The Parish Letter

Cherishing seasons

As we approach harvest, we can sense the change of season all around us. As I'm writing this letter I sit in my shorts in the glorious late summer sunshine while the supermarkets get ready to put their Christmas selection out - not long before we can buy mince pies and gingerbread. It's this in-between time as we're moving from summer to autumn, with all the emotions that come with that. For some of us, that's a glorious time with all the leaves changing colour, with jam making, pumpkin spiced lattes and getting cosy with a good book, candles and blankets. For others it's the opposite, as the days get colder and shorter, a melancholy settles in and some of us can't wait for the first spring sunshine to reappear.

The peculiar thing about seasons is that we can't change the season we're in (ok apart from moving abroad) but then the seasons change, and we can't change that either. And that's true both for our meteorological seasons of summer and autumn and for our seasons of life. You can wish that it was still August now but it is October, as much as you can wish that your children were still little but they are in secondary school now.

We can't change the way the seasons work out in our land and in our lives but we can look for the blessings each season brings, and we can learn about patience. The harvest festivals we're celebrating this month across the benefice are only possible because we've patiently waited for and watched the journey from seed to crop, from bulb to flower. I love these lyrics of one of my favourite worship songs called Seasons:

If all I know of harvest
Is that it's worth my patience
Then if You're not done working
God I'm not done waiting

I'm in a season of life that I would not have chosen for myself at this time of my life - I'm single, and hoping and praying that I may have a family one day (if you know of any eligible bachelors, do send them my way ...) I can't change that season as much as I desperately wish some days but I can use this time wisely and to the full. I can enjoy and cherish the blessings that this particular season brings to my life, like spontaneous trips away or perhaps having the freedom to host a bunch of young people in my house, and honour God in that way. I rest in the knowledge that 'there is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the sun', as we read in Ecclesiastes 3.

Our creator God is a God of seasons, who cares about the harvest of our lands and fields as much as he cares about harvest season in our lives, whatever that may look like for you, and who works to His unique timing. We can trust in that. Whether you're in a season you love and don't want to end, or you're patiently waiting for the seasons to change, there is an internal beauty to that season in your life - look for it!

He has made everything beautiful in its time. Ecclesiastes 3:11

On the 8th October we will be holding our Harvest Festival Service at Holne serving tea and cake from 4.30pm prior to the service at 5pm. All gifts of produce, dried and tinned goods will be gratefully received and donated to good causes including the Ashburton Food Bank. The Harvest collection will be sent to the Farming Community Network which does such good work in supporting farmers across the country.

Apart from being the month where we celebrate harvest, my birthday is in October and the 10th October is World Porridge Day. I am rather fond of porridge and usually make it with water, no sugar or salt but topped with some fruit. Of course, the proper place to eat porridge is in Scotland. I have eaten wonderful porridge there, sometimes served with cream and a tot of whisky on top!

Farmers in Scotland used to pour leftover porridge into a 'porridge drawer' at breakfast and leave it to dry out. Then it would be cut into slices and taken to eat as an on-the-go lunchtime snack. A far cry from my luxury breakfast but good, simple, nourishing food grown locally and not wasted.

First held in 2009, World Porridge Day is an international event to raise funds for the Mary's Meals Charity. Based in Argyll, Mary's Meals raises money to feed starving children at their places of education across the developing world. Every school day they feed 2.4 million children in some of the world's poorest countries.

What hits me is not the extent of the work that Mary's Meals does, but that today there are 2.4 million children who are attending school but are starving. In addition to those children, there are millions more who are not in education because their families are too poor to buy food, let alone pay to educate their children. Neither is food poverty unknown in our country, in this county, in Ashburton itself

Jesus told his followers that whoever gives food to the hungry, drink to the thirsty, welcomes the stranger, clothes the naked or visits the disadvantaged, is doing it as if they were doing it for him. Being generous to those in need is reflecting God's love to all around us.

Please join our celebration of harvest and all the good gifts God has given us. Help us to share those gifts with others who need our help and generosity wherever they are.

Visitors to Pilgrims: mistakes are good for you!

One of the first things I learnt both in a Press Office and as author of our Visitors to Pilgrims Church brochures, is not to dwell on mistakes. No matter how much checking and editing you do mistakes will always be made. Perhaps the important thing is to learn to recognise the mistakes that we all make, own up to them and try to put in place some way of not making the same mistakes again. Best not to spend time worrying about them because while you are worrying your mind will be distracted from the task in hand and you will end of up making even more mistakes.

(Experience suggests highlighting a mistake in a Visitors to Pilgrims brochure just draws more attention to it, and there is a good chance that readers did not notice it in the first place!)

Harvest at Huccaby 3pm Sunday 15th October

Harvest Festivals have a long tradition. It is time when we thank God for the, hopefully, plentiful supply of food -and was traditionally held at the end of the harvest season when the country was much more reliant on home-grown food. The festival, as we know it today, is attributed to Rev. Robert Hawker who, in 1843, invited parishioners to a special thanksgiving service in Morwenstow, Cornwall. As well as thanking God, gifts of produce and flowers were brought to church to be shared among the less fortunate in the parish.

Harvest celebrations actually date from about 3,500 years ago in Old Testament days when God gave Moses' instructions for seven annual feasts (Leviticus 23) which included three harvests: First Fruits in spring for the barley harvest; Weeks in early summer for the wheat harvest; and Tabernacles, or the ingathering, in the autumn when thanks was given for all the year's crops and prayers offered for the coming year.

