# The Parish Letter

#### We will remember them

The eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. This year Remembrance Sunday is 12th November. Thousands of people will continue to gather at cenotaphs and in churches up and down this land to remember with thanksgiving those who gave their lives in the two Great Wars to preserve freedom in Europe and the world. We will remember how an evil regime that exterminated six million Jews was defeated. We will also pray for those countries and people still involved in conflicts today.

I will be remembering my father who, as a young captain in the King's Shropshire Light Infantry, was ordered to lead his group of men across a ploughed field in northern France toward the enemy line. Unfortunately, the area was still lit up by flares, discharged to assist the RAF in bombing enemy positions prior to the infantry attack. Most of my father's group was shot down by machine gun fire. My father was 'lucky' in that he was shot and wounded, picked up by the Red Cross after the battle and then stitched up in a field hospital. My childhood memories are of his mackintosh and jacket pockets full of 'bisodol tablets', plus his difficulties with digestion. Not surprising, when half his stomach had been removed. On 12th November we will remember all those who made sacrifices to ensure a just and peaceful world and still do today.

At the beginning of this month, on Sunday 5th November, many churches hold Memorial Services around All Saints and All Souls Day to remember those who have gone before us yet who are very much alive. We will, too, in the Ashburton and Moorland Team – please check for the service times. I still keenly miss my mother who died over 11 years ago. Memory is a special gift. It connects us with people and events which are no longer present to us. Someone we love dies and we desperately want to connect with them. Every so often, I think of things I want to tell my mother and then am painfully aware that she is no longer here. Memory helps us but it can work overtime. A cloud of grief descends. Grief is not bad – good and necessary – but it can be very painful especially when the loss is so great that we are tempted to suppress it. But to forget the ones we love is to do them a great injustice. I sense that we all have a longing not just to belong but also to be remembered. To be forgotten is to be treated as if we never existed. I wonder whether what people fear is not so much death as being forgotten?

Jesus also wanted to be remembered. In his love for us he left a significant way of remembering him, namely, Holy Communion. 'Do this', he said, 'in remembrance of me'. The wonderful thing is that when we remember him in this way he becomes significantly present to us. We are the Body of Christ.

If we love someone, there is no reason why their memory should arise like a ghost to haunt us. Rather, it may be like the visit of a friend who comes to us with gifts. Memory fills our life with their presence. It can help us let go of negative feelings like anger and guilt. In their place can come a flood of memories to cherish. Memories, like good wine, improve with time. One of the ways of repaying the debt we owe the departed is not to forget.

This November we can celebrate the reality that, living and departed, we are all children of God's family. If our loved ones are close to God then they are also close to us because, by his Spirit, God is near. We will remember them.

## **Ashburton & Moorland Team Ministry - Team Vicar Appointment**

It is announced that the Reverend Ross Hathway has been appointed to the post of Team Vicar in the Ashburton & Moorland Team Ministry, to serve on a part-time basis with particular responsibility for worship and pastoral care in Widecombe in the Moor with Postbridge and Leusdon. Ross is presently Interim Minister of Holy Trinity, Kelso, in Bathurst diocese in the Anglican Church of Australia.

Ross grew up in rural Australia and before ordination was a partner in his family's cattle and arable farm in New South Wales. His wife Alison also grew up in a farming family, but on the other side of the world in North Devon. Having answered a call to ordained ministry, Ross earned his theological qualifications in Sydney and served his first curacy in Australia, before moving to England and a second curacy in Northamptonshire. He then served for ten years as Rector of Trull on the outskirts of Taunton in Somerset, before returning to parish ministry in Australia. Since retiring from full-time responsibilities, he has served as an interim priest in rural communities there.

Ross and Alison have three adult children, two of whom live in London, and an extended family network in Devon. The couple will leave the antipodean summer behind and move to Widecombe Vicarage in the new year, and subject to the completion of all legal formalities the Bishop of Plymouth will license Ross to the Ashburton & Moorland Team on Tuesday evening, February 20th at a service at St Pancras. Widecombe in the Moor at which all will be welcome.

Your prayers are asked for Ross and Alison as they prepare to move back to England in the new year, and for Ross as he prepares for the next stage in his life and work as a priest.



At the end of this month, it will be a year since St. Mary's reopened following the extensive work to repair and improve the building. Time has gone so quickly and reflecting on all that has happened in the last 12 months, there is much to be thankful for.

There have been weddings and baptisms, concerts, and a wonderful evening showcasing local talents. Sadly, there have been several funerals with the community losing people who contributed so much to the life of the village. But from my perspective, it is important that the Parish Church remains the place where villagers want to mark those major life events, surrounded by friends and family.

Our church services have included an Easter vigil and Harvest Festival as well as services of Holy Communion and Evening worship. We have already planned our Christmas services. This year the Community Carol Service on 19th December will include music from the Holne Community Choir which meets weekly in the church. Another piece of good news is that we have a regular organist once again.

Many rural Parish Churches are struggling to survive through lack of support and falling attendance at services. Sometimes the problems are financial but often it is the lack of volunteers who are willing to take on roles and responsibility for the management of the church building and the churchyards.

