The Parish Letter

The Beautiful Game

Football is a universal language: a way to make conversation and friends in foreign countries and cultures. I once spent 3 hours fishing in a dhow with a Kenyan. He spoke Swahili; I spoke English. He was Muslim; I was Christian. But we communicated well because he had a passion for Arsenal and I am a Chelsea fan.

Next month, England will play in the Euro 2021 Championship. Whisper it quietly but we may have a chance of going all the way to the final!

Ever since Mexico 1970 I have had a traumatic relationship with the England team. Aged eight, my father allowed me and my brother Tom, to watch the first half of the Quarter- Final of England v Germany – a big treat. We went to bed at half time exuberant. England were 2-0 up. I was proud that my hero, the Chelsea goalkeeper Peter Bonetti, was playing his part by keeping a clean sheet while Gordon Banks, England's first choice goalie, was out through food poisoning.

During the second half we were supposed to be sleeping but, of course, could not. It was a warm night and my brother and I were far too excited. My bed became the goal and I was goalie (Peter Bonetti, of course – I had even changed into my Chelsea strip) but I failed to save a shot by my brother and the ball (rolled up socks) knocked a mug on the floor making a loud noise. This, and Tom shouting: 'Goal!', led to the sound of heavy footsteps on the stairs. My father really had had enough now. We were for it. We scampered into bed to await our punishment. But it wasn't what we expected. No. My Dad opened the door, stood in the room at the foot of our beds and said: 'England have lost 3-2 to Germany.' He then left quietly and shut the door.

We were quiet then. I may even have cried myself to sleep. It was only over the next few days that I began to understand how it all went wrong for England: that the manager had substituted Bobby Charlton at half time to save his energy for the semi-final, the Germans found an extra gear and Peter Bonetti, my hero, was at fault for one of the goals. In fact, Peter became the scapegoat for that defeat.

I'm not sure I have quite recovered from the trauma of that defeat in the summer of 1970. Some would argue the England national team never has. Peter Bonetti hardly did either. He retired early from football as people never let him forget his lapse on

that fateful day in Mexico. Oddly enough, I met him on a pilgrimage to lona, the day after the 1982 World Cup. Seeking permission to fish a loch for trout (yes, you can pray while you are fishing...), I was sent to a cottage at the end of Mull and there he was opening the door to me. Peter was working as the Postman for the isle of Mull and glad to let me fish. I never asked him about that day in Mexico... and was too awestruck to ask for his autograph but I had a great day's fishing – and enough trout for a fish pie to feed all the pilgrims back on lona that evening.

This summer, teams will gather from across the continent to play in Euro 2021. Different languages, nations and cultures yet all are united in a love for the beautiful game. Each fan hoping that their team will play above itself and be much more than the sum of its individual skilful parts. And, I too, will be dreaming that a team of eleven players will for once play without fear of failure.

I am reminded that at Pentecost - which we celebrate on 23rd May - people from all nations, different backgrounds and languages gather together in Jerusalem for the Harvest Festival. As the Spirit comes down on the eleven disciples, they are emboldened as witnesses. And I think of that other Peter who, saved by Jesus for a second time, came through the trauma of failure and defeat. Preaching powerfully of God's winning ways, everyone heard and understood Peter's message of rescue for all in their own language.

Now what about England's chances of winning the Euros..?

Why Prayer trees?

Last year, Archbishop Justin Welby explored different ways of praying. From asking for things and giving thanks, to expressing deep sadness and anger, and saying sorry. In an open letter this year, both Archbishops Justin and Stephen Cottrell invited everyone across England – whether they have faith or not – to pause, reflect on the "enormity of this Covid pandemic" and to pray. So why prayer trees?

National research has revealed that if visitors to any church – whether simply entering the building out of curiosity to look at the architecture or to seek out the history of the building, become 'actively engaged', for example, by lighting a candle or writing a prayer, somewhat remarkably more than 60% will return to that church building.




Last year we created a home-made prayer tree for St. Raphael's with paper luggage labels and the results have been astonishing. More than 170 individual, and often very heartfelt prayers, have been left.

Prayers range from seeking God's healing for someone; thanksgiving; for strength to face a particular challenge; for the safety of loved ones and in memory of people who have died. Each one of these is special and will be answered in some way. Whilst God doesn't always answer prayers in the way we might want or expect, as Christians we believe that





Foot & Mouth Epidemic Part Two

Following on from my article in last months 'Parish Link' I have been able to obtain several 'thoughts and remembrances of the epidemic' of twenty years ago from readers.

Among the pieces I have collected is a small book entitled: "Poems for Dartmoor Spring 2001".

The poems were written in April 2001 by pupils in years 5 & 6 (Upper Dart) of Widecombe school. In addition to the poems the book contained illustrations made from handmade prints created by the same pupils. Joanna Radford added wood engravings.

The children who attended the leavers service at St Pancras Church on July 20th, 2001 were each presented with a "limited edition" of the book.

I am reproducing two of the poems from the book, purposely I have chosen the less emotive verses as some of the other material may incur uncomfortable memories for those who suffered during the epidemic.

Missed Anniversary

A special anniversary occurred in 2020, but it may have passed relatively unnoticed by many Widecombe residents. It was 100 years ago that the National War Savings Committee presented the village with the 15" naval shell which stands in front of the Curch House. The shell was presented in recognition of the efforts to collect Sphagnum Moss which was used in field dressings for wounded troops during the First World War.

The War Savings Committee offered many items of 'war surplus' where it considered residents had made a significant 'contribution' to the war effort. A total of 264 tanks were presented to various towns and cities throughout the UK. Many communities however declined the offers. In Devon certainly Exeter and Newton Abbot declined but Torquay accepted, and the 'female' tank was placed on Daddy Hole Plain.

- British 'Tanks' were so named during their secret development to mislead enemy spies into thinking what was being developed were devices for 'storage of water on the battlefield'
- Female Mk IV Tanks were equipped solely with machine guns whereas the Male tank had a forward-facing canon.



Again these fluffy, ungainly beasts would not be there if the eight incredible volunteers had not offered to assist in the process of preparing the 110 fat squawkers all exceeding 2.5kg which are now available for purchase 'over the farm gate' at a price of £8.00-£10.00.

The main purpose of us keeping these chickens however, is not merely to feed our visitors or gain some cash to provide pennies to buy paint, but for educational purposes. Much to my total surprise, our first visiting group of the year was a bunch of girls from London, who embarked upon a week of


