The Parish Letter

Well, it really has been guite a year, hasn't it! Back in January the mood was guite buoyant as we finally seemed to be coming out of the Covid pandemic, but soon we were to be faced with another crisis as Russian forces invaded Ukraine when Putin announced his so called "Special Military Operation". Ukrainian flags were seen across the country and an overwhelming operation for support of Ukrainians was mobilised. Little did we realise at that stage the devastation this would cause: the indiscriminate killing and torture, the destruction of communities and homes and infrastructure, the mass movement of people to other nations. And in addition to that there has been the huge impact of the war on fuel and food supply with the consequent increase in prices. Later in the year we witnessed the worsening impact of climate change with flooding in Pakistan, drought in Somalia and Ethiopia, and wild fires in Europe, Australia and the USA. Back in our nation, as we were sweltering in the heat, the political temperature rose sharply with the resignation of one Prime Minister... and then another; I think we are on our third but I might have lost count! In the midst of this came the sudden death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and as a nation we mourned and paid our respects to this remarkable lady. And now as we face the winter we know it will be very a difficult one for many people who will be struggling to keep their homes warm and put food on the table. One may describe it as an 'annus horribilis'.

In the face of all this we may well ask 'Why doesn't God do something?'. Why doesn't God stop the war? Why doesn't God stop the flooding and droughts and fires? Why doesn't God give us leaders (like Her Late Majesty) whose ways are ways of truth and justice? The answer is that God has done something! God is not a distant or remote god who doesn't care about the world, rather God is loving and good to all he has made. We know this because in Jesus Christ, God became human full of grace and truth. The creator steps into creation; the creator becomes a creature – that is the wonder of Christmas. But in stepping into creation God, in his sovereignty, has chosen to limit his power. He doesn't force us to change, he doesn't stop people fighting or polluting or lying, rather he invites us to receive him and to allow him to transform our hearts and minds and actions. As we read in the beginning of John's gospel: 'To all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God – children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision... but born of God.' That is the real wonder of Christmas: God became a child so that we can become his children. All he asks of us is that we receive this priceless gift.

A very Joyful and Peaceful Christmas to you all.



Perhaps just simply enjoying being together to think about the real meaning of Christmas? (Of course with Annie's famous mince pies – and Tesco's famous mulled wine!)

Friday 23rd December at 6.30pm. What better way to start the Christmas weekend?

Sadness and hope

Most, if not all of us, have had the sad personal experience of dementia – our parents, husbands, wives, partners, brothers, sisters and friends may have had or may now have this debilitating disease. What then is the Christmas message of hope for those with a dementia?

There is an inspiring a message of hope at Christmas. God's gift of life, to help us persevere through adversity. While there is no 'cure' for a dementia the sooner the diagnosis, the more support is available and the more positive hope for the future.

There is a significant difference between 'normal' ageing and the memory loss you get with a dementia. The following are simple examples of symptoms that may illustrate the difference:

Age, (mild cognitive impairment)?	A dementia?
Misplacing things or forgetting why you went upstairs!	Putting objects in 'strange' places. (house keys in the fridge?)
Needing to concentrate harder to keep up with conversations.	Regularly struggling to take part in conversations or find the right words, calling objects 'that thing'.
Forgetting people's names.	Failing to recognise close family.
Mildly irritated when routines are disrupted.	Becoming upset, anxious, or frightened because things aren't familiar.
Sometimes confused about what day of the week it is.	Losing track of the season or passage of time.

So this Christmas, let us remind ourselves that we can all be a little annoyed when our normal routines are disrupted. Christmas is such a time. Those with a dementia may be upset, anxious or frightened – even in their own homes. Whoever the person with a dementia, a loved one or close friend, remember they are the same person you have always loved. Hope is found in what God has given us in the birth of Jesus.

We have suffered our first serious accident in the last three years. A freak accident, that could happen to any of us, but happened to the sweetest and loveliest of young girls.

The group was playing hide and seek down at Spitchwick, running along beside the river, out onto the open flat field, running between the trees. Through the woods, one child ahead of another held onto the branch and then ... thwack it sprang back into the face of her friend chasing her. It could have hit her forehead, her nose. But no, it whacked straight into her eye. At speed we took her off to Torbay Hospital expecting a quick check-up and return home in a couple of hours. Surely nothing more than a superficial scratch that would heal itself.

Once in A&E we held hands and tried to giggle at things we were watching, but mostly we just waited. The emergency nurse called us having prioritised her as a young girl with an eye problem. We were given some eye drops which I could use as needed whilst we sat patiently. We waited maybe an hour and a half before we were called into the examination area. He peered into her eye with a torch, gave us some eye ointment and was about to discharge us when he performed one last test, asking her to cover the good eye and read the eye chart on the wall. She could not read a letter. With her good eye she read at speed. With the bad eye she could see his hand wave in front of her face, but no figures, no definition, certainly no letters on a chart. A specialist was called. We waited. Another specialist was called and their top eye surgeon who happened to be at the hospital consulted with Bristol and then with Moorfields eye hospital in London. Tiredness seeped into her as we waited for answers and, eventually, she fell asleep on the bed. Then the verdict came- we would need to stay the night. I called back to the farm. The nurse and I woke her to be placed in the 'Big Doughnut' (MRI machine) for a thorough scan. To do this an operation was needed in the morning. She was quiet, we'd had the tears. She was missing the fun, her friends, missing the farm. We were moved to a room and the nurses made a bed for her weary head and a pull-out one for me. We slept, drugged by fatigue. She was stoical, understanding that a patch would have to be worn for

a while, that there might be a second surgery, that an instant solution would not be found. Morning came quickly, a canula was inserted, a gentle hug and she was gone. I went in search of tea and a series of phone calls to explain as best I could what was happening. I spoke with her Mum, who could not get to the hospital. Relatives had been marshalled, but distance and time was an issue. We asked everyone to be patient.

