The Parish Letter

Greetings! I'm Ross Hathway the new Church Vicar for Widecombe, Leusdon and Postbridge Parishes. Firstly, a big thank you to all who have welcomed us so warmly and helped with setting up the Vicarage.

I was born and raised in the outback of New South Wales on a family farm. Life revolved around horses and Kelpie dogs to herd sheep and cattle. Crops included wheat, barley, grain sorghum and irrigated lucerne. (I like to say I



have a Ph.D in tractor driving). I attended a Primary School with never more that 25 pupils. Kangaroos jumped through the school grounds and finding cricket balls was perilous because of large poisonous snakes in the grass.

Later on, weekends were spent on motor bikes and constructing buggies in the workshop. We attended a church but the real fun was playing Rugby League. After an unhappy stint at University I started to read the Bible seriously for the first time. This culminated in my attendance at Christian Youth convention where to my astonishment I realized that the truth of the Christian Gospel had been 'under my nose' and I hadn't realized it. My previous reading was around Buddhism, some philosophy and the writings that were emanating from the counterculture of the American West Coast.

In 1980 I booked myself to travel to Nebraska (not the most exciting State in the U.S) to look at the new `No till` farming practises. I decided to travel firstly via the UK after I found a nearby farming pal was intending to be there at the same time. The highlight of this trip did not turn out to be Nebraska but the meeting of my now wife Alison on a church picnic day near London. Alison grew up on a farm in North Devon.

Upon returning to Australia, I found I had a desire to study the Bible and deepen my new world view without necessarily leaving farming. Alison and I decided to be married and together we came to a growing conviction that ordained Anglican ministry was our future.

After an initial two years curacy/assistant ministry in country NSW we moved to the U.K town of Corby in Northamptonshire which we enjoyed enormously. Then in 1992 for my first Parish in charge as Rector we settled in a village called Trull on the southern outskirts of Taunton in Somerset. We spent ten very happy years there and our three children thrived in school and community.

At the end of 2002 we moved back to Australia and I retired from full time parish ministry in 2019. Since then, Alison and I have been serving part time in locums, mostly rural Parishes in Western NSW. My normal working days here will be Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

I'm looking forward to meeting folk and especially visiting farms. My knowledge of sheep is mainly about Merinos. If anyone wants a tractor driver for a day let me know!

I like rugby (both codes) woodturning and carving, doing up motorbikes and old Ford Trucks.

Most of all I love the Christian Gospel. There is no better news!



"April brings the primrose sweet, scatters daisies at our feet"

Well, that verse from a poem I learnt as a child, may have been true then, but for the last few years primroses have been blooming in our garden since January! In fact, it is very hard these days to categorise any month by its weather or which flowers will be blooming. Or if you just want to turn up on the day, that's fine.

On the subject of flowers, Jesus told his disciples that they should never worry about anything because God will always provide for our needs.

"And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. Something affecting all our Benefice for this month – and the future. Fraud is the crime most likely to affect British adults – and anyone can fall victim to it. In fact, it now accounts for 41% of all crime. The government has just introduced a national Stop! Think Fraud campaign packed with useful tips to keep you safe. The most important information is:

- 1. **Use a strong password for your email:** Your emails contain a lot of information about you that criminals can use to scam you or people you know. It's crucial you use a strong password for your email account that you don't use for anything else. Avoid words that can be guessed, like your pet's name or birth month. Adding numbers and symbols is a good way to make passwords even harder to guess.
- 2. **Use 2-step verification where possible, to protect your email account**: 2-step verification (sometimes called 2SV) helps to keep criminals out of your important accounts. It works by sending a code or PIN to a device only you have access to, such as your phone. You'll usually only be asked to do this when you sign in using a new device or change settings, such as your password. So, if you're asked if you'd like to set up 2-step verification, please always do so you'll be making life twice as hard for criminals!
- 3. **Use your browser's password manager**: If your web browser offers to save your password when you're logging in or creating an account, always do this. These 'password managers' will help you create and store strong, different passwords for all your different accounts. They're easy to use, hard to crack and will save you from having to memorise your passwords.
- 4. **Know the warning signs:** If something seems suspicious or unexpected, such as requests for money or information, contact the organisation or person directly to check. Use contact details from official websites not those given in the message.
- 5. **Report suspicious or 'phishing' emails:** If you click a link, it could enable the fraudster to download a virus onto your computer. Or it could send you to a cloned website where criminals can steal bank details or other personal information. By reporting phishing emails, you can help to stop criminal activity and prevent other people from falling victim. So, before you delete suspicious emails, forward them to: report@phishing.gov.uk
- 6. **Report spam texts or calls**: Criminals sometimes send texts asking you to click a link so that they can attempt to steal your money or personal information. They might also call and try to trick you over the phone. Reporting scam texts and calls will help your provider find out where the calls or texts came from and can help get the senders blocked or banned. To report a scam text, forward it to 7726 and then send the sender's number when prompted. To report a scam call, simply text 7726 with the word 'Call' followed by the scam caller's number.



If you've been a victim of fraud, take action immediately: It's easy to report fraud or cyber-crime – and it's important you do. Contact Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040. Reporting fraud means it will be passed to the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau to investigate and help to prevent other people falling victim.

Please keep this message handy for yourself; and pass on to neighbours and friends.







Dartmoor welcomes dogs on leads now spring is here

Dog owners are being asked to use a lead when out walking their dog on the moor.

