

The Parish Letter

When I was in South Dartmoor College last week (as one of the Chaplains), I turned to the relevant place in the appointment diary, and realised that I was almost on the last page – the end of the year was arriving, hence the new year was just around the corner! Not the big celebration of New Year's Day in January, but New Year's Day on the 1st of August, the end of one academic year and the beginning of the next.

Although when I was at school I always looked forward to the summer holidays, I never looked forward to the new school year - it was too scary! Some of the students I met in South Dartmoor were like me, really worried about the changes that the new year would hold – different tutor, different year-groups, friends moving away, and so on; for them, change was very unsettling. Others weren't so bothered and were looking forward to the new year; for them, change was stimulating.

Whether they like it or not, children can't avoid change. The years and the birthday parties pass, height and hormones change, they become adults, and along the way one hopes that they have learnt some positive strategies for dealing with change, developing appropriate skills. Change is always with us – we can't stop time; we all grow older, and we have to make adjustments, to change, to adapt.

And nowadays it seems that the pace of change is accelerating faster than ever. So many unsettling issues that we are having to adjust to, such as:

- Covid, and the disruption caused by the pandemic.
- Climate change not just the hottest day ever, but all the adjustments needed to move away from an oil-based economy.
- Ukraine and all the human misery pouring out of it.
- Soaring inflation and the enormous cost of living rises.
- I'm sure you can add more to this list.

Many are finding such rapid changes are leading to stress, to sleepless nights, to high anxiety and sometimes even to despair.

Is it reassuring to know that this isn't new? Change is an age-old problem. Jesus and his friends lived in a country that had changed dramatically when it was invaded by the Romans, and which would have its chief city, Jerusalem, razed to the ground twenty years later. Some people were starving, begging for food, public health provision was non-existent, injustices and poverty were rife

Jesus was appalled by what he saw and set about bringing the message of God's love to

these people. He helped the sufferers by caring for them and teaching others to care for them, and he helped the perpetrators of injustice by showing them how to change their ways – with God's forgiveness and a fresh start.

Jesus deeply cared for all people, setting the example of selfless giving, persuading people to focus less on themselves, and more on others – their neighbours. In effect, teaching resilience. And when he found times hard, he went to a quiet place to pray, often walking into the desert or up a hill to get away from it all. He went out somewhere to re-connect with God (his Father) and, I guess, he let his anxieties fade back into the background as he gained perspective – he was not alone.

Many people are now also seeking stillness and quiet to help them through anxious and unsettled times, whether by walking up onto the Moor, or sitting quietly in one of our churches, or peacefully at home, or attending one of our quiet services – say a Celtic Reflective Service or the Maranatha Prayer Group (in Ashburton), or the Quiet Reflection in Postbridge.

As planned, the last service in St. Mary's was held on 12th June. Prior to the contractors taking over the church on 20th June, members of the PCC moved as much furniture and as many small items as we were able, to clear the space. The organ had to be covered by specialists before the rood screen, pews and other fixtures and fittings were swathed in plastic to protect them from dust, paint, and plaster. It took a couple of days to erect the scaffolding inside the building and it makes an impressive sight.

By the end of the first week, the 50-year-old wiring had been stripped out – much of it had been damaged by a succession of squirrels and other rodents. The radiators were taken off the walls and in consultation with the Church Architect, the paint colour for the walls was selected. (My choice of lilac was rejected unfortunately!)

During July, the conservators began work on exposing the wall paintings as far as is possible and making the reredos, (the carvings behind the altar), safe and secure. No more calico curtains covering up the damage to the plaster around the altar! The work is being carefully project-managed and at the time of writing, no major issues have been identified.

On 10th July we held a service of Holy Communion at Dodbrooke farm, and at the end of July, we were hosted by the Church House Inn where an informal morning service was held. More on this next month. The Friday Prayer Group is meeting in different homes, and we continue to pray for individuals, national and international issues. Please tell me, Judy Henderson, Ann Rowland or Rebecca Scott if you would like us to pray for you or anyone you know.

The Dickin Medal (Animal VC)



The PDSA Dickin Medal (obverse)

In the June issue of the Parish Link I told the story of 'Mary of Exeter', a pigeon who served with great bravery during the Second World War carrying important intelligence messages from France to Britain. Mary was awarded the '**Dickin Medal**' in recognition of her actions. Set out below is the history of the medal.

Mary Dickin, the founder of the PDSA (Peoples Dispensary for Sick Animals), introduced a medal to recognise outstanding acts of gallantry and devotion to duty displayed by animals serving with the Armed Forces

or Civil Defence units in any theatre of war throughout the world. The medal was introduced in December 1943 and quickly became designated the **Animal Victoria Cross**.

The medal has been awarded 74 times (to date), the recipients number: 36 dogs,

32 pigeons 5 horses and 1 cat. The decision was made in 2014 to create an 'Honorary Dickin Medal' to recognise the service of all animals during World War 1. The chosen recipient was Warrior the mount of General Jack Seeley of the Canadian Cavalry.

