

The Parish Letter

All on tap

Back in 1984, I lived in a house in East London with five others. One day the property owner, who also lived in the house, stomped angrily into the kitchen where we were all gathered. The phone bill for the quarter was over £1000 and he wanted to know why and how. The culprit turned out to be my roommate, Moses, a 20-year-old Kenyan who had been in England for just two months. He had not realised that using the telephone cost money and had been phoning home frequently to stay connected with his family. He was puzzled. At home in Kenya, when his family needed water, they either walked half a day's journey to fill their containers at the well or paid a high price at the daily water cart. In London, however, he saw that water was on tap- *inside* the house- and you could have as much as you wanted for free! Moses had used the telephone like running a bath.

Well, here in the UK this autumn, with Russia attacking Ukraine and shortages of gas and oil supply, we are beginning to see that the basics of life –water, food, heat, and shelter – are no longer things we can take for granted. Harvest is a time to be grateful for the wonder of God's creation and all that we enjoy, all that we are given. It is delightful to see the varieties of fruit, vegetables and the sheaves of corn displayed in our churches -a feast for the eyes as well as the taste buds. More importantly, though, our harvest thanksgiving is for the simple necessities we enjoy – a roof over our head; a bed to sleep on; clean water; food to eat two or three times a day. We are fortunate to have these precious gifts and have been reminded in recent weeks how many are without them: those made homeless after the floods in Pakistan, refugees fleeing persecution in Syria and Iraq; migrants looking for work opportunities, the thousands in East Africa facing famine.

The statistics are grim but accurate: we live in a world where one person in every four is malnourished, where one in three does not have access to clean water and thousands of children die each month through water–borne diseases. By comparison we are rich indeed. I still remember a sermon preached at my school by the deputy principal. Michael Charlesworth reminded us that if the 600 pupils sitting that morning in chapel represented the entire world population, then all of us would be in the front row pews. Even though there was a wide diversity of wealth even within the school community, he emphasised how everyone of us was in the top 1% of the world's population for resources.

I have been thinking about that sermon these last few weeks. With all that has been filling the UK and global news recently, I wonder if we may use this Harvest-tide as a time to renew our care for those who are marginalised and vulnerable. Part of our commitment may mean speaking out on justice issues. Some in our community have been housing Ukrainian war refugees. We can also support famine relief in East Africa through Christian Aid and



Let's celebrate Harvest

There can be no doubt that celebrating a plentiful harvest this year might seem difficult, or even inappropriate. Not only the death of the Queen but, in many parts of the world food crops have not grown as expected, and in some places failed completely. The recent droughts and wildfires in the UK, Europe, Africa, America, Australia, and Asia – as well as the floods in Pakistan – coupled with the war in Ukraine which has reduced world grain supplies to a trickle, raises difficult questions as we prepare for our annual Harvest celebrations.

In Biblical times, Harvest was the time when people came together to pray for the right combination of rain and sunshine during the coming year so that the next season's harvest would be plentiful. This was what the last day of the Jewish Feast of Tabernacles was all about. It was a time when prayers were offered to God for rain in the coming months to water next year's crops. (*John 7:37*) Jesus, of course, was referring to those who were thirsty for the Holy Spirit, while the people and the religious leaders were focusing on more worldly things such as water, the most valuable worldly item for them – and as we have been learning recently, for us!

So, let's not hold back on our Harvest celebrations this year, let's thank God for both the spiritual and the worldly food that we have received, and pray in earnest that the world takes climate change even more seriously because it is clearly climate change that is causing this year's drought and poor harvest.

Smile please! It's Friday 7 October!

Friday is often said to the happiest day of the week. Traditionally it was pay day, the end of the working week. If this is true, then Friday 7 October could be the happiest day of the year because it is World Smile Day 2022, the day when we are all asked to do a small act of kindness that will put a smile on someone else's face!

And faced this autumn and winter with the worrying threat of the biggest ever cost of living crisis and the increasingly serious climate changes that are having a devastating impact on millions of lives throughout the world, there is a greater need than ever to share some happiness.

Widecombe Parish Field

As you may know, behind the public car park in Widecombe there is a beautiful field of roughly one acre which was donated to the Parish by Sir William Van Straubenzee in 1983 for the benefit of Parishioners. This year a team has come together under the auspices of the Parish Council to look into how to make better use of it than simply grazing it.

We have concluded that planting an orchard (which will be known as the Jubilee Orchard) of old varieties of Devon apple trees would be best, with a range of eating, cooking and cider varieties. We can then have various events

throughout the year such as Wassailing, a blossom party and a harvesting/pressing party in the autumn.