In Rev. Hawker's days most of the UK population relied totally on growing their food, and a good harvest was vital for their wellbeing throughout the coming year. Today, few people in the UK rely on home grown food so the underlying nature of Harvest Festival has changed significantly. While some people still take home-grown food to church for their local Harvest Festival, it is becoming more common for gifts of dried and tinned food which can be distributed via foodbanks, or through donations to charitable causes, such as the Christian Aid Harvest Appeal.



News from the East Shallowford Trust

As we took 'the Farm' to London in June, so it was the turn of 'London' to descend on the Farm! Luckily, not the entire population of 9,648,000, but 56 people, including babies and retirees. Many had been before. Many had not been since their youth. Some were coming for the first time.

But weren't we lucky!! We have not dared to organise a Providence House camping holiday since the horrendous storm Erik on 8th August 2019. Our core team had been off visiting Jamie's Farm near Bath. We were listening for the weather forecasts hunched over phones like World War II radio operators, trying to gather essential and scary information. It was scary! The Met Office predicted winds of 60mph. The tents were up and we were not there to take them down.

Emergency phone calls were made. Kate, our volunteer Hannah and the Plumley's came to the rescue (yet again). As rain lashed wee legs, the wind whipped the tents from hands threatening to hoik and toss anyone holding a sheet into the air like a rag doll. Simon dashed around with lunatic speed, hauling, pulling, soaking wet, sliding on the grass as the rain made an ice rink, to yank the tents into the leaking old barn where they were strung up to drip safely for several weeks before

being dry. Four years on, having not used the tents since they had been diligently packed away, the Mosely family dared to try and unravel the muddle!

Well, Arthur, Serena and I had at least one attempt to sort out the tents on a dry warm Friday afternoon. We knew we had tent poles for at least four of the tents. One looked as if it was



from the 1960s. It did not withstand rain on a Friday evening!

Tents in the sunshine

Shallowford Farm

It took the Mosely's, whose father works at the Met Office with precise mathematical skills, nearly the entire day to sort out the muddle of poles, fly sheets, liners, snagging zips and pegs. We knew we needed at least eight tents for 24 people. Providence came to Providence House in the form of a magical donation of six two man tents, a whole load of sleeping bags and mats just the week before the event. Don't ever question divine intervention! This enabled a few of the younger people to sleep in tents only snoring distance from their parents. Freedom at last. The sheep had been put into the field a week or so before the event for natural mowing, with an actual motorised lawn mower run up to the door of every tent between rain splats on the Sunday before the group arrived.

On Monday morning, the heavens opened as if the flood gates of Niagara Falls had been pent up for a year. Around 12.00 the sun peaked out grinning from behind a cloud and we ventured out from our shelter in the office, daring to see if any tent had survived the deluge. They had! The insides were dry! The sun beamed out to suck up any drops that had not soaked into the growan soil





The soldier who gave the world Winnie-thePooh



Harry Colebourn was born in England in 1887 but emigrated to Canada in 1905 at the age of 18. When war broke out in 1914, Colebourn was a veterinary surgeon and immediately joined the Canadian Army Veterinary Corp as a Lieutenant. While on a journey from his home in Winnipeg to a posting overseas he bought a bear cub for \$20.00 whom he named "Winnie". When he was shipped to England Harry was allowed to take Winnie with him. Colbourn and Winnie were assigned to the Second Infantry Brigade stationed on Salisbury Plain." Winnie became a sort of mascot and a diversion for many soldiers during the autumn of 1914.

When the brigade was sent to France Winnie was not allowed to go and was sent to London Zoo for safe keeping.

"Winnie" became a very firm favourite with Londoners including a little boy Christopher Robin Milne, whose father was writer A.A. Milne. Milne had kept notes of how his son interacted with "Winnie" and in 1926 wrote an account of a small boy and several animals and thus the children's favourite "Winnie-the-Pooh" was created.

It had been Colbourn's intention to claim "Winnie" back at the end of the war and return to Canada with her, but upon his regular visits during his 'war leave' he noted how much of an" institution" Winnie had become.



Again, this year on the 18th & 19th of August we were involved with running the car parking arrangements at the RAF Harrowbeer 1940s event.





Extracts from the Council meeting on 22nd August 2023

Princetown Welcomed Sir Geoffrey Cox M.P - Drop-in Session 25 August

A number of Councillors attended and spoke to Sir Geoffrey about issues of concern. These included the potential closure of Princetown Visitor Centre, Natural England plans to reduce grazing stock on the commons, banks closing in Tavistock, lack of affordable housing for young local people, lack of public transport at key times during the day, and dilapidated buildings.

Additional Dog Waste Bins – Council agreed that an additional dog waste bin would ideally be situated near St Michaels Churchyard to cover the top end of the village, as there has been a significant increase in dog waste being

left there. Clerk to liaise with WDBC regarding the siting of the bin, to ensure it is accessible to empty, and to purchase additional green metal bin.



Allotments Princetown – A small number of residents have contacted Council with regard to allotments. Clerk briefed Council on the process for considering a request for the provision of Allotments. Council agreed to support the residents and encourage them to set up their own management committee to run allotments as a community scheme.

Cllr Geen was able, having spoken to local residents, to confirm that to the best of her knowledge the premises concerned had been lived in for the past four years. Council agreed to write to DNPA to confirm this.

New Premises License - <u>Plume of Feathers, Plymouth Road Princetown</u> – Council considered the application and agreed that it was beneficial for the village and as there were no objections raised, no response to WDBC was necessary.
