### Happy New Year!

Having enjoyed the photos for a year, I am loathe to throw the old calendar out, but generally it ends up in the recycling bin. This annual ritual is like renouncing the Old Year – phew, I'm glad to get rid of 2020, let's replace it with 2021.

This New Year there's perhaps more depth to wanting to get rid of 2020, and to look forward to a brand-new year for things to come right in. 

### St Raphael's as a place of sanctuary

The concept of sanctuary predates Christianity, going back at least as far as Greek and Roman temples that offered protection to fugitives. In medieval Europe, you could escape the death penalty by claiming sanctuary in a church.

So, passing St. Raphael's just before Christmas, I could see smoke coming from the chimney. Although the Chapel has been open for many months, the stove had not been lit since the first lockdown. Investigation was required!

Outside the Chapel porch various camping paraphernalia were strewn on the bench and a dog was lying down asleep while the owner was attempting to get a mobile phone signal. He immediately apologised and asked if it was OK for two others to be inside St. Raphael's. On the way in he again apologised this time for the mess inside. On entering many bags, sacks, poles etc. were indeed scattered around the stove and pews. Apparently, two wild campers had spent the night inside.


The first words uttered inside by my 'host' were "I'm proud to be a Christian". To be honest I was a little taken aback. Not many people open a conversation with those words. He explained that while he didn't know the two campers, he had seen them the previous cold and wet night. He had some kindling with him so lit the Church stove to keep them warm. (His dog had his own rug next to the fire – so must have kept warm too!)

He said he would get them to 'tidy up' before they left, and he really appreciated a Church being open to offer refuge and shelter. As he referred to it as a 'place of safety', I could only speculate a former profession.

Next day I returned to find the pilgrim, (as I had now named him), packing up his belongings. He had remained a further night, relit the fire and the other men had left. The stove was clean, ashes gone, and carpets brushed with Annie's broom from the porch.

When I thanked him and told him why I was there – to erect the Christmas tree ready for the virtual Carol service - he volunteered to stay and assist.

A heart-warming, spiritual end to a somewhat difficult year.





# Christingle at Widecombe Primary School

### The Children's Society

The Children's Society introduced Christingle services to the Church of England just over 50 years ago. Christingle celebrations raise over £1.2million each year to help support the work of The Children's Society which helps vulnerable children and young people.

As there could be no Christingle service in Widecombe this year due to Covid restrictions, St Pancras Church put together a Make at Home Christingle Kit, for each child in the school.

This enabled the children of Widecombe Primary to be a part of the celebrations with a national Christingle Service which was streamed on the Church of England website on Sunday 13 December.



The kits contained all the pieces to make a Christingle along with an explanation of how each element has a special meaning, from both a Christian and a non-Christian perspective.



The orange represents the world that God created.

The red ribbon reminds us of God's love for the world and the blood Jesus shed on the cross.

The four cocktail sticks covered in dried fruit and sweets are symbols of God's creaations. For many people, they also represent the four seasons.

The lit candle symbolises Jesus, the light of the world, who brings hope to people living in darkness

Liberator B 24 Bomber

**Bristol Beaufighter** 

The 27th December 2020 marks the 77th anniversary of the crash of a Liberator Bomber (BD-24D – 40474) on Hamel Down Widecombe in the Moor, during World War 2. The all-American crew of 8 were killed.

This crash was the fourth and final accident to occur on Hamel Down during the war in which a total of 14 servicemen lost their lives in the four crashes.

The losses were spread over three years commencing with the loss of a Hampden Bomber, returning from a bombing raid in France, in March 1941 when all four-crew perished. This crash has been extensively researched by history group member John Lowe and the full details can be read in his book "The Boys".

A second tragedy occurred in September 1941 when a Bristol Beaufighter of 307 (Polish) squadron, flying out of Exeter, crashed whilst on a training flight with the loss of both crews.

Again, in 1942 a Supermarine Spitfire from 53 Operational Training Unit, crashed whilst on a training flight from Wales. Fortunately, the pilot bailed out and was uninjured.

Finally, in December 1943 came the crash involving the B-24 bomber which tragically occurred during a low-level night training flight from RAF Alconbury in Huntingdonshire which crashed into Hamel Down at Two Barrows.

The History Group proposes to record the stories behind these accidents involving the Polish flyers and the American crew, by preparing web pages to add to the existing commemoration of men from Widecombe and District who fought and lost their lives in the second World War.



#### Life in war-torn Devon performed

Devon's War Girls, a short, two-hander performance pulls inspiration from true local stories explored through the eyes of two young women and the wartime events that bring them together.

Molly's plans to go to university are shattered, and instead of starting University she finds herself signing up as a Land Girl and boarding a train to Devon. Already there, a farmer's daughter, Enid, is thrust into new experiences when Dartmoor is flooded by evacuees, soldiers, prisoners of war and, of course, the Land Girls. This fast-paced performance by two professional actresses has seen audiences moved to both tears and laughter, and can be booked for events, schools or community groups to bring alive stories from the past in your venue.

Meanwhile, MED Theatre's Wild Nights Young Company have created their own original play based on research into life on Dartmoor during World War Two. The Hardings deals with the changing roles of men and women occasioned by the wartime emergency and shares the story of one family, their altered relationships and the new people brought into their lives by the war. Many volunteers continued to visit, helping to construct the Ark, clear, sort and maintain the grounds and our wonderful builders who have worked tirelessly and thoughtfully to turn the huge lovely old stone barn into something for future generations. The magnificent granite walls would slowly have collapsed, no longer being suitable for modern machinery and our keen understanding that for animals to thrive, they need good ventilation and drainage.

Will has been dashing backwards and forwards in his sturdy wellies from Broadaford, keeping a steady eye to ensure that all building decisions are made thoughtfully and within time. His skills abound as logistician, networker, interpreter of plans to logical forward thinking. We have asked and asked people questions. Locals, visitors, those who know us well, those who know only of the idea, old trustees, new trustees, children of all ages and adults near and far. Where should we go, what should we do and be? The conclusion? Not much has changed over the years. If anything, I fear Miss Braund and Rosemary's inspiration is now MORE urgent than ever before. Is it true, do we genuinely have MORE young people with allergies and mental health issues than ever before, or is it simply that we now recognise and categorise illness and behaviour more accurately? Personally, I have an innate dislike for pollution and plastic which many researchers believe are the main instigators of modern disorders – or rather, the increasing number of disorders per capita of the total population. 2020 has not helped society globally to develop ways to avoid screen time and behave as 'real' humans in outdoor space, interacting with the real natural world and the humans and animals on which we depend. Remembering to be kind, thoughtful and tolerant as we become more frustrated with our constricted and to be honest, very privileged lives. We play a 'game' at the farm......
