Dear friends,

As I write these few words, I am looking forward to being away next week, for a well-earned break (well I am calling well-earned anyway!). Kay and I are heading off to Norfolk to stay in an Airbnb owned by a cousin I discovered a few years ago when doing my family tree. My roots are very much in Norfolk, as both my mother's and father's side go back several generations in the county, at least to the late 1700's. Although we moved away when I was a toddler, I have many childhood memories of visiting my grandmother in North Walsham and my uncle in Cromer, of steam train rides at Sheringham, and of football at Norwich – if you are a Norfolkman, you don't choose to support the Canaries, it's woven into the very fabric of your being! So I am looking forward to being in a landscape which was home to my ancestors, spending time with family and of touching some personal memories. Roots are important to us, they are a part of who we are and have helped to shape us.

Of course, having lived in Devon for a quarter of a century now, and being married to an Exonian, I also have roots here – ties of friendships, family and belonging – and these are just as important too. Although not a native West Country species, I think I have transplanted well!

The New Testament speaks of the importance of roots too – Colossians talks of being rooted in Christ so that we may grow in faith and thankfulness (chapter 2, verse 7), and in Ephesians Paul prays that his readers may be 'rooted and established in love' (3:17). Jesus, in the parable of the sower, talks about the plant withering because of its lack of root. And then, back in the Old Testament lies the image of God people being a vineyard planted by him with the expectation of fruitfulness. I am pleased to affirm that I am rooted in my faith, having invited God's love in Christ to take root in me and finding myself rooted in him, and that this has shaped my life and become a defining part of who I am, just as are my other roots in place and time and genetic inheritance. It has given me a stability and hope, and has fed and nurtured me, like nothing else. I can only commend the same for you. And I also believe that God has planted me in Devon that I, in my own way, may be fruitful, here where I am – maybe that it true for all of us.

Unfortunately, I have no idea where it came from or who should have the credit for its composition, but I thought it was worth sharing.

Parody on 1Corinthians 13.

Though our stirring speeches speed round the world on our radio and TV, and we have not love - we are like blaring brass and crashing machinery.

Though our jet engines roar ever faster over continents and oceans, though we plumb the depths of the sea and tread the face of the moon or Mars, though we perform heart transplants and discover new miracle drugs, though we solve all problems and mysteries so that even our computers break down with the weight of our answers, though we do all these things and have not love – we are nothing.

*If the hungry of the world still starve,
if the naked are not clothed,
if the sick go unattended,
if the old are forgotten and the children die,
it is all in vain.*

Without love, all our knowledge and technology and power have no worth and turn to a curse.

Ending where it does, this parody gives a very a bleak assessment of life. Whilst it does imply ways in which love for our neighbour can be demonstrated, St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians describes exactly what love is and the power it contains.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth.

It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never ends.

This is the gift that God gives us. If we shared that gift without exception, what a difference we could make!

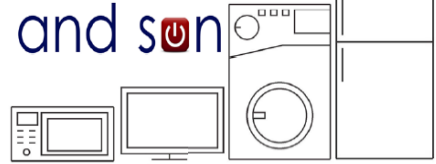

Why Whit Sunday in May?

Within the Anglican and Methodist churches the word Whitsun, or Whit Sunday is sometimes used instead of Pentecost. It falls on the seventh Sunday or 50 days after Easter and commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Christ's disciples. The word pentekoste means fiftieth in Greek. Best to learn something new every day!

It used to be a tradition in some churches to baptise adults at Pentecost and the newly baptised people would wear white robes on that day, so Pentecost came to be called “Whitsunday” or “White Sunday” after these white baptismal garments.

Whit Monday, the day after Whitsun, remained a holiday in Britain until 1971, then starting in 1972, the Government decided to permanently replace it after a five-year trial, with a holiday called the Spring Bank Holiday on the last Monday in May.

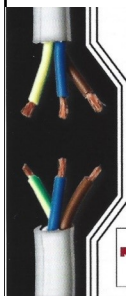

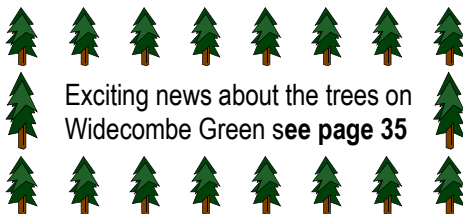

News from the East Shallowford Trust

Something wonderful and unusual happened this month. We received our first residential group of young adults with severe learning difficulties. They were brilliant! We had so much fun, the giggles were hilarious and what the group discovered they could achieve?? Well, read on!

At least three people wore noise cancelling headphones in order to avoid sensory overload. One girl we were told had an eating disorder. Another would not be able to tolerate anything on his hands. Another could not walk on uneven ground. So the challenge began. They stayed for only two nights, funded through a special grant we had received for 'disadvantaged young people from the age of 11-18 years.' However, we were given only three months to find groups, schedule and deliver the activities. It's a difficult, quick turn-around, not for us, but for the group leaders trying to secure individuals and parental 'buy-in'. We had several groups who intended to bring ten individuals. In the end, several groups brought only two thirds of their intended number. The opportunities are wasted but this is society at the moment. However, we soldier on, working with those daring to take on the fun!



Proper puddle splashing!! Sheer delight!

On day one of our special needs group, we had a quick introduction to the farm, going through animal noises, the names for males, females and the young of different animals before making beds. Learning how to put on a pillow case and duvet is a crucial element of the introduction, so the visitors know where they are going to sleep and learn how to make their beds. For many, this is a first! We then tog up in green protective clothing before head off to muck out and feed animals. Some entered the animal yard but would not go beyond the sliding doors into the shed. The pigs had started yelling for their food. We grinned, cajoled and smiled, but almost half the group switched to chicken duties well, least to say, pigs are loud!