From now until 31 July, the National Park is encouraging people to use leads to protect ground nesting birds and livestock.

Dartmoor National Park Authority wants everyone to enjoy Dartmoor if they have a dog or not. With the arrival of spring, birds such as the meadow pipit and skylark are building nests on the ground to incubate eggs while lambs, foals and calves are on the open moor.

But a dog trampling through undergrowth can frighten adult birds from their well-hidden nests. Even the best-behaved dog can cause distress to grazing livestock and their young – it doesn't even need to be chasing them.

The National Park Authority is asking residents and visitors to follow some simple rules and to please keep dogs on a lead:

- During the livestock breeding and ground nesting bird season 1 March – 31 July
- At all times anywhere near livestock
- During warmer weather when adders are likely to be basking in patches of sunshine.
- Follow official signs or notices locally. At certain times, dogs may not be allowed on some areas of access land or may need to be kept on a lead.
- Clear up dog poo and take used dog waste bags away

On areas of Access Land designated under the Countryside & Rights of Way Act 2000, dogs must be on a short, fixed lead of no more than 2 metres between 1 March and 31 July.

Gone out without dog poo bags? The visitor centres at Haytor, Postbridge and Princetown sell poo bags and special odour-proof and leakproof containers for clean and used bags.

What to do if you see a dog worrying livestock

Livestock worrying - when a dog chases, attacks or causes distress to livestock - is still a serious concern, particularly for farmers. Dartmoor Rangers will be encouraging people to report livestock worrying to police on 101 or Dartmoor Livestock Protection Society on 07873 587561 giving as much information as possible.



Harry Price 1877 - 1965

Many of you will know the automation of Tom Cobey's horse and riders on display for 364 days every year in St Pancras Church. But the story of its creator Harry Price is less well known.

Harry was born in Birmingham in in 1877, as he grew up he came to dislike Birmingham and at the first opportunity in 1893 he enlisted in the Royal Navy as a "boy entrant". Being stationed in Devonport for his training Harry soon came to enjoy the freedom of walking on Dartmoor. This led to the lifelong passion he developed for life in the countryside.

During his 12-year service

in the Royal Navy Harry travelled to many countries where he was able to gain experience of different cultures in other parts of the world. The highlight of his first term in the Royal Navy was his service on HMS Ophir. In 1901 with the ship serving as the Royal Yacht they were carrying the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York on a voyage around the British Empire. Harry left the Royal Navy in 1907 having served the twelve years he signed on for and returned to Drewsteigton.



In 1914 with the outbreak of the First World War Harry rejoined the Royal Navy. In 1915 he was serving upon HMS Ocean during the naval action off the coast of the Dardanelles. Unfortunately, on 18th March, Ocean struck a mine and sank, Harry survived this sinking after spending 14 hours floating in the sea. Having transferred to service on HMS Majestic, still in the Dardanelles campaign, on 26th May 'Majestic' was torpedoed by an Italian U boat and sank. Harry survived and transferred to HMS Liverpool remaining on her until his demobilisation in February 1917.

Following his demobilisation Harry returned to Drewsteignton, took up employment in the building trade and enjoyed time pursuing his hobbies. He was a keen fisherman and spent many hours fishing from the banks of the Teign river. He learned the skill of model making in his late sixties and produced the Tom Cobley automaton pictured above. His greatest joy however was his drawing and painting, it is reported he was sketching on his death bed in 1965.

The moor walk included Scrappy and Girlie, who I adored; and 'I loved the ponies and learned a lot about Dartmoor.' The pigs of course are challenging for their noise and the stink. Still, children prefer the pungent whiff of pig poo to silage. Must be something to do with age!! All of us adults love the smell of fermented, slightly alcoholic grass! Can't imagine why??

However, it was again interesting to note. Not one of the children sat regularly at tables to eat meals. For many, using a knife and fork was a first. Yet, not one of these eight to nine year olds asked for their phones or biscuits! Many had never spread jam on their toast, many had never had vegetables. Making their own pizzas was 'really good', was 'super fun. I loved it', 'it was amazing' 'really yummy' and definitely eating carrots was a success! There is hope!!

Sadly, March can be truly cold and the responses to the two Conservation sessions, headed up by Stacey who also provides Forest School at Widecombe, were surprisingly positive given the shivering damp wind. The second session had to be cut short it was so soggy along the river.

His patience and gentle boundary setting was essential as the week progressed and the thought of losing him when the bus arrived ended in tearful goodbyes. Antony became known as 'Mr Cuddle Man' as he gently ushered with wide arms those slower walkers or those dawdling on a





Tuesday 23 April at 2.30 pm "Beatrice Chase, My Lady of the Moor" Talk by Simon Dell Ashburton Town Hall

The year 2024 marks the 150th anniversary of the birth of Olive Katherine Parr or more commonly called Beatrice Chase and this talk explores the life and works of this complicated yet interesting character who spent most of her life living at Venton near Widecombe. This talk will explore who she was, her works of literature and the aura that she created which perhaps disguised her real self. This year also marks the 110th anniversary of the publication of her first Dartmoor Novel "The Heart of the Moor".



Few people in 2024 might have read her books – written in the language of her day between the war



years in the early part of the twentieth century. Accused of being 'over-flowery' and too lush and romantic she courted fame and notoriety in her day. Indeed, had she died at the height of her popularity her passing would have been mourned nationally; but at the time of her death in 1955, just a few days before her 81st birthday, she has become an embittered and tragic figure.
