they shiver as the snows swirl around them. An angel descends to relate to them that that Eden is no longer their privilege. Frightened and apprehensive Adam and Eve take each others hand and wander towards unfamiliar and cruel lands.

The angel feels deep sorrow so reaches out a hand where the soft snowflakes land in perfect twinkling crystals. He brings the snowflakes to his face and breathes upon them, transforming them into soft, pearly flowers. The first snowdrops! "Take these flowers", he said; "take them as sign of hope."


Whether you believe the many superstitions that surround the snowdrop or not, you cannot deny that they are messengers of hope - for the seasons and our future.



The History of the Air crashes on Hamel Down during the Second World War

During our research into the tragic loss of a number or our Airplanes which crashed on Hamel Down during the 2nd World War, we have uncovered some fascinating data which are of interest to us.

This story is about the B24 Liberator bombers and the heroic 36th Squadron of the USAAF. The planes were used for the dangerous mission of getting supplies to our agents in occupied France and as a result the planes were painted completely black. It took 500lbs of black paint to cover each plane.

• The operation was called "Carpetbagger" and the USAAF encouraged the crew to name their planes. Some of the names used by the 36th Squadron were as follows: *Heavens Above, Vagabond King, Old Blister Butt, Fightin Sam, The flying Box Car, Chattanooga Choochoo. Memphis Belle, Blonds Away, Strawberry Bitch, Uninvited, Ruthless Ruthie, Shady Lady.*

• The B24 which crashed on Hamel down on 26th December 1943, on a final training flight, prior to participating in operations from January 1944 onwards was named "Slightly Dangerous"

• The crew of our B24 were training for an operation which was deemed to begin in January 1944 but, on a final training flight on 26th December 1943 in bad weather, she crashed on Hamel Down with the loss of all 8 crew members.



"The man who never was?"

In conversation over Christmas lunch with my family, my son-in-law shared three photographs with me of submarines. He had found the "photos" in a charity shop and thought that they might be of interest.



HMS Seraph


HMS Seraph crew with "Jolly Roger" 1943

The first photograph was of HMS Seraph which was taken on 25th December 1943 when she had just returned to Portsmouth after 10 months patrolling the Mediterranean. The "Jolly Roger" flag was flown by the crew to commemorate a successful deployment.

My research showed that in April 1943 HMS Seraph had been in the UK for a refit but was now making her way back to the Mediterranean to recommence her war patrol. She was ordered to participate in the top secret "Operation Mincemeat". The operation was a plan to mislead German intelligence regarding the date and location of the proposed allied invasion of southern Europe from North Africa. The plan was masterminded in London by Naval Intelligence officers, including lan Fleming (Author of James Bond books). The origins of the plan are believed to have been based on a novel written in 1909 by the Governor of Dartmoor Prison.

The plan involved slipping a dead body over the side of the submarine off the Spanish coast close enough for the body to be found and brought to the attention of the German authorities. The body had been provided with false information about the forth coming invasion plans in an elaborate subterfuge.



The plan was a complete success and when in July 1943 our forces landed on Sicily they were opposed by comparatively light defences.

In 1954 a book giving a full account of the whole operation was written by Ewen Montague one of the two men who had planned the whole operation. The book was entitled "The man who never was" two years later it was made into a film staring Clifford Webb and Gloria Grahame.



In 2021 a new version of the story has been filmed entitled "Operation Mincemeat" and stars Colin Firth and Matthew Macfadyen. Several scenes from the new film were filmed in Devon.

Footnote:

The "Jolly Roger" flag which was shown in the 1943 picture (detailed above) was retained by a crew member as a souvenir and was eventually sold in November 2013 at auction for £14,000.

News from the East Shallowford Trust

As I type the weather is truly foul. Proper glyb, as they might say in Cornwall! You have to be a person of faith to live on the moors. Faith that the mizzle will not actually enter your bones, faith that the heaving soaked walls will stay up, faith that the chickens hunkering down to avoid the draughts will survive their own lockdown and faith that the sun will eventually poke it's way through the clouds to smile benevolently once again on us sodden landed creatures.

We have relied heavily on faith at Shallowford. Having agreed to convert the wonderful old barn that could be anything from two to four hundred years old, it was only slightly disappointing when the builders dug out the inside to underpin and level the floor. We eagerly sifted through the soil that was carefully extracted by Hicky chugging with his digger. Would there be some curious bones, treasure that someone had lost or hidden? Carefully Hicky dug. Carefully and diligently we poked, toed and prodded the soil. Nothing...... not a dropped penny or an old chicken bone! Those ancient moorlanders were clearly keen to keep their assets!

She is a beauty though. I feel very sad that there is no record of the fantastic stone mason(s) who built that barn. Yes, one section has fallen down and was replaced by some very ugly cement blocks probably when cement blocks were a new invention.



But the walls remain upright, now green with that clinging, fighting life of Dartmoor lichen and strange algae and fungus that pervades every crack. The stone walls of the old barn are solid, beautiful and tell of a craft and skill, of muscles that must have ached with effort. Of hands that must have been tougher than pig leather with lime *Continued on page 47*

morter that nestles and safely binds those thoughtfully placed rocks. Big rocks all the way up. As the current builders say, 'Don't know how the hell they got those big stones all the way up there?' Truly, the skill that was needed to create the hight and breadth of the barn is something to be admired.

What would those men (for the surely could not have been women?) have said if they knew that their animal and hay barn was now to be used for children from cities, who don't know the difference between hay and straw or that milk genuinely comes from a cow? The lift for people with mobility difficulties might have amused them, or the diamond cutter that has made in one hour a perfect circular hole for an extractor fan for the kitchen. That was a bit sad – making a hole in the wall, but it can be filled again should the barn ever take on another reincarnation.

It's warm inside – so warm, that it's rather tempting to just hunker down and watch the wind rattling through the stark dank grass outside. Lovely new windows providing that barrier between the harsh outside and the manmade warmth of a controlled temperature.

The builders think they may be finished in six weeks. We have given them a few extra jobs. The two cobbled rooms at the south end of the barn will now be converted carefully into a downstairs disabled toilet, a washroom and the room next door will become the dining room.





The cobbled floor has been carefully retained, the walls in some places will be white washed and the heating – well...... We have had to compromise at the end of the barn. Some ugly wall heaters, but at least the rooms can be warmed!

We need to be ready for opening in May! My main job now is to fund raise. We need £41,000 to buy bunk beds, a sofa, the remaining kitchen fittings, sheets, towels, plates, pay for the toilet and new sinks that were not in the original tender and of course some washing machines, dryers..... and so the list goes on. Can we do it all in time? The builders are securing the last of the items to ensure the one bathroom will pass all the certifications for the 'Doc M Pack' – meaning the grab rails and wall seats needed to enable wheelchair user access. We will have to buy some special mats for the wheelchairs to pass over the cobbles, but it's possible. Modern ingenuity meets ancient moorland. We will find a way!.

In the meantime, three saddlebacks have farrowed in one week, all snuggly and warm and we have to keep planning. We need to recruit some new team members. Please if you know anyone who might be interested, send them our way as we need to have people trained and ready for the groups to return. We just hope that the primary school children from Plymouth can come in June. They are such fun and seeing their faces light up with all the animals, becoming



connoisseurs of the different smells and learning to deal diligently with the muck by day two – leaving it outside our wonderful newly refurbished barn of course!! Nearly there!! Can we win the race to be ready in time? Just funding now...... faith and prayers needed!!
