

December brings with it the season of Advent, the time in the Church calendar that marks a period of waiting and expectation before the birth of Jesus Christ. Although traditionally we hear the story of the Angel Gabriel's visit to Mary to tell her that she will be the mother of God's Son in December, this event is more properly celebrated nine months before Christmas on the 25th March, or Lady Day.

Mary was one of the few people in the Bible who received a message from God via an angel. The word angel comes from the Greek angelos, which simply means 'messenger', and messengers can come in many forms.

In the Bible God speaks to his people in different ways – in dreams, via the prophets and directly through aspects of nature such as fire, wind, blinding light, or complete calm. And God continues to speak to those prepared to listen out for him today.

God's messages to an individual might be delivered through a sermon, a hymn, a reading in the Bible. Sometimes it is not always through these more obvious ways. For me, when I am dealing with a problem or challenge that needs a decision, the answer will often arrive in the middle of the night. I suddenly wake up and realise I have been given a clear idea of which direction to take. On other occasions, an unexpected conversation or question from someone addresses something that I have been wondering about but not necessarily shared with that person.

Just as Mary had no doubt that God was speaking to her through the angel, I have no doubt that God speaks to me when I need guidance, reassurance, and encouragement. The messenger may not be as obvious as an angel appearing but for anyone seeking God's help, an answer will be provided.

Speaking of messages, on the 29th October a very special service was held at St. Mary's to celebrate the signing of a covenant by the Rt. Revd. Mark Rylands, the Rector of the Ashburton and Moorland Team Mission Community and Revd. Kevin Hooke the Minister for the Teignbridge Methodist Circuit. The covenant is a public declaration that our respective ministers and congregations are working together in bringing the good news of God's love to our communities.

The service was a joyful occasion and followed by a wonderful lunch provided by Maggie Arden and her team in the village hall.





Does time go more quickly for you?

Surely, it's not that time of year again? Yes, it is! Some say it's related to how long we have lived. For example, a 5-year-old feels a year is long because it makes up 20% of their life. One thing that usually indicates to our St Raphael's congregation and visitors that Christmas is upon us, is our annual candle-lit Carol Service. Note for your diary – it's on Friday 22nd December at 6pm. It does always indicate that Christmas is near!

Why not join us? The only wax that may be spilled is by the Right Reverend Mark – who insists on using the 'real thing' i.e., wax candles. Most of the rest of us will have battery tea lights!





However, Mark has a really important role to play on the night – not least of which he has to indicate to you the contactless machine – because any funds raised will go towards the next item! True Christmas spirit.

Maintenance/refurbishment/redecoration

Throughout the day we enjoyed refreshments ranging from sandwiches, cream teas, cakes and pasties.

It was a truly memorable occasion which ended with the National Anthem. Long may Leusdon Memorial Hall continue and prosper, without your support this will not happen!




High Moorland Women's Institute Princetown

Shallowford Farm It's that time of year again when long nights and constant mizzle will suck the essence of joy, dampening bones till warmth seems a distant

memory sucked by the icy whipping chill of a laughing breeze. But a brisk walk between the spontaneous showers often reveals a rainbow, a dash between the pig shed and the chickens, a fast and pacy sweeping up of muck onto the steaming pile and internal body warmth is restored.

traditional lime the walls of the ancient shippen and the pig shed which is now our office. Diligently, methodically and with much love and respect for those who built the walls before him, he carefully mixes then trowels the mortar between the granite stones which were built up how many years ago? Two hundred. three hundred, perhaps six hundred or more? The records are not clear, but respect must be given to those who laboured to produce a home and farm out of the ground on which they stood.

The last group of feisty boys from London were led for the first time by Elias. Time for new leaders to head the groups at Shallowford. Elias is a seasoned visitor, but has not taken full responsibility before. He knows his group. He knew who to sit between at the table, who would forget a jumper, who would need to be coaxed towards the animals in a gentle process. One lad, noted to be on the spectrum was particularly nervous and turned his back on our gentle soppy dog.

would not enter the pig shed and just kept stating, 'I hate poo!' We started with watering the vegetables on day one. Second day, collected eggs from the chickens. Third day, bravely entered the pig shed to help move some straw. Fourth day Elias stood next to him as he held the clip board for weighing piglets. Little by little fears can be conquered, building interest, resilience and then a sense of achievement. When this one lad went back to London and looked at the pictures on the walls of Providence House he proudly explained, puffing his chest out with a big grin, 'I did that!' pointing at a picture of another person feeding the pigs. It will take a few trips to caiole him to finally hold a broom and sweep up the muck, but what he has learned is to participate,




Extracts from the Council meeting on 24th October 2023

Princetown Food Hub – Rachel Harrison-French from 'Feeding Devon' attended the meeting and gave an informative talk on Princetown Food Hub and Feeding Devon. She explained that the Food Hub, which takes place 11.30 til 1200 noon, each Wednesday in the Methodist Chapel, Tor Royal Lane currently supports around 20 local households. The food hub is able to provide people who are finding it difficult to afford their weekly food shop with a bag of groceries for a £5 donation. Anyone is welcome to attend the sessions, whether you are in need of assistance with buying affordable food, or if you would like to help out as a volunteer. To find out more, contact: info@feedingdevon.org.uk

Donation to Citizens Advice — Council agreed to make a donation of £75 to support the work of the Torridge, North, Mid and West Devon Citizens Advice. In 2022/23 Citizens Advice worked with 62 residents from the Parish, with 160 issues and generated £24,103 income gain for local households. Council agreed that this was an increasingly important service given the cost-of-living increases over recent years

Call to improve signage to Parking and EV Charging in Princetown – this matter was raised by residents at the Sept meeting. Council agreed that signage could be improved and that this might reduce the number of people parking on residential streets. Council will contact DNPA to request improved signage to the car park and promotion of the Electric Vehicle Charging points.

New Premises Licence Application - Council considered the application from Princetown Distillers Ltd. Council were unclear why they required a licence for the sale of alcohol during the times stated, which appeared more like the opening hours of a pub. Council agreed to make a representation to object to the application on these grounds.