The MRI completed, nurses kindly pushed her back to the ward and I received a great big hug. No smiles, but a quick recovery from the anaesthetic and a wish to talk to Mum and friends. More of the waiting, waiting and waiting... 'Britain's Got Talent' became the go to mop for all the time we suddenly had. Following terrible dancers, wannabe singers who made our ear drums vibrate with terror, 'Britain's Not got Talent' was finally put to sleep and we mumbled through the night, to be woken early for an appointment with the doctor, the surgeon and various nurses. A very gentle nurse came and wheeled us through the myriad of corridors. I doubt I could find my way again. Like many hospitals, it's a rabbit warren of tunnels that are best negotiated by smell. More peering into the eye. All contacts made, plans written down and discharge was confirmed. The surgeon very kindly pushed the wheelchair himself all the way back to the ward where the canula was deftly removed. She had a 'medical contact lens' a large patch and reference to Great Ormand Street and Moorfields hospitals. The joy of joys on returning to the farm, all her friends ran around her, gentle hugs and clear instructions that she had to sit in the FRONT of the van to be sure that she would not be knocked.

Follow-up has been thorough. The surgeon called Moorfields and Great Ormand Street and her mother. The surgeon thinks she should be able to see again with the use of a contact lens. We had that discussion on the ward, with me drawing lots of pictures of an eyeball to try and explain. The good news is that her brother and Mother both wear contacts.

Don't ask the question 'Why'; just be grateful we are in the 21st century, with a functioning health service accessible to all, where skilled physicians and nurses are kind and work hard. Our little girl should be able to see again thanks to everyone's help and support. She will be back, she will possibly be more careful, maybe not. Who can ever foresee a freak accident? The consequences we have yet to learn.

Don't suffer in silence this Winter

Last week, whilst out on our routine school-run, I noticed an elderly man, sat in the car outside his house, eating breakfast. It took me a moment to realise why. It was a chilly morning, but his car was parked in a sunny spot and probably felt guite cosy compared to an unheated house. This guiet act, in a mild November, spoke volumes about the crisis that is about to unfold this Winter.

These are exceptional times, and there is no shame in struggling to stay warm. A staggering 7 million UK households are estimated to now meet fuel poverty criteria (loosely defined as spending more than 10% of your income on energy). Warmth is so central to our sense of comfort and wellbeing in the Winter months. When that comfort is rationed or taken away completely, then it is only natural to feel vulnerable and exposed.

What can you do if you can't afford to heat your home?

- Create pockets of cosiness and warmth. A heated electric blanket or throw can be a great source of warmth and comfort in an otherwise chilly home. They typically cost between 1p and 3p per hour to run. If you can't afford the upfront cost (about £60 at the moment), please get in touch with SDCE on 0800 112 3044 and we will do our best to help.
- If you are struggling to pay your energy bills, our team of Home Energy Advisors offer free and impartial advice to help lower your energy usage, and can give grants of up to £200 to help you through a crisis (see www.sdce.org.uk). If you are in significant arrears we can help you to access other support.
- If your household income is under £31k and/or you receive a benefit, you can also book a free home visit through www.leap.org.uk which could include boiler repairs, draft-proofing, and replacement LED bulbs free of charge.
- Check that you have accessed all of the available government support on https:// helpforhouseholds.campaign.gov.uk/
- If you need a change of scene and are really feeling the chill, look for local 'warm banks' - many churches, cafes, community buildings etc are opening their spaces for people to come and warm up and see some other human faces.
- Heat the human, not the home. Google this phrase and you'll find an excellent guide from the MoneySavingExpert on how to stay warm cheaply.

It is going to be an uncomfortable Winter for us all, and a painful one for many.

Let us get through it with resourcefulness, kindness and community.

Dartmoor Speedwatch and VZSW Road Safety Initiative

Over the previous year the Speedwatch volunteers have been at the roadside for over 75 hours, monitoring the speeds of nearly 5000 vehicles in both 30mph and 40mph zones at various locations within the Parish. Just over 600 vehicles registered speeds in excess of the speed limit with the maximum speed recorded in a 30mph zone being 45mph, and the maximum speed in the 40mph zone being recorded at 87mph.

With the shorter days/longer nights fast approaching, drivers are reminded to reduce their speed and be aware of cattle, ponies and sheep on and near the roads across the moor. Earlier in the year funding from Vision Zero South West paid for hi-viz collars for cattle and ponies grazing along the B3121 between Dousland and Princetown, along with an additional Vehicle Activated Speed (VAS) sign. It is hoped that these measures, will help to reduce the number of road traffic accidents involving livestock over the winter months.

Do you have an hour to spare once a month? Would you like to help keep Princetown looking at its best?

Councillors along with their families and friends will be litter picking, weeding and generally have a tidy up in and around Princetown on the first Sunday of the month at 10am for an hour. The next event will take place on – Sunday 4th December (and again on the 8th January) with people initially meeting outside the Post Office. All residents are invited to join in and help keep Princetown looking clean and tidy. Children are welcome, but must be supervised by an adult.