Inevitably, if a decision is taken to close a Parish Church, it is not the congregation who object – they will have been part of that decision-making process, but local people who will be the most vocal opponents to closure.

Thankfully, St. Mary's is not yet facing that decision, but each year fewer people are taking on more responsibilities whilst getting older.

I do believe that God will bring new people into the church – not to take on a job, but because being part of a Christian community has so much to offer. A shared desire to get to know God better; to support each other and the wider community; to share the love that God has for each one of us; to know that our sin and guilt has been taken away by Jesus' death on a cross, and to have the promise of eternal life with God.

Church is a way of life, not a building. Come and give it a try.





We had six mainstream secondary school teachers, and a further six special needs organisers, supervisors and weirdly, the one thing several of these people had in common was a penchant for cold water swimming. Mad is all I can say! The first two ladies arrived early and asked Robert, who was down from London, if he could show them a good place to dip. The sun admittedly, was out, but even so! The West Webburn is NEVER warm! The next bunch arrived in dribs and drabs, coming in various vehicles, without managing to get lost and arriving mostly in time for chili and rice, with salad from our garden! All rather nice, although the spiced blackberry and apple crumble was particularly scrumptious!

On Saturday morning the teachers and leaders flung themselves in all directions with veritable enthusiasm as Will requested them to move sheep through two gates towards the electronic sorting crate. Sheep fled in every direction, even several times backwards and forwards through the gates. Learning curve? Very fast! Will, John and I watched with amusement. We tend not to tell children or

adults how to open a gate or move an animal, at least not when it is something they can figure out harmlessly themselves. Our pig gates serve as the best puzzle. It looks like an ordinary bolt that should just pull open. People wiggle it, jiggle, pull and strain. Eventually, after considerable huffing, puffing and much indignation, they usually step back and look, only to find a little piece of metal that has to be flipped up to let the bolt slide. All good and highly entertaining for us to watch! If only everything in life was so easily solved!

It was just wonderful to watch adults, only two of whom had any farm or outdoor experience, truly engage. The pigs took nearly two hours to muck out on the first session, by the second they had it down to 20 mins. Communication and team

work amongst professionals is possible. Faith in humanity? Restored!

Then this week we were super lucky to gain the support of Dartmoor Preservation Association, who appeared with tools, coats, boots and determination! They smashed a path through chocking, vicious blackthorn (no sloes yet unfortunately) thrashing through thick brambles with barbs that were definitely developed to avoid something, possibly elephants (straight-tusked elephants) about 125,000 years ago, or perhaps mere cows and ponies in the last 12,000 years!

Either way, paths were made for the cows who will be let lose sometime next year to carefully chew the thick grass, leaving the Devil's Bit Scabious exposed for the butterflies to lay their eggs and the caterpillars to cheerfully munch! If anyone would like some DBS plugs for planting – please let us know!




# Looking back: Whiddon Autumn Festival 2023



#### **Dartmoor Forest Parish Council**

#### **Extracts from the Council meeting on 26th September 2023**

Promotion of the Parish – Council agreed to contact Duke and Duchess of Cornwall to request a visit to Princetown as it has been a while since the last official royal visit.

Effect of Bank Closures in Tavistock – Council expressed concerns over recent bank closures in Tavistock making it difficult for residents who don't use internet or telephone banking. It was noted that there are plans to create a banking hub in Ashburton, and potentially one in Tavistock also. Council agreed it was necessary to write to the main banks which used to have branches in Tavistock to encourage them to create a local hub, so that residents can continue to have contact with bank staff

**Planning:** Council considered the following applications:

<u>0379/12</u> - Forest Inn Hexworthy - Council agreed to recommend Approval.

0409/23 7 Plymouth Hill, Princetown - Council agreed to recommend Approval.

<u>0413/23</u> Yellowmead Farm – Council agreed to support this application in principle but wanted to have sight of more detailed plans before responding. Subsequent to the meeting DNPA made the detailed plans available and Council responded to recommend Approval.

<u>0420/23</u> HMP Dartmoor - Council agreed that it neither supported nor objected to this application given the application relates to necessary Radon work within the perimeter of the Prison.

Proposed Stock Reduction on Dartmoor- Council sent a response to the 'Independent Evidence Review of Protected Site Management on Dartmoor' regarding Natural England's proposal to reduce stock levels on Dartmoor. The letter expressed Council's concerns that if the reduction were to go ahead it could have significant negative implications for farmers, commoners and many others who live, work, or run businesses on Dartmoor, and for those who visit Dartmoor to see the livestock.

**Princetown Churchyard Maintenance Group** – The Council agreed for the Parish Lengthsman to cut the grass at cost, in support of the group, who have been working hard over the summer to get the Churchyard looking at its best once more.

'Tidy Princetown' sessions- these take place monthly on the first Sunday morning, to help keep Princetown looking at its best. Litter is picked, weeds are pulled, plants are planted - by a small group of Parish Councillors and local Volunteers. It would be great if more residents were able to join in, to cover a larger area each month. Anyone can help out (Children must be accompanied by an adult), and its' just for an hour.
