The Parish Letter

One of my earliest memories is of picnicking at Bellever bridge around 1960, with my uncle, aunt and cousins from their Milton Abbot farm, and my grandparents from Bovey. With such happy childhood memories, I was very excited when Beth and I came to live on Dartmoor at the end of July in 1980 – we moved into our little granite house in New Street in Chagford when we came back from our honeymoon – I had a new job working for Fountain Forestry at Poundsgate. And we loved it!

We loved the Moor, the granite, the people, being close to my grandparents, the sense of belonging to a very special part of England. Frustratingly, after eight years my job took us to Somerset and we left Dartmoor behind. And we missed it! When our children left home, we looked at each other and said "Let's go back to Dartmoor!" I started looking, and the part-time Team Vicar post at Widecombe came up – it was perfect – we'd be back on the Moor and I could carry on running my business from "The Vicarage" (it might look a rather odd business address, but the dawn chorus from the Dipper on the rock in river has been amazing!)

When I'm asked why I'm so passionate about Dartmoor, I say "It's the people. The people who live on the Moor really want to live here. Like me, they are passionate about it. Of course it's a really tough place to earn a living – farming is tough, seasonal employment a real rollercoaster – there are no passengers on the Moor. It's the people who make it! And they are so kind and caring." The people that visitors either take for granted or ignore – little realising how the landscape, wildlife and attractions are wrought from hard labour by people they never notice.

It's been my privilege over the past twelve years to get to know you. The self-effacing, the characters, the quiet folk, the pub goers and the recluses. The dozens of people who put on Widecombe Fair, take part in Phyl's Folies and the Moorland Merrymakers, who make up the Widecombe Singers, run the halls, pubs, cafes and shops, Shallowford Farm, the School, Pre-school, our magazines, Coffee Mornings and social events, etc. (Oh, and to get to know the Green Hairstreak butterflies that have been so plentiful this year amongst the gloriously flowering hawthorn.)

And to be there in times of joy like weddings and baptisms, and sadness like illness or funerals. It's such a privilege being given a beautiful house to live in and a part-stipend to help the finances. A privilege that has allowed me to build relationships with so many, and to feel accepted as part of community life. If I have also encouraged people to be more loving of God and their neighbours, then I guess my being here has not just been for my benefit!

Sadly I'm now retiring and we are returning to Chagford. My last Sunday is 23rd July (p5). Thank you for being so welcoming. I'll miss you all.

Introducing our new curate Jenny

Have you heard of Castle Colditz, the POW camp in Germany, with all these original escape stories? You've probably watched the film and there is even a board game now called 'Escape from Colditz'. Well, this is where I come from originally – Colditz, a lovely little town in rural Saxony, in the east of Germany. It's in a similarly rural area and roughly the same size as Ashburton, just with a big impressive Renaissance Castle.

I'm Jenny, your new curate. You've probably picked up that I'm German – don't worry about trying to pronounce my surname correctly. I moved to the UK in 2017 and have fallen in love with the SW ever since. I grew up in a Christian family in the Lutheran church in East Germany, just after the Wall came down. It was an interesting experience, and that part of German history has deeply impacted my family. I'm close to my three siblings and four nieces and nephews, and travel back home frequently to visit friends and family.

After doing my A-Levels, I did a gap year in Scotland at what was then called Scottish Churches House, an ecumenical conference centre in Dunblane. That's when I had my first encounter with the Anglican church. One of my best memories from that time is spending Christmas with the

Primus of the Scottish Episcopal Church and building a massive snowman that was wearing his bishop's mitre. It was during that time that I felt drawn to study theology after returning to Germany. My theology degree took seven (!) years to finish and me to Berlin, Vancouver and Tuebingen. Yes, I have studied in the same places as Karl Barth and Dietrich Bonhoeffer, and loved every minute of it. Theology is one of my great passions, and I love teaching and preaching, delving deep into scripture and tradition. I've been to the Holy Land and recently went to Rome, and found it so inspiring and humbling to trace the steps of some of these faithful witnesses, realising afresh that we are part of a bigger story that has been going on for millennia. I've always been intrigued by the Old Testament and the history of Ancient Israel, and so it probably won't come as a surprise that I love Biblical Hebrew and worked as a Hebrew tutor at Berlin University.

I never expected God to call me to the UK or to ordained ministry – that's perhaps a story for another time – but I'm deeply grateful that he did call me to work at St Mellitus College in Plymouth for the past 6 years. As I'm writing these lines, I can still feel the sand on my toes from the surprise beach BBQ that my team threw for me today as a leaving party on my last workday. One of the core values of the college is what we call 'Generous Orthodoxy', the idea to live, worship and encounter the other as generously as possible within orthodox boundaries, and this idea is deeply ingrained in my identity. It's been my experience ever since I encountered a different form of Christianity during my time at Regent College in Vancouver that worshipping in ways that initially feel alien and uncomfortable actually takes me deeper into the mystery of God and massively enriches my spiritual life and ultimately my relationship with the Lord.