The very latest animal to be awarded a Dickin Medal is a 10 year old German Shorthaired Pointer, a retired RAF police dog named Hertz. He was awarded his medal on 22nd February 2022 for services in Afghanistan in 2013

News from the East Shallowford Trust



'Please miss, what's this?' says a lad with a mop of curly hair and a watering can in one hand. 'Grab it at the base of the leaves and pull.' I replied. It's the classic question and I'm sorry I didn't think to yank out the camera on my phone to record his face when he easily wiggled it out of the dark, warm soil and grinned from ear to ear. 'Carrot!'

For those of you who have not seen our huge new vegetable patch, it is definitely a work in progress. Some amazing volunteers worked from February measuring, sawing, drilling and carefully constructing the raised beds, whilst Will levelled the ground and a dumper truck was hired to move soil to and fro. The result is a pristine vegetable plot, topped with wood chip and beds filled with a combination of rotted pig manure and dark, rich municipal compost. It will take a lot of work of course to keep the weeds out, but for the moment, it is bursting with lush green life and serving it's purpose

of providing delicate pickings for lunch and massive learning for those children who have no idea where the food entering their bodies originates.

'Do you think a crisp is real food?' I ask at one meal time during the week? 'Yes' they all reply. 'Put up your hand if you eat crisps once per week. Twice per week, more than three times per week?' Hands cheerfully remain up. 'How many of you eat Maoam sweets every week? Every day?' Hands firmly in the air. Smiles now becoming slightly nervous. 'Did you think these things you buy are real food? In fact they were only invented by capitalists to make money. Not to feed you or provide you with nutrition. Your natural desire for something sweet, which the body assumes is high energy, is making someone rich whilst your teeth rot and you become vulnerable to diabetes.' I can be a bit blunt sometimes....... but hey ho....... someone has to tell the truth!

source of sweet?' One smart girl shouts out, 'Berries' - 'Yes! One point for the girls!' One small boy, not sure if he is joking or not says, 'A sweet shop with

Maoams.' Everyone groans! 'Really? 5,000 years ago? Try again.' I say and then, after several mutterings and murmurs I hear one person say, 'Honey'. 'Yes' I look fervently around the room to find who has uttered the magic response. 'Has anyone seen our bees?' Nope! Despite walking past the hives a few times, no one has noticed but that's OK. There is a lot to absorb in the busy week and it's a tough call to discuss and point out everything.

This particular group were specifically selected as potentially able to grow and learn from a visit coming from a very rough and difficult area within Bristol. Ellie had them out on a field with a quadrat, squinting through the grass to find different types of plants, insects, learning to really look at what is around them, to understand the importance of one bug compared to another. One child came back with a bright black and yellow striped bug to show us in a jar before releasing it, saying 'look miss, this is a wasp beetle' reminding me of the wonderful Shakespeare line, 'What's in a name? That which we call a rose would by any other

name would smell as sweet.' It is a weird phenomena though. Humans need to give things names. It kept the Victorians going for their entire age, as if a name suddenly validates somethings existence. Without a name, ergo, does not exist? Anyway, the children, like all humans are happy with the name once given, or found on one of the charts Ellie hands out.

Our aim? To give value, importance and understanding to the land on which we exist. 'We abuse land because we regard it as a commodity belonging to us. When we see land as a community to which we belong, we may begin to use it with love and respect', Aldo Leopold. Continued on page 37

It was a week of heat of course. We asked the children if they would like to eat outside, to which they replied with a resounding 'Yes please', but we needed shade. Hence all the tables were carefully carried outside into the newly constructed Corner Barn, where a gentle breeze cooled the air and made a wonderful space for the next day's bread making with Alethe and Helen from Ashburton. The children love breadmaking. More to the point, it provides lunch,

combined with the lettuce they have picked from the garden, carrots, beetroot and herbs which are sniffed carefully before munching. We bought some ginger mint on our trip to the Eden Project, which is now flourishing and providing a surprising tang to a salad mix. Another group who have had ZERO waste, yet have tasted a little of everything. Most say 'Yuk' to courgette, but when they pick it themselves, there is a 99% chance they will try one piece. Some even come back for more!

The best challenge we had all week was sheep work. Not little sheep work, but a major 'confront fears of animals, use skill, strength, perseverance and see if John D, Will and David could keep up'. Well, in the end, of course, the farmers won, mainly because they can keep going when children get hot, tired and simply lack practice of pushing through the pain barrier. However, the girls definitely won when it came to handling, holding and manoeuvring the lambs. We were curious as to why. The boys simply seemed to be fearful – the girls just jumped in and got on with job. Is it a nurturing thing, a fear of looking silly thing? Two boys were genuinely



fearful and had to be helped to grab and hold a lamb. It was just interesting to watch. Definitely, however, the girls won!

Successful Launch of Road Safety Initiative on the B3212

Friday 24th June 2022 saw a number of key stakeholders attend the launch of the initiative funded by Vizion Zero South West. The aim is to reduce the number of road traffic incidents and animal deaths on the B3212 Princetown to Dousland road. A grant, awarded to Dartmoor Forest Parish Council, of just over £6,300 has been used to supply over 200 reflective neck bands to farmers grazing ponies and cattle on the stretch of road, a new Vehicle Activated Speed sign has been placed on the road below Leedon Tor and improved signage, warning drivers to reduce their speed and give way to animals on the road, will be placed at both ends of the road in the coming months. If these measures prove successful the Council plan to apply for additional funding later in the year to expand the initiative to other roads within the parish.