However, as dinner was served, several of the non-verbal youth started making pig noises. We laughed as the mimicking was hilariously accurate – we all knew what they were saying. By the next morning, three more had found the courage to enter the pig shed to help feed and sweep out the muck. On the third day, *everyone* joined in. The group leaders were astounded..... headphones helped, but the team work and enthusiasm was fantastic. Fear can be conquered!!

Poosticks on the West Webburn, splodging through the mud. We walked slowly and carefully through the Ball, but could not find the ponies. Groans as we climbed the hill, lungs heaving, legs like lead, but everyone made it. Carefully we walked down the road, which was in truth a flooding river to Barn Park, our steepest hill above the farm. The lad who would not tolerate dirt on his hands decided he would be brave, lay on the ground, he tucked in his arms and started to roll. He made the fastest roll down Barn Park I have ever seen, poking out one arm to slow himself as he pelted down, over mole hills, gathering speedy momentum, bouncing, tumbling and spinning. I had to run to keep up with him, leaping around others as he pelted down the hill finally stopping just in front of the gate. He lay gently with a grin on his face, sat up quietly to explain, 'I need my head to stop spinning' as the others ran to congratulate him. He very carefully and somewhat wobbly stood up. Whoops of delight from the others..... 'Yippeee – this is fun!' grinned another lad, dancing on the spot with delight. The following group was a primary school from Torquay. We asked if the group would be happy to help us weed, as the veggie patch is definitely in need.

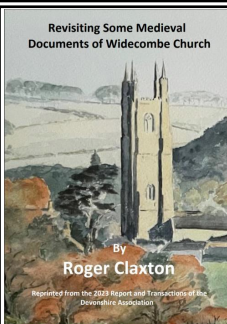

Despite all Serena's attempts to keep up with nature's determination to sprout new life – it's not always easy! Nature invariably wins!

We ended up the largest collection of wiggly worms we have ever gathered from our raised beds.

We carefully lifted out the sodden clumps of fresh green grass from the heaving rich chippings which over the last two years have broken down into soil and a mass of truly soggy earth. Hunched over the clumps we poked the dark rich soil. One young girl grinned, asking 'what's this?' looking at the lump one third of the way down the wriggling beastie worm. 'It's the saddle' I said, otherwise known as the Clitellum. I had to look it up later – it's the section of the earthworm where the eggs are produced. A quick read of some useful online information also revealed that earthworms are hermaphrodites, meaning a worm has both male and female reproductive organs. Try and explain that one to a bunch of young people without hilarious bouts of disbelief and giggles that set them off, dropping all the deftly collected clumps of soil.

We certainly cleared a huge area of chippings. I'm guessing the grass will re-grow and, re-grow and re-grow as the earthworms are so prolific. We found so many that one lad quietly whispered in my ear, 'Can we feed them to the chickens please?' I looked up at Antony who was working with another group feeding the chickens and collecting eggs, 'May we join your group please? Earthworm food?'

Antony nodded, as my group had collected at least three handfuls of wiggling worms, examining them carefully to gauge the differences. Some were definitely not worms, but probably cutworms from moths, millipedes and an array of maggots that are just healthy. We put half back in the soil and with glee for the chickens, the group opened the chicken pen and in we went.

The chickens were delighted! Chasing, grabbing, running off with their delicacy to enjoy before another chicken stole it from their beak. When challenged with our three pillars, 'Try Something New, Keep Everyone Safe and Respect All Things', the 'Respect All things' means feeding chickens, not protecting the worms, which everyone agreed, were so prolific a few could sacrifice their lives for the sake of hungry chickens. So the life cycle is explained and understood as we discuss around the dinner table and a sense of 'right' and 'wrong' is debated, no matter what the age. It's not always easy, but it's a start and the value of nature on which humans depend becomes obvious. No worms, no soil, no food. Simple really although some bright spark pointed out that the US Govt authorised Bill Gate's company to produce synthetic beef. Now that is a debate! Not sure what to think, but for the moment, the trees still need hugging as they are alive and definitely contribute more to the planet than they take. 'Are trees better than humans?' one little lad quizzically challenged me with a seriously furrowed brow. 'Hmm?' I thought, 'possibly depends on the human? We all have choices.' 'I want to be a tree,' he ran off whopping and flapping his arms, 'A huge oak tree that sucks up all the sky!' And what can you say to that!

Widcombe Parish Council news

We are grateful to the Farming in Protected Landscapes programme (FiPL) for providing grant funding for both the new trees and the layby improvement works (as you approach the village from Widcombe Hill) which will benefit both residents and visitors alike.

While we were in the process of organising the new trees we were approached by the Lord-Lieutenant of Devon David Fursdon who was looking to plant a tree to mark the coronation of King Charles III. The PC was delighted to offer one of these spots for this commemorative tree for Devon.

Mr Fursdon attended a tree planting ceremony with members of the PC where a Horse Chestnut tree was duly planted. A commemorative plaque was provided by Mr Fursdon along with a cheque for £200 to fund the purchase and care of the tree.

The grant funding also helped with the cost of grinding out the stump of the Horse Chestnut by the café on the green which allowed the seat to be relocated to the new lime tree which has been planted at this end of the green.

Both trees have been guarded in order to protect them from grazing animals and will remain in place until they are no longer needed.

The grant funding has also helped to improve a layby area on the main approach to the village which had become all but unusable due to the build up of mud and standing water. The banks have been reformed with drainage pipes added, the layby surface scraped back and scalplings put down. To finish it off a wildflower mix has been scattered which will not only brighten things up but will also provide a boost for insects.