If you're familiar with the enneagram, I'm a healthy type 2 – the considerate helper. I love being with and care deeply for the people around me. I love hosting people, listening to their stories and walking alongside them. Though I get energised from being with people, I also really value my downtime and the best way for me to relax is with a jigsaw puzzle or book in winter and being out on my road bike in the summer. I've already made the acquaintance with some of the hills around here – should have bought an e-bike!

During my time in Berlin, I worked as a kids and youth pastor which has shaped my passion for working with and ministering to young people and families. My vision and hope is for a church where all age groups feel at home and worship together in lots of different ways and styles – you may call it idealistic but that's what I long to see and will put my energy into fostering.

I can't wait to get to know you all and feel so excited about starting this next chapter here in the mission community. I'm getting ordained at Exeter Cathedral on 1st July at 3pm – there'll be a live stream on the Diocese of Exeter Facebook page – and 2nd July will be my first Sunday here! I would love your prayers for this time of transition now as I prepare for ordination and for my start here with you in July.

The author of Ecclesiastes in the Bible writes:

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven."

(Some readers might remember that this was the refrain to the song 'Turn! Turn! Turn: To everything there is a season', made popular in the 1960s by an American group, The Byrds and based on a passage from Ecclesiastes.)

Ecclesiastes forms one of the 'Wisdom' books in the Bible along with Psalms, Proverbs, The Song of Songs, and the Book of Job. Although it is not often read in church, it is the source of many of the sayings still use today such as "Cast your bread upon the waters" and "every evil under the sun". It is also about life and how uncertain life can be, but whatever is thrown at us, what matters is how we respond to both the good and the challenges.

We are encouraged to enjoy the gifts that God gives us but to remember that success or wealth can all be taken from us in an instance. Similarly, pain and suffering are an inevitable part of being human, and there is nothing we can do about it.

What Christians believe is that "to those who love God, who are called according to his plan, everything that happens fits into a pattern for good". In other words, to those who love God and are doing their best to obey his commands, even though bad/sad/evil/wicked things will touch our lives, God will use them to ultimately bring about good, both in our lives and in the world.

Finally, talking of there being a season for everything, this month we are saying "goodbye" to the Reverend Geoffrey Fenton and his wife Beth. For the last twelve years Geoffrey has been a wonderful servant to the parishioners of the Ashburton and Moorland Team.

We are particularly grateful for all the Geoffrey did at Holne following Corynne's retirement, whilst also holding the fort across the wider area. As a relatively new and struggling churchwarden, Geoffrey was generous with his time for me, and his and Beth's friendship was much appreciated. On behalf of everyone at Holne, I wish them both a long, healthy, and happy retirement.







The 'unusual' Military career of George Onions

George Onions had a "varied" Army career. He was born in Bilston Staffordshire in 1883, Following work as a commercial traveller, and spending three years in Australia he joined the 3rd Hussars and was involved in the Easter Rising in 1916 in

Dublin.. Onions was commissioned into the Rifle Brigade in September 1916 but in December of the same year was found to be absent without leave, court martialled and cashiered.

He immediately re-enlisted as a private in the **Devonshire Regiment** and was serving in France by April 1917. On a foggy morning in August 1918, he was sent out with one colleague to contact the battalion on their right flank. They encountered an enemy force and were able to capture the German soldiers. Lance-Corporal Onions marched about 200 enemy prisoners in columns of four back to his commanding officer. For his actions he was awarded the Victoria Cross. His colleague was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal.

Private Onions applied to have his commission restored into the Rifle Brigade and this was granted. He left the armed forces a week later. Following the end of the War, Onions found life as a civilian difficult and in 1925 he was convicted of fraud but was dealt with leniently due to his military service.

In 1939 he took a commission as a Captain with the Royal Warwickshire Regiment but resigned in 1941.

At the age of 61 George Onions was killed in a motoring accident in 1944.



Extracts from the Council meeting on 23rd May 2023

Election of Chair and Vice Chair: Cllr Gregg Manning was elected by members present to stand as Chair for the forthcoming year with Cllr Mark Williams elected as Vice Chair.

Co-option of new Councillors: Two local residents came forward at the meeting to introduce themselves, stating why the wished to join the Council. Council then agreed to co-opt Gary Easton and Hannah Wood as Members of Council.

Planning:

<u>0195/23</u> at 1 Hessary View, PL20 6RA - Cllrs Greatrex and Williams reviewed the application, visited the site on the 18th May and submitted a report outlining concerns regarding the management of surface water. Council agreed to OBJECT to the application in light of this concern, but were in support of increasing the number of homes for local people.

<u>23/0031</u> at Chaplains House, Tavistock Road, PL20 6RE Works to trees in a Conservation area. Council expressed concerns about the felling of mature trees but understood the need to remove diseased or dangerous trees.

<u>23/0028</u> at 6, Grosvenor House, Barrack Road, PL20 6RQ Works to trees in a Conservation area. Council agreed to support the removal of the Leylandi.