We are being supported by Devon Wildlife Trust under their Protecting Devon's Treescapes initiative. They are providing us with 25 trees free of charge, and a further 15 trees are being given to us by People's Trust for Endangered Species. We plan to plant the trees this autumn when water levels are right, following our launch party on Saturday 22nd October (see below).

The area will not be for use by the general public, but Parishioners will be welcome to use it by arrangement.

We would like to hear from anyone who has any strong views about what we propose, and of course if you would like to offer support or assistance with the hedge laying, tree planting and various maintenance projects which are required to make the area suitable for public use. We still need to raise some money for tree guards and stakes etc, so if you would like to become a Sponsor (£50 per tree), we would love to hear from you.



Meaning we could theoretically leave him alone with a chain saw to slice through prefelled timber (already on the ground) and a brush cutter to open up some of the fields where the earth has vanished under a thick carpet of spikey green and yellow gorse. We would not leave the poor lad alone for such tough jobs........... Not yet, at least! Having said that, we did totally abandon him to weed the cobbles outside the farmhouse. He set to work and has nearly finished, albeit a soul-destroying job on your own, hour after hour.



Scrappy has joined our team, helping overcome anxieties and learning to give and love without concern.

At least he had chance to sunbathe until last week. Which reminds me – we need three legged stools for ground work that otherwise kills the knees! Perhaps a workshop we should try to organise? Anyone know how to make three legged stools?

When we don't have groups visiting, people do tend to think that we have 'nothing to do'. No maintenance, no groundwork, no planning, fund raising, training and being sure we are compliant with the million Govt regulations that are now required for any establishment that welcomes visitors and even more specifically, children. Arthur managed to arrive just after our gzillian summer visitors had mostly left. Meaning it will be a while until he experiences our normal school groups, the programme packed with activities in every breathing second and the diverse interaction with children of so many different origins and needs.

and Arthur said, 'Who is Elizabeth?' I stopped dead in my tracks, totally shocked! Had my introduction been so very poor that the name was not seared on the very inside of his eyelids? To be fair, David was also shocked and Arthur then did stumble a little and mumble, 'Oh yes – I remember, she and another lady bought the farm.' So he was admonished with a very quick history lesson between the church gate and the gravestones the stones need tidying up again!

Our Arthur has promised a year of his life to East Shallowford Farm. So far he has thrown yellow rattle across several fields, hefted bales of freshly cut hay from Runnage Farm to

scatter it's incumbent seed over various fields to increase the variety of local flowers and grass throughout the Postbridge Marsh Fritillary area. Combining farming and conservation once again. It is a task so brilliantly outlined in James Rebank's book, English Pastoral. Although it is set in Cumbria in an area I know well from my youthful lambing days, it could just as easily be set here on Dartmoor. Stories I have heard of Richard Norrish come to mind when Rebank is talking of his grandfather. Someone who gave of themselves to the land and breathed the very soil and air on which life is so very dependent.

Of course Miss Braund and Rosemary had many volunteers over the years. Young people need to learn and long gone are the days when youth deferred to their elders for advice. I have a bad feeling I told you of the two chaps I worked with in the 1980s – Guy and Gorden. Brothers who worked a Farm between Basingstoke and

Reading and taught me how to toss a sheaf of wheat on the end of a two pronged pitch fork, stack a straw rick the size of a house and drive a tractor with a binding machine whilst sending me, as the smaller person, inside the guts of an old threshing machine to clean out (Continued on page 38)

the days dust. As one of them always said in the 1980s (pre mobile phones and internet), 'The youth always used to find the oldest most respected farmer in the parish to ask advice on how to plough a tricky field with a wet patch, or how to be sure to make the seed grow where it was boggy. Now the youth think they know everything!' Respect........... is now only a matter of turning to a technical piece of equipment for a solution? Does advice not come with experience and human wisdom, nuanced to a specific locality and event? This is why our Arthur has been collecting valuable Devils Bit Scabious seeds from different farms, labelled carefully to see if there are any differences in germination rates or other differential growth. We will be collecting oak, rowan, silver birch, hazel, blackthorn, hawthorn and perhaps even ash from trees which seem to be healthy

Our Arthur may not be brandishing a sword – but we hope that when our next group visit, he will have become our expert in gathering and germinating seeds for the next generation. Our human species has much to learn from nature...... Arthur may rise again with wisdom to protect our land!


